The government failed to enforce the price cap on onions and potatoes even for a single day since it issued the order about a month ago.

Government agencies raided kitchen markets numerous times across the country, but the retail and wholesale prices stayed way above the limit set by the agriculture ministry on September 14.

And the victims are the people of limited income already struggling to cope with the rising cost of living.

Consumer rights campaigners and economists believe capping prices never works unless supply increases according to demand.

Retailers say they cannot sell at the set prices since they are spending more to procure the goods. Wholesalers claim that they cannot lower the

## ADB to provide \$3b each year till 2026

## Rohit's record ton flattens Afghanistan

Captain Rohit Sharma on Wednesday surpassed compatriot Sachin Tendulkar with a record seventh World Cup century to lead India to a crushing eight-wicket win over Afghanistan.

Chasing 273 for victory in New Delhi, the hosts rode on Rohit's 131 to achieve their target in 35 overs for a second straight win in the 50-over showcase event.



He brought the nearly packed house to its feet with his century off 63 balls to go past Tendulkar's record of six tons in World Cups.

Rohit's century was also the fastest by an Indian in a World Cup, quicker than Kapil Dev's hundred in 72 balls against Zimbabwe in 1983.

Rohit hit the ball to all parts of the ground as he reached 1,000 World Cup runs and then went past
