Dhaka air 'very unhealthy'

Dhaka again topped the list of cities worldwide with the worst air quality with an AQI score of 271 at 8:50am yesterday morning.

Dhaka's air was classified as "very unhealthy", posing serious health risks to residents, according to the air

India's Kolkata, Delhi and China's Wuhan occupied the second, third and fourth spots on the list, with AQI scores of 244, 231 and 231 respectively.

When the AQI value for particle pollution is between 101 and 150, air quality is considered "unhealthy for sensitive groups", between 150 and 200 is "unhealthy", between 201 and 300 is said to be "very unhealthy", while a reading of 301+ is considered

The AQI, an index for reporting daily air quality, informs people how clean or polluted the air of a certain city is and what associated health effects might be a concern for them.

The AQI in Bangladesh is based on five pollutants: particulate matter (PM10 and PM2.5), NO2, CO, SO2, and

2 heavyweights lose to AL independents

The constituencies of Rangpur-1 and Dinajpur-1 saw two heavyweight candidates, also incumbent lawmakers, embrace defeat against two grassroots Awami League leaders who contested the polls independently.

Rangpur-1 (Gangachhara upazila and wards 1-8 of Rangpur City Corporation), former Jatiyo Party secretary general and three-time lawmaker Moshiur Rahman Ranga contested independently this time.

JP fielded Hossain Mokbul Shariar Asif, nephew of the party's founder late HM Ershad, as its candidate from the seat after ruling Awami League left the seat to JP.

However, Asaduzzaman Babul, general secretary of Gangachhara upazila AL unit who contested independently, won by a big margin.

Babul bagged 73,927 votes, while Ranga got 24,332 and Asif managed only 10,892 votes, according to Election Commission.

Asif went on to lose his security deposit as well.

Of the 3,32,219 eligible voters from the seat, a total 1,14,847 voters cast their ballots on Sunday.

In Dinajpur-1 (Birganj and Kaharol), candidate and incumbent lawmaker Manoranjan Shil Gopal lost against independent aspirant Md upazila AL unit, in a close contest.

Mostly 'free and fair' but lacked festivity

Say invited foreign observers; urge EC to take action against those involved in polls violence

A section of foreign observers yesterday Bangladesh Election the Commission to take strong steps against those involved in electoral violence.

They said the polls were largely free, fair and peaceful, but noted that the abstinence of campaigning from some political parties and non-participation of a major political party made the national polls on January 7 less festive.

The Awami League won the polls that were boycotted by the BNP and its allies.

During their visit, they inspected around 30 polling centers in Dhaka and its vicinity, and claimed to have observed long queues of men and women without any reported obstacles or intimidation.

However, Syed Ali suggested that political party members should refrain from being in or around polling centers to ensure voters cast their ballots without

POLLS DAY CLASH Cops sue 15 BNP leaders, 200 others in Ctg

Police yesterday filed a case against 15 BNP leaders and 200 unidentified individuals in connection with clashes with law enforcement during Sunday's national election in the port city's Chandgaon. Jahidul Kabir, officer-in-charge of Chandgaon

Police Station, told The Daily Star, "We filed a case accusing 215 persons, naming 15 BNP leaders with the police station. We are trying to identify those who led the clash."

The clash erupted between police and BNP members at Sarafat Ullah Petrol Pump in Chandgaon around 9:15am when a group of party activists attempted to block Arakan Road in support of their countrywide hartal.

Subsequently, the demonstrators attacked the police multiple times when law enforcement tried



to disperse them. At that point, the police opened fire to bring the situation under control.

The activists launched another attack at 11:00am when border guards joined the police to

The clash resurfaced in the Moulavipukurpar area at 12:30pm when BNP members targeted a Rab vehicle with projectiles. The confrontation spread to the nearby Tejbazar area.

HC issues rule over hajj package

The High Court yesterday issued a rule asking the government to explain in two weeks why the current hajj package that allegedly fixed excessive costs for the pilgrims should not be declared illegal.

In the rule, the court asked the authorities concerned to show causes why they should not be directed to allow all the international airlines operating in Bangladesh to carry the pilgrims at a competitive fare price.

The bench of Justice Mustafa Zaman Islam and Justice Md Atabullah issued the rule following a writ petition filed by Ashraf-Uz-Zaman, a Supreme Court lawyer and chief coordinator of the Al-Quran Study Centre, challenging the hajj package, Assistant Attorney General Md Selim Azad told The Daily Star.

Writ petitioner Ashraf-Uz-Zaman told this correspondent that the religious affairs ministry on November 8 last year issued a notification fixing the hajj package for the pilgrims, which unreasonable and beyond the reach of general people.
