Stay alert against rumours PM urges journos

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina has asked the journalist community to remain alert against rumours and misleading information.

She said this when two delegations of BFUJ and Editors Guild Bangladesh met her at Gono Bhaban yesterday.

Hasina described various measures taken by her government for the development of the journalist community.

She said her government has formed Bangladesh Journalists Welfare Trust by giving the seed money. "If I'm voted to power, I will again donate money to it."

Hasina reiterated her call upon the media house owners to donate to the fund. The journalists forwarded several demands that included forming the 10th wage board in accordance with the

Awami League's election manifesto. BFUJ President Omar Faruque led the delegation. HC defers Fakhrul's bail hearing till next week STAFF CORRESPONDENT

The High C o u r t yesterday deferred till next week the hearing on the rule

regarding BNP Secretary General Mirza Fakhrul Islam Alamgir's bail in a case filed over vandalising the chief justice's residence on October 28.

The HC bench of Justice Md Salim and Justice Shahed Nuruddin passed the order following a time petition by Fakhrul's lawyer Waliur Rahman.

lawyer senior No backed by BNP appeared for Fakhrul as they were observing a court boycott across the country since January 1 on different demands. On December 7 last year, the HC bench issued the rule asking the state to explain in seven days why Fakhrul should not be granted bail. On December 3, Fakhrul filed the bail petition with the HC through his lawyers, saying he was not involved in the vandalism of the chief justice's residence in any manner.

1,970 candidates now vying for 300 seats

EC reinstates candidacy of 77 for upcoming polls

The total number of candidates for the January 7 polls now stands at 1,970 as the Election Commission reinstated the candidature of 77 aspirants until yesterday following the order of the High Court.

The candidates who got back candidacy include three from Awami League and 10 from Ganotantri Party.

As the candidates of Ganotantri Party got back their candidacy, the total number of political parties joining the national polls is now 28.

EC sources said they have also restored the candidacy of two aspirants each from Trinamool BNP, Bangladesh Nationalist Movement, and Jatiya Samajtantrik Dal (Inu), and one each from Bangladesh Krishak Sramik Janata League and Bangladesh Congress, along with 56 independent candidates, EC sources said.

AL candidates who regained candidacy are Enamul Haque Babul from Jashore-4, Abdus Salam from Mymensingh-9, and Shahmim Haque from Faridpur-1.

The EC during the appeal, cancelled the candidature of Babul and Salam on the allegation of loan defaulting, while Shamim's candidacy was cancelled for having dual citizenship.

The EC on December 12 decided to cancel the candidature of all aspirants of the ruling alliance member Ganotantri Party as the party has no commissionapproved central committee.

The party moved to the HC against the decision. The Supreme Court on December 26 ordered the EC to allow the participation of Gonatantri Party in the upcoming 12th parliamentary elections. Meanwhile, 16 political parties, including the major opposition BNP and its allies, are boycotting the upcoming polls, saying a free and fair election is not possible under the current government.

Govt office or campaign headquarters?

Ex-mayor using municipality office for electioneering in Munshiganj-3 STAFF CORRESPONDENT

Independent candidate Mohammad Faisal in Munshiganj-3 has raised eyebrows by using the municipality office for his campaign activities.

Despite regulations prohibiting the use of government establishments like circuit houses, bungalows, or offices for political campaigns, Faisal has been conducting meetings and gatherings at the municipality office, giving instructions to his loyal councillors.

Having previously served as the municipality's mayor for two terms, Faisal resigned from his post on November 28 to participate in the upcoming elections.

On the evening of December 25, this correspondent saw a procession parading through the town's main streets.

Following that, supporters of Faisal returned to the municipality office premises. Four motorcycles with stickers showing Faisal's face and an image of his election symbol -- a pair of "scissors", were parked on its premises.

Faisal then led a gathering where he instructed his supporters to campaign for him actively. The meeting was attended by two ward councillors, where strategies to boost voter turnout were also discussed.

After spending over 30 minutes at the office, the independent candidate took photos with his supporters. Khayrul Islam, ward-1 councillor of Munshiganj

TALKS WITH DMP, DB CHIEFS US team enquires about polls, arrests of BNP leaders

A joint team of US-based National Democratic Institute (NDI) and International Republican Institute (IRI) yesterday held meetings with the Dhaka Metropolitan Police commissioner and Detective Branch chief at their respective offices.

They enquired about security plans for the January 7 national elections and their "actions on opposition leaders".

The meeting between the joint technical assessment team and DMP chief was held around 1:00pm.

While speaking to The Daily Star, DMP Commissioner Habibur Rahman said the joint team members enquired on how the election is going to be conducted, the security surrounding polls, security arrangement taken for the candidates and whether any of them complained about the election and if so, how their complaints have been addressed.

They also enquired about security measures for women, and whether there is any possibility of violence.

"They asked these kinds of questions, one after another, and we replied to every one of them. We told them that police are working with utmost professionalism and there is no scope for raising questions about it. I think they were satisfied with our answers," said the DMP chief. The NDI-IRI joint delegation included Natasha Rothchild, mission coordinator; Ivaylo Pentchev, information environment analyst; Mariam Tabatadze, gender and inclusion analyst; Crispin Kaheru, security and state response analyst, and Nenad Marinkovic, security and physical violence analyst. One more dies of dengue staff correspondent

The dengue death toll rose to two this year as the country witnessed one more death in the last 24 hours, according to the Directorate General of

Health Services. A total of 70 new infections were reported during this period, taking the number of cases this year to 215. At least 561 dengue

At least 501 deligue patients are still under treatment at different hospitals across the country, 259 of whom are from Dhaka. Meanwhile, 379 patients, including 114 from Dhaka, have already been released.

Last year, the country witnessed 1,705 dengue deaths while 3,21,179 cases of the mosquito-borne disease were reported.
