"Our movement will pick up pace soon after the Election Commission announces the election schedule. We may add on programmes like sit-ins," said a standing committee member of the BNP, wishing not to be named.

The EC met President Mohammed Shahabuddin yesterday and told journalists afterwards that the election schedule will be unveiled soon.

Even though no date was mentioned, sources at the EC said the schedule could be announced between November 14 and 16.

The BNP yesterday called a 48-hour nationwide blockade that will end on Tuesday, November 14, morning.

This is the fourth spell of blockades since October 31.

Earlier, the court recorded statements of four prosecution witnesses in the case. On June 6, it framed charges against the accused, including Prof Yunus.

On September 9, 2021, Labour Inspector (general) SM Arifuzzaman of the Inspection for Factories and Establishments Department (IFED) filed the case with the court.

According to the case documents, IFED officials on August 16, 2021, inspected the office of Grameen Telecom in the capital's Mirpur and found several iolations of labour laws.

On August 19 that year, the department sent a letter to the authorities of Grameen Telecom, mentioning that 67 of its employees were supposed to be made permanent employees. But it was not done, the case statement said.

Besides, the employee's participation and welfare funds were yet to be formed, and five percent of the company's dividends supposed to be paid to the workers were not paid, it added.
