Metro rail workers ecstatic on inauguration day

As the metro rail train started its maiden journey yesterday afternoon, Swadhin Ahmed, a young man, had a wide smile on his face. In fact, it was a day of pride for Swadhin, who had been working for the metro-rail project for three years.

"This is the happiest day of my life. My contributions will remain alive for eternity," he said. "I want to share this dreamy chapter of my life with my children and grandchildren in future."

Not only Swadhin, all the workers were elated on the watershed day in the transport sector of Bangladesh.

"I don't have words to express my feelings. It's beyond everything," said Abdullah Al Noman, in-charge of mechanical work at the fire-fighting department for Uttara North and Agargaon metro stations.

Another worker, Abdul Alim, said that their work would be successful when metro-rail trains start in full swing, as passengers will reach their destination faster and comfortably then.

The country almost came to a standstill during the Covid-19 pandemic. But even then, these workers continued their work.

One of them is civil engineer Mosaddek Hossain. "There were many uncertainties surrounding the construction works, but we kept going," he said.

Not only workers, people from all backgrounds were celebrating the occasion.

MENTAL HEALTH STRATEGIC PLAN

Social movement, govt effort crucial

An inadequate workforce, poor budgetary allocation and lack of awareness have left most (92 to 94 percent) people suffering from mental illnesses without any treatment, said speakers at an event yesterday, citing "National Mental Health Strategic Plan 2020-2030".

To bridge this mental healthcare gap, there is a need for social movement and the government's effort, they said at the dissemination event of the plan.

"We have to bring a change in our attitude [towards mental health]. Any health plan or the health directorate or the ministry cannot do it alone. We need individual and collective effort as

environment for people's mental well-being, which is not the health directorate's job alone."

Dr Helal Uddin Ahmed, associate professor of child, adolescent and family psychiatry at National Institute of Mental Health, presented the action plan at the event.

Highlighting the context, he stated that some 18.4 percent of the adult population and 13 percent of adolescents suffer from mental-health problems. Due to mental illnesses, some 10,000 to 14,000 people have died by suicide in the country.

"However, there are only 350 psychiatrists and 500 psychologists to serve this huge number of people suffering from mental health issues. The

Evaly chair Shamima denied bail, court issues arrest warrant

A Dhaka court yesterday cancelled bail of e-commerce platform Evaly's chairman Shamima Nasrin and issued an arrest warrant against her in a case filed with Gulshan Police Station over embezzlement of Tk 3.1 lakh from a customer.

Earlier that day, the same court framed charges against Nasrin and her husband Mohammad Rassel, also the CEO and Managing Director of Evaly, in the case.

Rassel, now in jail, pleaded not guilty and demanded justice after Dhaka Metropolitan Magistrate Mehed Hasan read out the charges against them.

The magistrate issued the arrest warrant against Shamima Nasrin as she remained absent at the court submitting a time petition through her lawyer.

The magistrate directed officers in charge of Dhamondi and Kafrul police stations to submit by February 18 the progress report on execution of the arrest warrant issued against her.

The court discharged Md Mainul Haque, an employee of the company, from the charges of the case as the court found no evidence to prosecute him.
