Established in 1993, Independent University, Bangladesh (IUB) is the leading private university in Bangladesh with an explicit focus on research and global partnerships. With a current enrollment of around 12,000 at undergraduate and graduate levels, more than 450 highly qualified faculty members (47% of whom have PhD degrees), and an alumni strength of close to 18,000, IUB strives to ensure education for all to promote the national agenda of sustainable inclusive development.

The campus
The IUB campus sprawls over 3 acres in the Bashundhara Residential Area in Dhaka, the capital city of Bangladesh. There is an amphitheater, dedicated state-of-the-art laboratories for life, environmental and social sciences, and engineering. There are a total of 135 multimedia classrooms fully equipped for both physical and online classes. The campus also hosts an auditorium, a 6,000 sq-ft modern gymnasium (with separate spaces for men and women), yoga studio, food court, spacious sports complex and a swimming pool.

Accommodation
IUB has a secured dormitory for female students coming from outside Dhaka, foreign students, and a guesthouse for visiting scholars.

Academic Programs
The curriculum is based on the North American Liberal Arts Model and the medium of instruction is English. There are currently five academic schools, namely:

1. School of Business & Entrepreneurship (SBE)
2. School of Engineering, Technology and Sciences (SETS)
3. School of Environment & Life Sciences (SELS)
4. School of Liberal Arts and Social Sciences (SLASS)
5. School of Pharmacy and Public Health (SPPH)

The academic year is divided into three semesters: Spring (starting in January), Summer (starting in May) and Autumn (starting in September).

Scholarships and Financial Aid
IUB provides scholarships and financial aid, ensuring qualified new and current students have access to financial support. We strive to extend financial help to a broad range of deserving students. With the use of technology, we ensure that the aid is granted in a just, discreet, and accountable manner.

Live-in-Field Experience
IUB's pioneering Program, Live-in-Field Experience, a 3-credit Program mandatory for all undergraduate students, gives a distinctive opportunity to learn about rural life. The program complements the course titled "National Culture and Heritage", a comprehensive study of the history, society and culture of Bangladesh.

Co-Curricular Activities
IUB places strong emphasis on co-curricular activities and provides students with unlimited opportunities to enhance their talent and skills. The Division of Student Activities (DoSA) coordinates all student activities including the programming of the 48 student clubs. Students are also encouraged to participate in community services programs like blood donation drives, distribution of winter clothes in marginalized locations, fundraising for victims of natural disasters, and so on to promote leadership and personal growth.

POFILE OF THE 24TH CONVOCATION SPEAKER

Selina Hossain

In the vast expanse of Bengali literature, few names shine as brightly as Selina Hossain. She has not only established herself as one of the leading figures in the literary realm but also as a steadfast guardian of Bangladesh's cultural and literary heritage. Born in 1947 to A. K. Mosharraf Hossain and Mariamenna Bakul, her journey into the world of literature was nurtured in an environment that imbued the rich traditions of Bengali language and culture. She further cemented her foundation in the language by earning her MA degree in Bengali language and literature from Rajshahi University in 1968.

Selina Hossain's narrative is both expansive and intricate, with her novels often weaving social issues into the storylines. Her major works like "Hangor Nodi Grenade" (1976) and "Poka Makorer Ghor Boshoti" (1996) represents her unique storytelling. Her outstanding contribution was recognized early in her career when she received the Bangla Academy Literary Award in 1980. Throughout her life, she has adorned many significant roles. She retired as the Director of Bangla Academy, served as a Member of the National Human Rights Commission of Bangladesh, and represented the Bangladesh government on the Executive Board of UNESCO. Between 2014 and 2018, she chaired Bangladesh Shishu Academy.

Her prowess is not only limited to novels but also extends to short stories. Her stories like "Utso Theke Nirontor" (1969) and "Narir Rupkotha" (2009) have been milestones in Bangladeshi literature. Furthermore, her work has found audiences beyond Bengali speakers. Her tales have been translated into multiple languages including English, Russian, French, Japanese, and Korean. Her novel, "Bhumi O Kusum" was the first in Bangla literature to address the enclave issue, showcasing her ability to blend socio-political issues seamlessly with fiction.

Over the years, Selina Hossain's literary mastery has been acknowledged with numerous awards. Apart from the Bangla Academy Literary Award, she was bestowed the Ekushey Padak in 2009 and the Independence Award in 2018. Her list of accolades is exhaustive. Some notable ones include the Dr. Muhammad Enamul Haque Gold Medal (1969), the Premchand Fellowship of Sahitya Akademi, Rabindra Smriti Puraskar by IIPM, New Delhi (2010), and the International Award for Doctor of Literature (Honoris Causa) from the Rabindra Bharati University (2010). In 2015, she was honored with the SAARC Literary Award alongside other eminent personalities, marking her significant influence in the South Asian literary arena. In 2018, she received the honorary Doctor of Literature (DLitt) Degree from Rajshahi University, her alma mater.

Selina Hossain's career has been both prolific and impactful. From her debut with novels like "Josnay Shurjo Jala" (1973) and "Jolochchhas" (1972) to later masterpieces like "Guerilla O Beerangona" (2014), her works have chronicled the changing landscapes of Bangladesh, both politically and socially. Her resilience, coupled with her passion for writing, has ensured that her voice remains significant in contemporary literature. Serving as the President of Bangla Academy, her influence continues to shape and guide the future of Bangladeshi literature, ensuring that the rich heritage of Bengali storytelling lives on for generations to come.
