## **Double celebration** for Awami League

Party holds rally marking Bangabandhu's Homecoming Day, election victory

The Awami League's win on January vesterday's rally transformed Bangabandhu's commemorating Homecoming Day, into a double celebration for party leaders and activists.

Thousands of supporters of AL and its affiliated groups gathered at Suhrawardy Udyan, turning the rally into a festival.

Shahriar Hasan, an AL activist of Naraynganj, said, "This year's Homecoming Day celebration couldn't be more perfect."

As soon as the entryways opened at 1:30pm, the AL men started entering the Suhrawardy Udyan, carrying colourful placards and donning vibrant dresses.

"Braving all the odds, Sheikh Hasina and the Awami League came out victorious in the January 7 election," Mahbub Hasan, a Jubo League activist who came from Savar, told The Daily Star.

Many of these activists carried cut-outs and portraits of Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman and Sheikh Hasina.

AL supporters and activists created lively atmosphere with drums, loudspeakers, and other musical instruments, while some danced and sang.

As she went up to the stage, the crowd welcomed her by waving the national and party flags. The AL supremo also waved back at them. The elderly people were also seen in the rally that was mainly dominated by young activists. Take the case of 65-year-old

Rapid Action Battalion claimed to have arrested 349 teenagers and members associated with teen gangs, for various offenses across the country over the past year.

Teen gangs in the capital first made headlines in 2017, after 14-year-old school student Adnan Kabir was beaten to death in Uttara, by boys his age.

The release added that the DFP is taking action legal against dissemination of the misinformation through social media using this list.

According the to government policy, the DFP regularly updates and publishes the media list on its official website, www.dfp.gov.bd, stated the release.

"The list is not published on any online or social media platforms other than the official Department of Films and Publications website," the release said.

The press release also urged everyone to exercise caution regarding such lists.

'The government thinks they won't fall. They are desperately trying to suppress the opposition parties because of this," he added. The BNP leader criticised the "voter-

less election" on January 7, saying "the world did not applaud it".

'Many people did not cast ballots because they supported the opposition movement," said Rizvi.

He also said law enforcers arrested more than 27,460 leaders and activists in 1,172 cases across the country from October 28 until yesterday afternoon.

BNP also claimed that 40 party leaders and activists were detained and two cases were filed against 135 named and many unidentified party activists in the 24 hours preceding yesterday afternoon.

travel documents -- places the Bangladeshi passport at 97th position, down one place from the last quarter of 2023.

The latest edition of the Passport Index, published on Tuesday, features a total of 104 spots with some countries'

passports sharing the same ranking. Bangladesh ranked 97th on the index, sharing the spot with North Korea. The ranking is based on the number of destinations passport holders can access without a prior visa.

According to the index, a Bangladeshi passport entitles visa-free travel to 42 destinations.

In South Asia, the Bangladeshi passport fared better compared to that of Nepal (98), Pakistan (101) and Afghanistan (104).

Maldives' passport ranked at 58, becoming the strongest in South Asia with visa-free access to 94 countries. India, Bhutan and Sri Lanka's passports ranked at 80th, 87th and 96th respectively.

An unprecedented six countries share the top spot for the most desirable travel documents in 2024.

Citizens of France, Germany, Italy, Japan, Singapore, and Spain now have access to visa-free or visa-on-arrival entry to 194 destinations worldwide. Apart from those six countries who share the top spot, other countries sharing the top 5 SEE PAGE 4 COL 4
