Onion prices did not come down despite raids by the authorities in different wholesale and retail markets across the country

56 aspirants win back candidacy

Fifty-six aspirants got back their candidacy yesterday, winning appeals against cancellation of their candidacy in the January 7 national election.

Of them, one is from the Awami League, three from Trinamool BNP, five from Jatiya Party, and 33 are independents, said the Election Commission in a statement last night.

EC officials rejected 32 appeals and said decisions regarding six others would be made later.

A total of 558 appeals were filed by aspirants. Hearing on the appeals will continue until December 15.

During the last three national elections, reporters were allowed at the hearings. But the EC barred journalists from entering the room during yesterday's 94 hearings.

Some of those who got back their candidacy include AL's Nasirul Islam Khan of Kishoreganj, Bikalpadhara's Mahi B Chowdhury of Munshiganj, Jatiya Party's Talebuzzman of Noakhali, Bangladesh Nationalist Movement's Doly Shaontoni of Pabna, Bangladesh Congress' Ashraful Hossain (Hero Alam) of Bogura, and independent runner Anwar Hossain of Netrakona.

Anwar, a former VC of Jahangirnagar University, said voters in his area were happy that he had won the appeal. Mahi B Chowdhury last night said, "So far, the polling environment is beautiful and competitive."

400 Rohingya refugees land in Indonesia

Dilapidated carrying an estimated Rohingyas arrived Indonesia's Aceh province yesterday, chief of a provincial fishing community has confirmed, adding to a recent surge of Myanmar's Muslim minority arriving in the country.

Prior to yesterday's arrivals, the United Nations' refugee agency (UNHCR) said that 1,200 Rohingya people, a persecuted minority from Myanmar, had landed ashore in Indonesia since November.

Miftah Cut Ade, chief of the fishing community in Aceh, said that two boats landed in the province early yesterday morning, one each in the districts of Pidie and Aceh Besar. Each boat was carrying an estimated 200 Rohingyas, he said.

Andi Susanto, a local military official, said about 180 Rohingyas had landed in Pidie at 4:00 am, and that officers were SEE PAGE 11 COL 5

Mercury may be capable of hosting life under its surface

Mercury may have salt glaciers under its surface, according to a ground-breaking new study that hints at the possibility of the planet closest to the Sun having habitable conditions for some extreme

Research on Earth has revealed previously that some salt compounds can create habitable niches even in some of the harshest environments such as the

arid Atacama Desert in The new study,

published recently in the Planetary Science Journal, hints the possibility subsurface areas on Mercury that may be much more hospitable than its surface.

Such salt glaciers are of "pivotal importance" as they could be signs of volatile compounds such as water, carbon dioxide, and nitrogen on other worlds, say scientists, including Alexis Rodriguez from Nasa's Marshall Space Flight Center.

This finding is "groundbreaking" according to scientists as Mercury is the closest planet to the Sun with extremely hot daytime temperatures and yet it has somehow preserved volatile compounds for "over one billion years."

"Our models strongly affirm that salt flow likely produced these glaciers and that after their emplacement they retained volatiles for over 1 billion years," study co-author Bryan Travis said.
