Lavrov meets Kim Jong Un

Slams 'dangerous' US policy

Russian Foreign Minister Sergei Lavrov met with North Korea's Kim Jong Un yesterday, after slamming US policy towards the nuclear-armed state as "dangerous".

Lavrov hailed North Korea as a "close neighbour and long-time partner" in a meeting that lasted a little over an hour, Russia's foreign ministry said in a statement.

The veteran envoy's two-day visit is expected to lay the groundwork for a trip to the country by Russian President Vladimir Putin, who was invited by Kim last month at a high-profile summit in Russia's far east.

Earlier in the day, Lavrov lashed out at what he termed a "dangerous" US policy towards North Korea while touting the "new, strategic level" of relations between Moscow and Pyongyang.

"Like our North Korean friends, we are seriously worried about the intensification of military activity of the United States, Japan and South Korea in the region and by Washington's policies," Lavrov told journalists, according to Russian news

"We oppose this unconstructive and dangerous line," he said, adding that the United States was placing infrastructure, including nuclear elements", in the region, without elaborating.

In the face of a record-breaking series of weapons tests by Pyongyang this year, Seoul has moved to strengthen its security relationship with traditional ally the United States while entering a trilateral defence arrangement that also includes Japan. But North Korea's relationship with Russia has also been tightening, Lavrov said yesterday.

"After the landmark summit... we can say confidently that relations have reached a qualitatively new, strategic level," Lavrov reportedly told North Korean Foreign Minister Choe Son Hui at a meeting.

Moscow is also keen to assist North Korea with its energy needs, he told Russian outlets.

Israel's endgame?

No sign of post-war plan for Gaza

Israel is vowing to wipe out Hamas in a relentless onslaught on the Gaza Strip but has no obvious endgame in sight, with no clear plan for how to govern the ravaged Palestinian enclave even if it triumphs on the battlefield.

Codenamed "Operation Swords of Iron", the military campaign will be unmatched in its ferocity and unlike anything Israel has carried out in Gaza in the past, according to eight regional and Western officials with knowledge of the conflict who declined to be named due to the sensitivity of the matter.

Israel has called up a record 360,000 reservists and has been bombarding the tiny enclave non-stop following

October 7.

The immediate Israeli strategy, said three regional officials familiar with discussions between the US and Middle Eastern leaders, is to destroy Gaza's infrastructure, even at the cost of high civilian casualties, push the enclave's people towards the Egyptian border and go after Hamas by blowing up the labyrinth of underground tunnels the group has built to conduct its operations.

Israeli officials have said that they don't have a clear idea for what a postwar future might look like, though.

Some of US President Joe Biden's aides are concerned that while Israel may craft an effective plan to inflict lasting damage to Hamas, it has yet to formulate Hamas's assault on southern Israel on an exit strategy, a source in Washington

familiar with the matter said.

Arab officials are also alarmed that Israel hasn't set out a clear plan for the future of the enclave, ruled by Hamas since 2006 and home to 2.3 million

"Îsrael doesn't have an endgame for Gaza. Their strategy is to drop thousands of bombs, destroy everything and go in, but then what? They have no exit strategy for the day after," said one regional security source.

Biden, on a visit to Israel, told Israelis that justice needed to be served to Hamas, though he cautioned that after the 9/11 attacks on New York, the US had made mistakes. The "vast majority of Palestinians are not Hamas", he said. "Hamas does not represent the Palestinian people."

RETURN OF NAWAZ SHARIF

Pak court grants bail to ex-PM

A Pakistan court granted bail yesterday to former prime minister and graft convict Nawaz Sharif, removing the threat of arrest when he returns to the country from self-imposed exile this weekend. After nearly four years in the United Kingdom, Sharif is hoping to lead his Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) party through elections scheduled for January 2024. The court's decision allows him to return to his political heartland of Lahore tomorrow for a welcome home rally, while his primary opponent Imran Khan languishes in jail. "It's a new beginning," PML-N chairman Raja Muhammad Zafar-ul-Haq said. "His return is poised to be a momentous development." Sharif's lawyer Amjad Pervaiz said the Islamabad High Court granted him protective bail until October 24 meaning "he cannot be arrested on his arrival" in Pakistan. Sharif has been PM three times but was ousted in 2017 and given a lifetime disqualification from politics after being convicted of corruption. He served less than a year of a seven-year sentence before getting permission to seek medical care in the UK, ignoring subsequent court orders to return during Imran Khan's government. Sharif's return has likely been smoothed by a deal between the military establishment and his party to prevent significant legal hurdles, said analyst Zahid Hussain.

China building up nuke capacity faster than expected Says US

China is developing its nuclear arsenal faster than US projections had previously anticipated, according to a Pentagon report released yesterday China possessed "more than 500 operational nuclear warheads as of May 2023 - on track to exceed previous expectations" the Department of Defense said in its annual China Military Power Report, issued annually and mandated by Congress. "We're not trying to suggest a very large departure from where they looked to be headed... but we are suggesting that they're on track to exceed those previous projections," a senior defense official told journalists. Nevertheless, the uptick "raises a lot of concerns for us," the official said, speaking on the condition of anonymity.
