Rab arrests 2 for ‘vandalism’

Arsonists are recording their acts of sabotage and sharing it on social media through various WhatsApp groups, claimed Rapid Action Battalion yesterday.

They made these allegation following arrest of Abu Taleb Masum, 37, the former vice president of the Narayanganj district unit's Chhatra Dal.

Since the beginning of the blockade, Masum allegedly set fire to and vandalised vehicles at different places. Then he recorded and shard videos of the crimes through WhatsApp groups registered under both local and foreign numbers, said Commander Khandaker Al Moin, Director of Rab's Legal and Media Wing during a press conference.

Masum and his associate Joj Miah, 39, was recently arrested in a joint operation conducted by Rab-1 and Rab-15. Moin said the arrestees had carried out acts of violence based on directives from their party leaders.

Masum arrived in Dhaka with activists to join BNP's rally on October 28. Afterwards, they tried to create chaos in the capital by damaging and burning important structures, including both public and private vehicles.

BLOCKCHAIN OLYMPIAD UIU team wins gold

United International University students from Bangladesh have achieved a landmark victory at the International Blockchain Olympiad in Amsterdam, Netherlands, showcasing the country's burgeoning talent in blockchain technology.

support children aged four to five years in learning to read, write in Bangla and English and do simple arithmetic within its one-year course, while attracting them to learning and encouraging them to continue their education in local schools, according to Rib.

Over the last two decades, more than 200 Kajoli learning centres have been established, and are operated by local communities while Rib provided them with learning materials, said Rib chairman Shamsul Bari.

Many of the centres, however, were closed during the pandemic. At present, about 100 such centres are operational.

As the first cultivations on flatlands got success, they are working on a plan to spread coffee cultivation among people.

Delowar Hossain, 50, of Dulalkandi under the upazila, said, "I heard about Salahuddin's coffee cultivation and came here looking for saplings as I like to plant uncommon

varieties. He promised to supply me coffee saplings from his garden. I prepared 20 decimals of land for cultivating coffee and hope to start early December."

Like Delowar, at least five others also showed interest in coffee cultivation from Salahuddin's area.

Md Jahidul Islam, deputy director of DAE at Belabo upazila, said, "The

government has plans to expand coffee production on flat land. That's why we took initiatives to supply saplings for free."

In Narsingdi, we provided saplings to Salahuddin for experiment and it was successful. We will gradually spread coffee cultivation among the people in the area," he added.

Also, 55 forms were sold for Sylhet, 105 for Mymensingh, 75 for Barishal, 125 for Khulna, 109 for Rangpur, and 176 for Rajshahi divisions.

The party will sell its nomination forms till November 21.

AL general secretary Obaidul Quader, Bangladesh ace cricketer Shakib Al Hasan, Prime Minister's adviser for private industry and investment Salman F Rahman, Education Minister Dipu Moni, and Planning Minister MA Mannan among others, were significant persons who bought nomination papers.

Shakib Al Hasan collected AL nomination forms through his personal assistant for three constituencies – Magura 1, Magura 2, and Dhaka 10.

214 people bought AL's nomination forms for Dhaka division, while 201 for Chattogram, 55 for Sylhet, 105 for Mymensingh, 75 for Barishal, 125 for Khulna, 109 for Rangpur, and 176 for Rajshahi.

Besides, two former police officials collected the forms. They are: Abdul Kahar Akand, who was the investigation officer (IO) in

the Bangabandhu murder case, for a constituency of Kishoreganj; and AKM Shahidul Haque, former IGP, for a constituency of Shariatpur.

Police personnel grappled to maintain order at the AL headquarters as the venue was filled with aspirants and their supporters, despite the party's instruction for aspirants to come to the office personally or send their representatives for collecting forms without making any gathering.

Besides, the party introduced online collection and submission of its nomination forms aiming to ease the process.

However, both measures for avoiding overcrowding at the party office fell flat.

Female workers' outflow falls

for Women and Children Studies (CWCS) and Manusher Jonno Foundation and funded by Global Affairs Canada.

It was held at Jatiya Press Club.

According to experts, for the last 10 years, women migration has been within 6-19 percent of the total migration, which shows that the manpower export sector of Bangladesh is largely male dominated.

According to speakers, many of these women workers, who mostly go to the gulf countries, often face physical, mental and sexual abuse, alongside lower salaries than original contract and poor living and healthcare facilities.

These adverse situations often force the women to return to Bangladesh without any proper plan and sufficient compensation, the

speakers also said, adding that social reintegration of these female migrant workers into their communities has remained a challenge in Bangladesh as there is no research-based data about them.

"We don't have reliable data about the returning female migrant workers. We do not know why they are returning, what adverse experiences they went through. They simply blend into the society and we cannot track them afterwards," said Barrister Shameem Haider Patwary, chairperson, Bangladesh Parliamentarians' Caucus on Migration and Development.

"There should be a separate database and budget for the returning female migrant workers to facilitate their reintegration process into the community," he added.

The experts presented a draft policy framework on reintegration of returning female migrant workers in the seminar, which proposed for a separate database on the returning female migrant workers, estimation of remittance earned, financial literacy, decent employment, healthcare and counselling services, and raising awareness to alleviate stigma against these workers.

"Along with economic empowerment, providing psycho-social counselling to the returnees is also very important. These services can decrease the impact of social stigma and help them to find a decent, mainstream livelihood after their return," said Jannatul Firdaus Rupa, assistant director, District Employment and Manpower Office, Dhaka.
