

Global media and journos played crucial role in 1971

Speakers tell programme commemorating Liberation War

The involvement of the global media and journalistic community played a crucial role during the Liberation War of Bangladesh in 1971, speakers said at an event yesterday.

They praised the professionalism and responsibility demonstrated by the global media in covering the war.

The event was organised by Gonomaddhome Muktiyoddha Poribar, in association with the Liberation War Museum at the museum's seminar hall in capital's Agargaon.

Prof Kaberi Gayen of Dhaka University's mass communication and journalism department mentioned Pakistani journalist Anthony Mascarenhas, who chose to depict the true situation rather than disseminating propaganda.

"He reported on various aspects of war crimes conducted by Pakistani forces. His findings, published under the title 'Genocide' in The Sunday Times on June 13, 1971, played a big role in changing history," she said.

She also noted France Television's journalist Philippe Alfonsi for shedding light on the widespread massacre for global awareness.

Also, renowned media outlets such as The New York Times, Newsweek, The Washington Post, and Time criticised the US policy on Pakistan, she also said, adding that Voice of America, Radio Australia, and Radio Japan played crucial roles too, while BBC emerged as the most reliable and cherished source for news on the war.

Indian newspapers prominently featured the Bangalee people's aspirations for freedom, and Debdulal Bandopadhyay from India's Akashvani radio played a legendary role during the Liberation War, she added.

Freedom fighter, writer, and journalist Harun Habib, Liberation War Museum trustee Mofidul Haque, and daughter of a martyred intellectual Nuzhat Chowdhury, also spoke.

GMP chairperson Mohim Mizan presided over the event.

MEDICAL COLLEGE HOSPITAL IN DINAJPUR

Patients hit hard by rising cost of dialysis

The cost of dialysis at M Abdur Rahim Medical College Hospital in Dinajpur surged due to a lack of supply of medical equipment and medicine, leaving at least 200 patients worried for their lives.

According to hospital sources, the dialysis unit has around 41 dialysis machines, of which 29 are operational. Around 200 patients are registered there and take dialysis regularly.

Protesting the situation, patients staged a protest on Tuesday at the hospital. Patients with acute kidney dysfunction in Dinajpur, Thakurgaon, Panchagarh and Nilphamari are solely reliant on this unit.

Previously, the hospital would provide a majority of the accessories and medicine required for dialysis, such as dialysis filter, bloodline, IV saline, heparin injection, renal fluid A and B. In total, dialysis patients would pay Tk 1,200 for the service along with all of the medicine and accessories provided by the hospital.

Speaking with patients, The Daily Star learned that the hospital authorities are now giving patients only saline worth Tk 20 and syringe worth Tk 7.

As a result, dialysis patients are forced to spend an additional Tk 1,700 out of their pockets to procure all necessary medicine and accessories. This has resulted in

them having to spend Tk 3,000 for each dialysis.

"This has been continuing for the last four months," said one patient, adding, "They even force us to buy hand gloves, syringe and sanitiser now."

Krishna Chandra Roy of Birganj upazila in Dinajpur said he has been on dialysis for the last 12 years. So far, he spent all of his savings to support the dialysis cost. He has to get dialysis 2-3 times a week. Just six months ago, a single dialysis cost him Tk 1,200, but it increased to Tk 3,000 after the hospital authorities stopped supplying the necessary accessories and

medicines gradually.

Similarly, Sudeb Karmaker of Dinajpur town has been on dialysis for the last three years and he is deeply concerned about the implications of the rising cost of dialysis.

"Where will kidney patients like us go?" he questioned.

Contacted, Dr ATM Nuruzzaman, hospital director, said the supply of dialysis accessories and medicines has stopped. They have been trying to procure the necessary materials, but they need time. While they have managed some renal fluid, it is not enough for all patients.

There's corruption in CWasa, but it's less than before: MD

AKM Fazlullah, managing director of Chattogram Water Supply and Sewerage Authority, yesterday admitted to allegations of corruption within his organisation.

"I am not claiming that there is no corruption in CWasa's activities. But it is less than before," Fazlullah said at a mass hearing at the Chattogram Press Club conference room.

"I urge customers to visit me directly regarding corruption. My door is always open," he also said.

Noman Alam Khan, a customer from Khulshi area, alleged that CWasa handed him over Tk 1 lakh bill without supplying water.

Responding to it, Fazlullah said, "We are forced to provide bills against each connection as service charge. We cannot waive bills. However, the customer can disconnect their connections if they don't get water."

Shimul Barua, secretary of the Halishahar Green View Residential Area Co-operative Society, alleged not getting water from CWasa despite several attempts.

"We are still unable to supply water as per demand. But we are taking up another project aiming to fulfill the demand," said the CWasa MD. "CWasa's capacity increased from 12 crore to 56 crore litres in 14 years. Besides, we are also gradually shutting down deep tube wells to hold ground water level," he said in his written statement.

"During dry season, salinity increases and creates a water shortage as we collect water from rivers to supply to customers. However, we are trying to set up a desalination reservoir. Besides, we proposed to the authorities concerned to dredge Kaptai Lake," he added.

Tough battle in two, not much

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substantial public support, according to voters.

