RMG workers must accept new wage

PM says at ALCWC meeting

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina yesterday said readymade garment workers must accept the new minimum wage.

She said this in her introductory speech at the Awami League Central Working Committee meeting at the Gono Bhaban last night.

"If the workers do not accept this, then the people who are now instigating them to take to the streets will kill them," BSS quoted her as saying

Even though the owners increased the workers' minimum wage to Tk 12,500, the vested quarters are trying to create a situation to destabilise the garment sector, she said.
