

Focus on competitiveness to wean off subsidies

Senior commerce secretary says at apparel sustainability workshop

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Entrepreneurs should start working on enhancing their competitiveness as large amounts of government subsidies and incentives cannot be provided once Bangladesh attains developing country status in 2026, said Tapan Kanti Ghosh, senior secretary to the commerce ministry.

He also underscored the need for grooming skilled human resources, saying it would be required to face challenges that would arise when Bangladesh attempts to graduate to developed nation status.

"We have to ensure some policy support to continue the trend in RMG exports as well as competitiveness in the global market," he told a workshop as chief guest at Radisson Blu Dhaka Water Garden on Tuesday.

Fed official expects further rate hike

A senior US central bank official said Tuesday that she expects another interest rate hike would be needed to lower inflation further, even as officials held rates steady at their latest meeting.

The Federal Reserve's decision last Wednesday to hold interest rates at a 22-year high has fueled hopes that policymakers may be done lifting rates.

But Fed Governor Michelle Bowman said in prepared remarks in Ohio: "I continue to expect that we will need to increase the federal funds rate further to bring inflation down to our two percent target in a timely way."

Smart parking card launched

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Dhaka North City Corporation (DNCC), in collaboration with Dhaka Metropolitan Police (DMP), and Law and Order Coordination Council (LOCC), has launched a smart parking card with the partnership of Mastercard and Islami Bank Bangladesh PLC.

Asaduzzaman Khan Kamal, minister for home affairs, attended the event as chief guest at the DNCC office in Dhaka yesterday, said a press release.

The parking card will facilitate easier, faster and a more convenient payment option for vehicle parking at 11 parking zones allocated by DNCC in the capital's Gulshan area.

This card will allow cardholders to make payments for parking spots without having to handle cash.

At the parking spot, vehicle owners will have to tap Mastercard "Smart Parking Card" on the POS system and pay the parking fee.

The smart parking card can only be used for making payments at specified parking locations set by the DNCC and the LOCC.

The card will also be available at the branches of Islami Bank in Banani, Gulshan-1, and Gulshan-2 and with the wardens at the parking locations.

FROM PAGE B4 in 2014, despite strong opposition from New Delhi.

And in December 2017, unable to repay a huge Chinese loan, Sri Lanka allowed China Merchants Port Holdings to take over the southern Hambantota port.

The deal, which gave the Chinese company a 99 year lease, raised fears

about Beijing's use of "debt traps" in exerting its influence abroad.

India and the United States have also expressed concerns that a Chinese foothold at Hambantota could give Beijing a military advantage in the Indian Ocean.

Last year the port hosted a Chinese research ship that India accuses of spying.