"Ruhi was a popular student leader at Ananda Mohan College in Mymensingh. He was the vice president and assistant general secretary of the college's student union, which made him highly popular at that time," said Sharif Uddin, another constituent.

Besides, constituents claimed most of the BNP votes will go in favour of Ruhi as he is a relative of a top BNP leader.

In Netrakona-5, former Jahangirnagar Vice-Chancellor Prof Anwar Hossain is vying as an AL independent against the "boat" candidate Ahmad Hossain.

Prof Anwar is the elder brother of three-time MP and upazila AL President

Waresat Hussain Belal, Bir Pratik.

Voters said Prof Anwar has a clean image in the constituency, but he was absent until recently.

"If he had come to his constituency regularly earlier and his brother Belal, who is quite popular here, was physically well, the race would have been much more competitive," said Abdul Awal Munshi, a resident of the Purbadala area.

At the same time, AL district and local leaders and activists are working for Ahmad, the organising secretary of central AL. He also has a strong vote bank here, said voters.

Despite these factors, there will be a good contest between Anwar and Ahmad, said voters.

Meanwhile, incumbent MP Sajjadul Hassan,

former senior secretary of the Prime Minister's Office and AL nominee from Netrakona-4, has no strong opponent and is likely to secure a smooth run.

His father, late doctor Akhlakul Hossain Ahmed, was a Gono Parishad member and one of the organisers of the Liberation War. Sajjadul's elder brother Obaidul Hassan is the chief justice of the country.

Locals said Shafi Ahmed, a prominent student leader of the 1990s, bought a nomination as an independent candidate to run in the electoral race but was rejected during the scrutiny.

They said if Shafi's candidature had not been rejected, it would have been a tough battle between Shafi and Sajjadul.

The struggling successors

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executive chairperson of Trinamool BNP and daughter of former BNP leader Nazmul Huda, is also in the race but faces challenges in establishing a connection with voters who seemed unfamiliar with her.

The lacklustre campaigns of these two candidates suggest it's going to be an uphill battle for them. Meanwhile, the vibrant and energetic campaigns of the Awami League candidate, Mohiuddin Ahmad, and the independent candidate, Golam Sarwar Kabir, are capturing attention of voters.

Much like elsewhere in the country, the electoral race for Munshiganj-1 is shaping up to be a two-horse race, between AL and "independent" AL.

The constituency, consisting of Sreenagar and Sirajdikhan, was a BNP stronghold. The party won this constituency from 1991 to 2001, until the AL emerged victorious in

2009. The "boat" retained the seat ever since.

Mahi is contesting with his party's symbol "winnowing fan". Voters claimed that Mahi has been absent from the area in his five years as MP, not developing infrastructure or assisting during the pandemic.

"We have not seen our MP for five years. Now, ahead of polls, he is asking for votes," said a Sreenagar resident.

Jalal Uddin, 55, who runs a tea stall in Ichapura union, echoed him.

On his limited campaign trails, Mahi has been highlighting what he claims is the "improvement in the law and order situation during his tenure" as a reason why voters should re-elect him.

Meanwhile, out of 28 unions, Antara has conducted small campaigns in only two out of fourteen unions in Sirajdikhan and two in Sreenagar.

Voters are mostly unaware of her candidacy

and unfamiliar with Trinamool BNP.

"We do not know anything about the Trinamool BNP or its candidate Antara," said Nahar Begum, 65, of Uttar Kolapara village.

Sharmin Begum, a resident of Malkhanagar village of Sirajdikhan, echoed her.

"No one from the 'Golden fibre' (the party's electoral symbol) came to seek votes in our area nor were any posters put up," she told this newspaper.

Contacted, Mahi said he has been campaigning door-to-door peacefully, unlike his AL counterparts.

"I don't like to bring out large rallies and processions. I don't believe in the display of power," he added. He also claimed he is getting a good response from voters.

When asked about his absence during the pandemic, he said, "I got stuck outside Bangladesh due to the lockdown."

"Everyone does not notice when I enter a village

as I don't bring hundreds of motorbikes alongside me," he added.

This correspondent couldn't reach Antara despite repeated attempts.

Meanwhile, most grassroots leaders and activists have rallied behind the AL candidate

Mohiuddin, who is a three-time chairman of Sirajdikhan and upazila AL president for 29 years.

Independent candidate Golam Sarwar, former organising secretary of Dhaka south city AL, is also running an active campaign with "truck" symbol.

Urban poverty on rise

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should be reduced by enhancing self-employment in the villages," he said.

Shishir Shil, secretary general of APPG, said, "Urban poverty is increasing more compared to the villages. After the pandemic, the extent of urban poverty increased further. The number of slum dwellers and homeless people is increasing."

"The poor villagers are getting more benefits from the government's social security programmes. The city's poor people are not getting most of these facilities," he added.

Khushi Kabir, coordinator of Nijera Kori, said, "We should ensure that all people are getting the same benefits. The social safety net programme should be implemented effectively."

Samakal's advisory editor Abu Sayeed Khan presided over the discussion.

Architect Iqbal Habib, ALRD executive director Shamsul Huda, director general of social services department Abu Saleh Mostafa Kamal, and CPD research director Khondaker Golam Moazzem also spoke at the event.

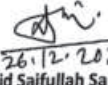
