Let the world know of 1971 genocide

Speakers tell event

It is important to effectively communicate the severity of the genocide carried out by the Pakistani occupation army on Bangalees during the 1971 Liberation War to the global community, said national and international researchers at an event yesterday.

While participating in an international seminar on genocide, they said excluding genocide from the narrative would render it impossible to fully comprehend the sacrifices made by the nation's freedom-loving people during the nine-month struggle for independence.

"The 1971: Genocide-Torture Archive and Museum" organised the international seminar titled "Remembering genocide and Liberation War 1971: in the quest of diversity".

Speaking at the event, State Minister for Cultural Affairs KM Khalid said the Pakistani forces perpetrated one of the worst genocides in 1971. He expressed disappointment that some individuals continue to dispute the number of martyrs, highlighting the unique responsibility

Abdus Sattar was an elected lawmaker from Brahmanbaria and Cumilla as a BNP candidate five times, including the 11th parliamentary election held in 2018.

He resigned from BNP on December 11, 2022. He again won Brahmanbaria-2 by-polls as an independent candidate this year.

Twelve primary schools five flood-affected upazilas in Sirajganj have fallen victim to erosion in the last couple of months.

As per district primary education administration, Chowhali was the hardest hit, with seven primary schools lost to erosion this year. Two schools in Belkuchi, two in Kazipur, and one in Shahzadpur met a similar fate.

The situation worsened

with the recent flood, 12 erosion-hit schools revealed in Sirajganj Sadar, 14 in academic activities. Kazipur, 11 in Ullapara, four in Belkuchi, and five in infrastructure losses in Chowhali, causing a halt in academic activities.

Education Officer SM Abdur Rahman said, "To rebuild temporary schools, we need a fund of Tk 3 lakh for each institution that river erosion has haven't been allocated any money yet."
