

#### ATTACK ON BERNICAT'S CONVOY

## Charges pressed against BCL leader, 8 others

Police have finally charged nine persons in a case filed over the attack on former US ambassador to Bangladesh Marcia Bernicat's convoy.

The nine included prime accused Ishtiaque Mahmud, a relative of the complainant Badiul Alam Majumder, secretary

Shusashoner Jonno Nagorik (Shujan); and Naimul Hasan Rasel, president of Mohammadpur Chhatra League unit.

Following re-investigation, Investigation Officer Rajon Kumar Saha, an assistant commissioner of Detective Branch of DMP, pressed charges on September 19, a police official

told The Daily Star, preferring anonymity. The eight accused -- Firoz Mahmud, Naimul Hasan Rasel, Mir Amzad Hossain Akash, Sazu Islam, Razibul Islam Razu, Shahidul Alam Khan Kajol, Siam and Oli

Ahmed Jony -- are now on bail. In the supplementary charge sheet, only Ishtiaque was shown as a fugitive accused. On August 4, 2018, some 30 unidentified miscreants attacked the car of Bernicat, who was about to leave the

residence of Badiul Alam around 11:00pm after attending a courtesy dinner in her

Six days later, Badiul Alam filed the case with Mohammadpur Police Station on August 10, 2018.

Subsequently, the IO in the probe report said, ten accused, along with some 15 to 20 unidentified people on August 4, 2018, gathered near the Iqbal Road residence of the Shujan secretary around 11:00pm and chased the car of Bernicat.

The accused then threw brick chips at her car, it said.

On December 28 last year, a Dhaka court ordered further investigation into the case, following a prosecution application.

In the application, the prosecutor said three prosecution witnesses gave their depositions before the court, mentioning the name of Ishtiaque, brother-in-law of Badiul Alam, as the culprit.

The IO, however, did not include Ishtiaque's name in the charge sheet,

# A possible game changer

Final preparations underway for partial opening on Oct 7

Final preparations are underway for the soft inauguration of the third terminal of Hazrat Shahjalal International Airport a possible game changer in the country's aviation sector.

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina is scheduled to inaugurate the terminal building on October 7, said Civil Aviation Authority of Bangladesh Chairman Air Vice Marshal M Mafidur Rahman.

The new terminal is expected to provide world class service to the air travellers. However, they will have to wait till the end of the next year when this terminal will become operational. This time will be required due to the necessary calibration and preparation of the equipment used in terminal operations, he said.

Airlines, however, will be able to use the new parking apron and taxiway of the third terminal after the partial opening. The two old terminals' aprons can accommodate 29 aircraft at present.

Mafidur Rahman said a total of 37 aircraft can be parked at a time, once the terminal, with an area of 5,42,000 square metres, is fully opened.

"Almost 90 percent of the work of the mega project is completed. Structure of the terminal is ready, and work is going on at present for interior decorations and to install necessary equipment and technology," he added.

Ahead of the third terminal's full operation, different foreign airlines are eyeing to start their operation from Dhaka Airport, which will play a great role to take the country's aviation sector forward, experts said.

According to sources at the Civil Aviation and Tourism Ministry, at least 15 new foreign carriers -- including Swiss Air, Air Canada, Air France -- have already expressed their interest to operate flights to and from Dhaka.

### Says acting foreign secy after meeting with US

# Govt can stop puja violence if it wants

#### Says Oikya Parishad

If the government wants, it can prevent attacks and vandalism during Durga Puja, Bangladesh Hindu Buddhist Christian Oikya Parishad's General Secretary Rana Dasgupta said yesterday.

"The year 2022 did not witness any attacks or vandalism following the violence during 2021 Durga Puja. It serves as evidence that if the government wants to prevent such incidents, they are capable of doing so," Dasgupta said at a press conference at Jatiya Press Club.

He said, "Our political parties must come together for the greater interest of the nation's democracy, keeping aside divisive sectarian interests. They must unite to build resistance against incidents like vandalism of idols."

Before this statement, Dasgupta announced they would hold the mass rally on November 4 instead of October 6 based on the assurance from the government that it would form the national commission for minority affairs before its tenure expires.

The act for forming the commission would be passed in the next parliament session in October. In a written statement, Dasgupta said the EC has already announced that the 12th national parliamentary elections will be held in the first week of January next year.

"We hope that all the political parties in our country will come forward with a greater commitment to keeping the interests of the country and the nation intact, and will play a more responsible role in ensuring the continuity of democracy and development for the future."

'ENSURE SAFETY OF HINDUS AHEAD OF DURGA PUJA, POLLS'

Leaders of the Bangladesh Hindu Association (BHA) UK have urged the government to ensure the safety of their fellow members and relatives in Bangladesh during the Durga Puja and the upcoming election.

Raising concerns over the welfare of the minority group in Bangladesh, they handed over a petition to the Foreign Minister AK Abdul Momen while calling on him in London on Saturday, a foreign ministry statement said yesterday.

Foreign Minister Momen said strict precautionary measures and necessary steps would be taken during the puja and election to protect the Hindus. He said the government is committed to ensuring religious peace, harmony, and security.

The association chairman Proshanta Datta Purokayastha led the group.
