begin. If my cosplays are fabric-based, my mother helps me with them because I don't know how to sew properly."

"Currently, I am completing my undergrad while doing part-time work, so I can finance my cosplays," adds Anica. "Some of the outfits for my last


few cosplays were store-bought. It is less stressful but I still prefer making my own outfit and props."
