Escaped militants are 'somewhere in the country'

Still no trace of 2 fugitive death row convicts; cops conducting drives to arrest them

On November 20 last year, two death row convict militants, Abu Siddiq Sohel and Moinul Hasan Shamim, escaped from a Dhaka court with help from their associates.

While being taken to prison, the convicts saulted their police escort, untied themselves from shackles and fled on a motorcycle, never to be seen again. Almost a year has passed since that day, but police are vet to get any trace of the two.

Sohel, an Ansar Al Islam member, and his associate Shamim were sentenced to death for the murder of publisher Faisal Arefin Dipon.

A high official of the Counter Terrorism and Transnational Crime (CTTC) unit recently told this correspondent the duo are now hiding "somewhere in the country"

According to the CTTC unit, they stayed in a Savar house for a month before moving

"The militants took shelter in their associates' houses," the CTTC unit official said, requesting anonymity.

The CTTC said they came up with the

information following the arrest of five members of Ansar Al Islam, including its nayeb-e-amir, from Jatrabari in Dhaka last

"We were very close to arresting one of the escaped militants. But he managed to flee just two days before we conducted the drive," said CTTC unit chief Md Asaduzzaman.

Investigators said the outfit has at least 70 modules or sleeper cells in 50 districts, each having at least four to five members.

In March 2021, several groups damaged and carried out arson attacks on establishments, including the land office, police lines, a music academy, a municipality office, a public library, a Hindu temple and the local press club in Brahmanbaria.

Some members of Ansar Al Islam worked s instigators behind the mayhem, according to police.

The outfit is now planning to conduct areabased attacks, with the outfit's top leader and sacked major Syed Ziaul Haque giving instructions to its members in this regard, they said.

During the interrogation of the arrested Nayeb-e-Amir Sakhawatul Kabir, alias Anis alias Rafique, investigators have reportedly uncovered information about financiers and

sympathisers of the outfit. Contacted, Ahamedul Islam, additional deputy commissioner of the CTTC unit. said, "We are analysing their [financiers and sympathisers of the outfit] activities before taking actions against them. We have also got details of some financiers who donated funds from abroad."

3 held for killing software engineer

Police yesterday arrested three youths in connection with the murder of a software engineer who was stabbed to death in the capital's Dakshinkhan area on Thursday night.

The arrestees are -- Razib, 23, a named accused in the case, Ashique, 23, and Sheikh Nizam, 22.

They were placed on a three-day remand each yesterday after Dakshinkhan police sought 10 days remand for them, Sub-inspector Abu Taher of the police station, told The Daily Star.

Musabbir Hossain Chowdhury, 25, resident of Bashundhara Residential Area and an employee of a private software company, was stabbed to deatl around 7:30pm on Thursday near Kosai Bari rail gate area when he was attempting to break up a quarrel between two groups.

Police are looking for the other miscreants, said Taher, also the case's investigation officer.

The victim's mother Nasrin Begum filed a murder case over the incident, accusing seven named and eight unnamed individuals.

Meanwhile, a group of students of International University of Business Agriculture and Technology, from where Musabbir recently graduated, held a protest rally in Uttara, demanding justice.

They blocked the road in front of the university in sector-10 area around 10:00am. Following the rally, a long tailback ensued in the area. Police later went to the spot and assured the students of arresting the perpetrators. Students left the area around noon.

Communal forces active ahead of polls: info minister

Information Minister Hasan Mahmud yesterday said the communal forces try to hatch a conspiracy whenever the election

"Most of the Bangalee people are not communal. For this, the communal forces couldn't raise their head. The evil forces have been subdued by our combined efforts," he said. The minister said the evil forces always try to hatch conspiracies ahead of polls. So, everyone should remain alert, he added.

Hasan, also Awami League joint general secretary, made the remarks while addressing the inaugural event of Shuvo Mahalaya at Banani Puja Mandap in the capital.

Gulshan-Banani Sarbojanin Puja Foundation organised the event.

The minister said the present government, in the last 15 years, tried to bring back the original spirit of the nation, which was lost after 1975.

A state should never have laws like the "enemy property law". A different law has been enacted to abolish it, he added.

He said the communal forces should be resisted to strengthen the noncommunal spirit of Bangladesh.

He said Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina repeatedly said "Religion is for individuals and festivals are for all...

200 years of Bangalee history in 208 volumes, 74,000 pages

Bishwa Sahitya Kendra initiates gradual launch of vast compilation

In its bid to enlighten people through promoting reading habit, Bishwa Sahitya Kendra has taken an initiative to publish a vast compilation of selected writings of trailblazing Bangalee authors from different eras spanning over the

Titled "Bangalir Chintamulak Rachana Sangraha", the compilation will be of 74,000 pages, in 208 volumes, and covering 16 different subjects, according to the Kendra.

It announced the initiative during a ceremony yesterday at its premises in the capital. The ceremony marked the commencement of gradual launch of the compilation.

At present, 54 volumes are available. The rest will gradually be available to the readers by March, 2024, said the Kendra officials.

Describing the reason behind

compilation, Kendra founder Prof Abdullah Abu Sayeed said the 200 vears are the "finest" period in the Bangalee's lives.

Numerous important works could be found done earlier but

selecting the past 200 years for the those might not be as comparable to what Bangalees have done in the past 200 years, he said.

"There has been an extraordinary rise in Bangalee's 'intellect' in the past 200 years," he added.

Prof Sayeed is the lead editor of

the compilation while authors from relevant fields did subject-based

The subjects are: history (in 18 volumes), philosophy (20 volumes), religion (20 volumes), arts (11 volumes), literature (35 volumes), science (eight volumes), environment (five volumes), film (10 volumes), music (13 volumes), politics (25 volumes), language (10 volumes), culture (four volumes), woman issue (four volumes), society (eight volumes), economics (eight volumes), and education (nine volumes).

Shameem Al Mamun, director of the Kendra, said they started the initiative in 2000 and collected and selected the writings between 2000 and 2008.

It was a massive task to keep everything in order considering the vast compilation of 74,000 pages, he added.

5 workers burnt in N'ganj steel mill blast

Five workers were burnt in a blast at a steel mill Narayanganj's Sadar upazila early yesterday.

The blast took place around 4:30am at Sharmin Steel Limited in Godnail area of the upazila, said Officer in-Charge Golam Mostofa of Siddhirganj Police Station.

The injured are Saiful, 30, Mozammel, 30, Iqbal, 25, Shoriful, 26 and Jakaria 20.

"Mozammel and Saiful are in a critical condition. Iqbal, Shoriful and Jakaria are currently being treated at the Sheikh Hasina National Institute of Burn and Plastic Surgery in Dhaka," said Toriqul İslam, its resident doctor.

"The fire was caused by a blast in a gas pipe line. We are looking into the incident," the OC added.

Rayhan Habib, director of Sharmin Steel, could not be reached for comments despite repeated attempts.
