## Israel 'at war' after Hamas offensive

At least 100 killed in Israel; retaliatory air strikes pound Gaza killing at least 232

Palestinian Islamist group Hamas took Israel by surprise yesterday with the biggest attack for decades, a sudden assault by gunmen who crossed into Israeli villages, killed dozens of people and brought hostages back into the Gaza Strip.

Israel responded with massive air strikes deep inside the coastal enclave, killing scores and wounding hundreds of people and vowing unprecedented

Israel's N12 News reported that at least 100 Israelis were killed, while Gaza authorities released a death toll of 232 in the bloodiest escalation in the wider conflict since May 2021, with hundreds more wounded on both

"We are at war," said Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu as the military launched a series of air strikes against targets of Iran-backed Hamas in the blockaded coastal enclave where black smoke billowed into the sky.

"The enemy will pay an unprecedented price," the right-wing veteran Israeli premier vowed after Hamas launched its first such combined air, sea and ground offensive, half a century after the outbreak of the 1973 Arab-Israeli war.

## Next int'l aviation hub will be here

PM says at soft launch of **HSIA's Terminal-3**

Dhaka or Cox's Bazar airport will become the next international aviation hub due to favourable geographical location, Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina yesterday said at the soft launch of the iconic Terminal-3 of the capital's Hazrat Shahjalal International Airport. She partially opened the terminal,

designed by celebrated architect Rohani Bahrin, by unveiling a plaque at the HSIA with the slogan "Connecting

Architect Rohani, who was present at the soft launch, told the media, "The third terminal designed based on the six seasons of Bangladesh. The terminal was built with a mix of heritage and modernity.

Taken up at a cost of Tk 21,398 crore, the third terminal is one of the major mega projects of the Awami League government. It was finished around seven months ahead of schedule, according to the Civil Aviation Authority of Bangladesh (CAAB).

### Big rise in 10 banks' bad loans

The defaulted loans in 10 banks, including four staterun lenders, increased at an alarming rate in fiscal 2022-23, indicating their worsening financial health.

At the end of June, the ten lenders' bad loans stood at Tk 69,671 crore, which is 45 percent of the record Tk 156,039 crore of defaulted loans logged in by the banking sector. A year earlier, the ten banks defaulted loans accounted for 38.2 percent of the

sector's total. ICB Islamic Bank, which was born out of the scamriddled defunct Oriental Bank, has as much as 86.65 percent of its total disbursed credit defaulting as of June 30, up from 82.61 percent a year earlier, according to the

Bangladesh took the risky call of going with five specialist bowlers and Mahmudullah as

Rahmanullah Gurbaz Ibrahim Zadran.

Shakib then stepped up to the plate and put the brakes on Afghanistan with a couple of strikes.

Afghanistan still looked on their way to a decent total till Gurbaz was in the middle. But once he got caught off Mustafizur Rahman for 47, the Afghan innings fell apart as they lost their last eight batters in the span of 44 runs

Shakib did not hide his disappointment with the way they started the match, but was proud of the way his bowlers fought back.

"We didn't get the start we wanted. Everyone believed that once we got a wicket, we could get more. It wasn't easy, but I am very happy the way
