Says Jatiotabadi Ainjibi Forum

Bangladesh Jatiotabadi Ainjibi Forum (BJAF), a body of pro-BNP lawyers, yesterday alleged that a total of 13,386 opposition leaders and activists have been arrested through filing 613 cases centring BNP's October 28 rally.

"We are anxiously that witnessing taking enforcers are many of the arrested BNP men on remand and collecting so-called confessional statements. Those statements are being published in the media intentionally, which can be called media trial as well. Law enforcement agencies are implementing the ruling party's political agenda through these acts," BJAF Secretary General Kayser Kamal said in a written statement.

He placed the statement before a press conference organised by BJAF at Supreme Court Bar Association.

Kayser, also BNP's legal affairs secretary, said the High Court has issued directives in 2012, 2015 and 2019 prohibiting the media trial after arrest and remand of people, and following that is mandatory for law enforcers.

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina will inaugurate and lay the foundation stone of 10,041 structures under 157 projects taken by 24 ministries and divisions today.

The premier will inaugurate and lay the

foundation stone of the projects -- some of which are developed and others under development involving Tk 97, 471 crores -- virtually from Gono Bhaban at 10:00am.

The Daily Star so far got information about the projects under six ministries.

Of the projects, 15 are being implemented by different agencies of the shipping ministry, according to a press release of the ministry.

Hasina will also open 15 projects including the

Purbachal Expressway, which was recently renamed as Sheikh Hasina Swarani, under the Ministry of Housing and Public Works. She will inaugurate four projects under the Primary and Mass Education Ministry.

Under one of the four projects, the authority has constructed buildings for 2,023 government primary schools across the country.

She will inaugurate four day-care centres implemented under a project of the Women and Children Affairs Ministry.

A recent study reveals that over 7.4 out of every 100 young people aged 15 to 35 in Bangladesh have diabetes, with a higher prevalence among females at 7.8 percent compared to males at 6.9 percent.

Centre for Global Health Research, BADAS, and Non-Communicable Disease Control of DGHS conducted

the study last year on 2,468 individuals (ages 15-35) from eight divisions: Dhaka, Rangpur, Rajshahi, Khulna, Barishal, M y m e n s i n g h, Sylhet, and Chattogram.

"It is alarming that our young population is diagnosed with diabetes. Most of them are not aware of this, and they do not undergo tests," Dr Bishwajit Bhowmik, chief investigator of the

study, told The Daily Star. He said 70 percent of diabetes cases are preventable.

In such circumstances, the country observes World Diabetes Day today with the theme "Diabetes: Know your risk, know your response."

Those who don't walk for more than 30 minutes a day and do not control their obesity are more prone to diabetes, the study observed.

It said 26.5 percent of the young population who participated in the study had obesity problem, and the

prevalence of obesity is higher in males compared to young females.

Around 61 percent of the young population does not show symptoms despite having diabetes, it further said.

The study says the young population

The study says the young population is diagnosed with diabetes due to their dietary habits.

"Early detection and proper treatment can help control diabetes

elp control diabetes effectively," Dr Bishwajit said.

Diabetes becoming increasingly prevalent Bangladesh. The International Diabetes Federation estimates currently 1.30 crore people are living with diabetes, and it projects the number to be 2.23 crore by 2045. Additionally. people remain undiagnosed,

Bangladesh is currently eighth in the world by the total number of people with diabetes. By 2045, the position is expected to move to seventh, according to IDF.

National Professor AK Azad Khan, president of Bangladesh Diabetes Association, during a press conference yesterday at Birdem Hospital, said diabetes is preventable and it is only possible when people are aware of the risk factors. "That's why we all — those who have diabetes and those who do not have — need to know about the risks in order to prevent and control the disease," he said.

Two sisters found dead

Two sisters died after suffering injuries inside their home in Dhaka's Hazaribagh area early yesterday.

The deceased are Jasmin Akhtar, 44, and Nasrin Akhtar, 36.

Both had speech impairments and mental health issues, said police and family members.

Nasrin had cuts on her right leg and below the left ankle, while Jasmin had a deep cut on her throat, said Shawon Kumar Biswas, a sub-inspector of Hazaribagh Police Station

Hazaribagh Police Station.

Police said they were primarily suspecting that it was a murder-suicide.

"Two sisters were dead and we are investigating it keeping all possible

aspects in mind," Ahad Ali, officer-incharge of Hazaribagh Police Station, told The Daily Star.

SI Shawon said both women were unmarried and used to live with their mother and brother Nazir Hossain.

The incident took place when their brother was out of home and mother was in another room, he said.

The mother saw them lying in a pool

of blood around midnight and informed her son Nazir who took Nasrin to Dhaka Medical College Hospital where doctors declared her dead around 12:30am, the SI said.
