

Pakistan target breaking World Cup jinx AGAINST INDIA

Pakistan would be forgiven for feeling like gladiators thrown into the Colosseum when they face an India team egged on by 100,000-plus fans in Saturday's World Cup blockbuster, but skipper Babar Azam sees the match as a chance to end a jinx against their arch-rivals.

Two-time champions India have a perfect 7-0 record against Pakistan in the 50-overs World Cup and are also the top-ranked ODI team, who have won both their games in the tournament so far.

But Pakistan have also won their opening two matches, and Babar is approaching the tournament's mostanticipated clash at the Narendra Modi Stadium, the world's largest cricket venue, with a complete disregard for the past.

"I don't think about the past, I'd rather focus on future," Babar told reporters with a wry smile on his face.

'All records are meant to be broken, and we'll try to break this record tomorrow.

"It boils down to how you perform on the day of the match. We have done pretty well in the first two matches, and I have full belief we'll do well in the next match as well."

Part of how they perform will depend on how his team mates manage to deal with the pressure of the game's fiercest rivalry played out in the den of their cricketing foes.

Babar said his message to his team mates was to see it as an opportunity to perform well and etch their names into the memories of those watching back

"India-Pakistan match is a big game,

Although Pakistan still lead head-tohead record against India by 73-56, India have won seven of the last 10 meetings between the two teams in the last 10 years, with Pakistan winning two of those and the other one yielding a no-result.

India hold an all-encompassing edge over their neighbours when it comes to clashes in the 50-over World Cup. The men in blue have won all seven of their meetings, starting with their first meeting in the showpiece event in 1992.

India are the top-ranked side in this format while Pakistan are ranked second. Both teams have won their first two matches — India against Australia and Afghanistan and Pakistan against

Netherlands and Sri Lanka.

This will be the second match of the World Cup at the Narendra Modi Stadium in Ahmedabad -- the biggest cricket stadium in the world -- with the first being the opening match of the competition which ended in a ninewicket win for New Zealand against defending champions England.

We played seven games and our neighbouring country reminds us every second day about the 7-0. Frankly speaking, I can't single out one reason for the losing streak.

a high-intensity contest. I've told my boys it's a great opportunity - give your best, execute your plans and believe in yourself," he said.

"It's a massive stadium, and there would be big crowd. This is a golden opportunity for us to perform in front of such a big crowd."

Pakistan's fortunes could depend on pace spearhead Shaheen Afridi, who has troubled India's top order in recent

encounters between the rivals.

His workload has increased after his new-ball partner Naseem Shah was ruled out of the tournament with a shoulder injury but Babar has faith in Afridi.

"He's our best bowler, a champion bowler," Babar said of the left-arm quick. "I believe he's a big-match bowler, who

always gives his best on big occasions.

"For us, it does not matter if he does not get wickets in a match or two, it does not put a question mark against him."

With this year's tournament producing several high-scoring contests, Babar said he had reminded the bowlers of the need to be accurate.

"We are seeing mostly high-scoring matches and there's little margin for error for the bowlers. If you are straying from the stumps line, the margin is less.

"I just told my bowlers to hit the right length and bowl stump-to-stump."

 $\label{lem:coach} Argentine\ coach\ Diego\ Cruciani\ is\ likely\ to\ return$ as the head coach of Abahani for the 2023-24 season as the club management decided not to renew the contract of Portuguese coach Mario It has also been learnt that the club

management has decided to appoint assistant coach Nazrul Islam as the manager in place of Satyjit Das Rupu, who worked as the manager of the club's football team for nearly two decades. Cruciani had previously coached Abahani

in 2007 after serving as the head coach of Bangladesh team from 2005 to 2006. The 61-year-old coach also worked with Saif SC in the 2021-22 season. Though the club officials kept silent regarding

the appointments of the new coach and manager, the club's chief executive officer, Mohammad Humayun Kabir, said that they would inform the developments once the club's chairman approves of the football committee's decisions.

"I can't tell you anything until the club chairman approves the new resolution, which was taken at the meeting of the football committee yesterday [Thursday]," Kabir told The Daily Star on Friday.

When contacted, Lemos said, "Abahani decided not to renew contract with me and informed it last night [Thursday].'

However, an online news portal confirmed the appointment of Cruciani and Nazrul, quoting the club's acting director-in-charge Kazi Nabil Ahmed.



Cricket approved for LA2028

Five sports, including cricket and flag football, proposed for inclusion at the Los Angeles 2028 Olympics were approved by the International Olympic Committee executive board on Friday, leaving them with one last hurdle to seal their Olympic spots.

Organisers of the LA 2028 Games said this week they wanted cricket, flag football, lacrosse, squash and baseball-softball added to the event.

Each host city, under IOC rules approved a few years ago, can request the inclusion of several sports for their edition of the Games.


"These proposals have been accepted as a package by the IOC Executive Board," IOC President Thomas Bach told a press conference at the end of the executive board meeting.

"Taking into consideration that these proposals and these sports are fully in line with the sports culture of our hosts in 2028, with the American sports culture, they will showcase iconic American sports to the world while bringing at the same time international sports to the Unites States."

The IOC session, starting on Sunday, will now have to rubberstamp the board's recommendation.

Cricket is set for an Olympic return after appearing once at the 1900 Games. India is also considering bidding for future Olympics.

The Los Angeles Games proposal is for a sixteam Twenty20 cricket tournament for men and women. T20 is a short format of the game.
