NATIONAL POLLS Armed forces to be on ground duty from Jan 3

Armed forces will be deployed on the ground for eight days from January 3 to January 10 to perform election duties.

A letter from the Armed Forces Division in this regard reached the Election Commission yesterday.

The 12th national polls will be held on January 7.

the Earlier, home ministry circular issued on December 21 said armed forces personnel will carry out duties for 13 days from December 29 to January

EC Additional Secretary Ashok Kumar Debnath said earlier it was decided that the Armed Forces Division will be deployed from December 29 including the time of their travel from the cantonment to the ground.

The letter mentioned the deployment date on the ground deducting the time of the travel time.

Internet won't be slowed on polls day: EC

The Election Commission will not instruct anyone to slow down the internet speed during the upcoming general polls slated for January 7.

"Why will the internet speed be slowed down?" said Election Commission additional secretary Ashok Kumar Debnath in response to journalists' questions.

The previous EC faced criticism after relevant instructing authorities to slow down mobile internet by shutting 3G and 4G services on polls election day in December 2018.

According to BTRC, there are around 13 crore internet subscribers. Of which, around 9 crores are using 4G internet.

Says DB Wari division about 'torture' of trader in custody

The Wari Division of Detective Branch Dhaka Metropolitan Police yesterday said the allegations against some of its officers of torturing and forcing a man to write a cheque are untrue.

December Jasim Uddin, 51, a trader from Dhaka's Ashkona, filed complaints with the home ministry and DMP Headquarters against four members of the DB Wari team, claiming that they had tortured him in custody and forced him to write a cheque for Tk 3.60 crore.

In a statement yesterday, the Wari DB said Jasim is a fraudster.

A jeweler named, Manas Das, filed a case with Jatrabari Police Station on October 13, accusing Jasim of pretending to be a gold trader and taking Tk 4.10 crore with false promises of supplying him with gold.

36 BNP, Jamaat men jailed over political violence

So far, a total of 183 international observers and 81 foreign journalists have expressed interest in monitoring and

covering the national election, said EC sources.

Information regarding international observers was sent to the home and foreign ministries for vetting, said EC officials.

EC sources said they invited

members and chiefs of election commissions from 34 countries and heads of four associations Organisation of Islamic Cooperation, South Asian Association for Regional Cooperation, the Forum of the Election Management Bodies of South Asia, and the Association of World Election Bodies.
