

1.10 lakh rural institutions to get broadband by next year

Says Dipu Moni

Education Minister Dipu Moni yesterday said 1.10 lakh rural institutions will be brought under broadband connections through optical fiber cables within the next one year. Of those, 70,000 educational institutions will be given internet connections. At present, 12 crore people in the country remain under broadband internet connections.

Dipu Moni said this while virtually addressing the opening ceremony of a two-day “4th International Conference on Electrical, Computer and Telecommunication and Engineering- 2022” as the chief guest.

Electrical and Computer Engineering (ECE) Faculty at Rajshahi University of Engineering and Technology (RuEt) organised the conference at its auditorium.

Member of University Grants Commission Prof Sazzad Hossain and Managing Director of Bangladesh Hi-tech Park Authority Bikarna Kumar Ghosh also virtually addressed the conference with ECE Faculty Dean Prof Nazrul Islam Mondal in the chair.

Comrade Moni Singh’s 32nd death anniv today

Today is the 32nd death anniversary of Comrade Moni Singh, founder president of Communist Party of Bangladesh (CPB).

He was a member of the advisory council of the Provisional Government of Bangladesh during the Liberation War. Moni Singh, an Independence Award recipient, died on December 31, 1990 at the age of 84.

Marking the day, President Abdul Hamid and Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina issued separate messages.

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Hope for hoolock gibbons

Two rescued primates to be released in forest soon



One baby gibbon and another adult one were rescued in an injured state from different parts of the country recently. Now they're being treated at Moulvibazar's wildlife rescue centre. Once fully recovered, they'll be released into their natural habitats.

On September 26, Cumilla Forest Department personnel rescued a four months old gibbon from a smuggling gang inside a Khulna-bound passenger bus on the Bandarban-Cox's Bazar road.

It was later brought to Jankikhara Wildlife Rescue Center at Lawachhara National Park in Moulvibazar.

Similarly, on December 2, Border Guard Bangladesh personnel rescued an adult gibbon from Khulna and referred it to the Moulvibazar facility.

At first, both the animals were sick. They were not eating properly. But after receiving care from the

specialists and staffers at the centre, they are now recovering, and will be released to their natural habitat soon.

Creative Conservation Alliance's member Chanchal Goala has been caring for the two Hoolock gibbons for a month. The forest department officials also helped him.

He told this correspondent recently that gibbons are mostly fed forest leaves and fruits and are kept in two separate cages.

Rezaul Karim Chowdhury, divisional forest officer, told this correspondent that the gibbons are being fed carrots, bananas, apples and leaves

“They should be kept here for a while. We're observing whether they

are fit to be released into the forest. Once they recover completely, they will be released into the forest,” he said.

Contacted, Nirmal Kumar Paul, Khulna DFO, “BGB rescued the adult gibbon in an abandoned state. It was brought from India and was sick. After giving it primary treatment, we sent the gibbon to the Moulvibazar rescue centre.”

According to the International Union for Conservation of Nature and Natural Resources, gibbons are critically endangered primates in Bangladesh.

They usually eat fruits and lives in tall trees. They need dense natural forests to survive.

Freedom of press, expression can't be curtailed by any law

Law minister tells event

Law Minister Anisul Huq yesterday urged the people of the country to uphold the spirit of the Liberation War to protect the continuation of rule of law.

“All attempts had been made to damage the rule of law in the country for 21 years after August 15, 1975.

However, Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina led governments have established the rule of law by tackling all kinds of ill attempts and conspiracies... all the people irrespective of political ideology and opinion must uphold the spirit of the Liberation War,” he said.

The minister said this while speaking as chief guest at the 36th annual conference of Bangladesh Ain Samity at Kazi Motaahar Hossain Bhaban premises at Dhaka University.

Bangladesh Ain Samity's President AKM Afzal Munir presided over the event where High Court Justice Md Jahanagir Hossain; Law and Justice Division Secretary Md Golam Sarwar; Dhaka University's Law Faculty Dean Dr Seema Zaman and Advocate Mollah Mohammad Abu Kawser, among others, spoke at the event.

Earlier in the day, the minister also addressed the Film Alliance Bangladesh (FAB) Fest, 2022 at Bangla Academy in Dhaka as the chief guest.

He said the Hasina-led government wants to flourish freethought in the country.

Freedom of thoughts must be in place in the laws, which will be formulated by the government, he added.

Anisul said the Digital Security Act has not been made to damage the freedom of expression and press. Freedom of press and expression cannot be curtailed by any law, he added.

Cultural activist Nasiruddin Yousuff Bachchu presided over the event.
