

## Democracy under threat around world

Says watchdog

Half of the world's countries are suffering democratic decline, ranging from flawed elections to curtailed rights including freedoms of expression and assembly, an intergovernmental watchdog group said yesterday.

In its annual report, the Stockholm-based International Institute for Democracy and Electoral Assistance (IDEA) said 2022 was the sixth consecutive year in which countries with net declines outnumbered those with net advances, the longest consecutive fall since its records began in 1975.

"In short, democracy is still in trouble, stagnant at best, and declining in many parts," IDEA Secretary General Kevin Casas-Zamora said in the report.

The think-tank said the deterioration of democratic guardrails such as elections, parliaments and independent courts had led to problems in safeguarding the rule of law and holding politicians to account.

## Pakistan to hold delayed polls on February 8

Pakistan will hold delayed national elections on February 8 next year, the electoral commission said yesterday, as the country grapples with overlapping political, economic and security crises.

"It was unanimously decided that the election will be held on Thursday, February 8," the election commission said in a statement, after its members met with President Arif Alvi. The development comes hours after Chief Justice of Pakistan (CJP) Qazi Faez Isa had directed the commission to confer with Alvi on poll date.

The order was issued after a bench comprising the CJP heard a set of petitions calling for holding elections within 90 days after the dissolution of the National Assembly and the provincial legislatures.

## UN will 'stay with Palestinians in Gaza'

Says top aid official; Israeli strikes on refugee camp could be war crimes: UN rights office

The United Nations will remain steadfast in supporting Palestinians in Gaza, a top aid official said during the first such trip to the territory since the war with Israel erupted.

"I was shocked by the fact that everyone there was asking for food, was asking for water," Philippe Lazzarini, head of the UN agency for Palestinian refugees (UNRWA), told journalists in Gaza on Wednesday.

The most senior UN official to visit the territory since the war began said he had "never ever seen" anything like it before in Gaza.

He said all those who he met in Gaza were

concerned about shortages in food, water and fuel. "They were drawing my attention today about the real lack of food, the lack of water, the lack of fuel," he said.

"Fuel here in Gaza is absolutely everything because without fuel we do not have generator, we do not have functioning bakery, we do not have functioning hospitals and you cannot pump water."

"UNRWA will stay with the Palestinian refugees in Gaza, with the Palestinians here in Gaza," Lazzarini added.

Meanwhile, the UN Human Rights Office said the deadly Israeli air strikes on the Gaza Strip's largest refugee camp "could amount to war crimes"

## PHONE TAPPING India probes opposition allegations

India's cyber security unit is investigating allegations by opposition politicians of attempted phone tapping after they reported receiving Apple iPhone warnings of "state-sponsored attackers", media reported yesterday.

India's Computer Emergency Response Team has opened a probe into the complaints, the PTI news agency reported.

"Apple will cooperate in this probe," S. Krishnan, secretary for the electronics and information ministry, was quoted as saying.

## US, Canadian warships cross Taiwan Strait China on 'alert'

China said yesterday its troops were "on constant high alert" after US and Canadian warships passed through the Taiwan Strait, their second joint passage in two months. The USS Rafael Peralta, an Arleigh Burke-class destroyer, and the Royal Canadian Navy's Halifax-class frigate HMCS Ottawa conducted a "routine" transit through the strait on Wednesday, the US Navy said. "Troops in the theatre remain on constant high alert, and will resolutely protect national sovereignty and security as well as regional peace and stability," Senior Colonel Shi Yi, a spokesman for China's Eastern Theatre Command, said in a statement. Shi slammed the latest transit as a "public hype" and said its naval and air forces had "trailed their entire course." The ships' passage comes after two warships belonging to the US and Canada sailed through the narrow waterway separating the island and mainland China on September 9.

## Myanmar rebels seize vital border town

Myanmar's military has lost control of a strategic northern town on the Chinese border following days of clashes with three ethnic armed groups, a junta spokesman said. "Government, administrative organisations and security organisations are no longer present" in Chinshwehaw town, which borders China's Yunnan province, Zaw Min Tun said in a statement late Wednesday. Fighting has raged since Friday across a swathe of Myanmar's northern Shan state -- where a billion-dollar rail link is planned as part of Beijing's Belt and Road global infrastructure project. The Ta'ang National Liberation Army (TNLA), the Arakan Army (AA) and the Myanmar National Democratic Alliance Army (MNDA) say they have seized several military posts and key roads linking Myanmar with China, its biggest trade partner.
