# 11 power plants mostly sat idle last fiscal

PDB bought electricity from them at high rates

At least 15 percent of the country's 71 independent power producers were sitting idle for 80 percent of the time last fiscal year, raising questions about their need.

Bangladesh Power Development Board purchased electricity from the mostly idle power plants at rates much higher than the average purchase price of Tk 14.62 per kilowatt-hour (kWh).

The power plants that are sitting idle 80 percent of the time are: Raj Lanka Power, Summit Barisal Power, Bangla Trac Power Unit-1, Bangla Trac Power Unit-2, Aggreko Energy Solution Aowrahati, Aggreko Brahmangoan, APR Energy, United Mymensingh Power, Paramount Btrac Energy, BR Powergen Ltd, and United Payra Power.

If a power plant produces electricity at 50 percent or 60 percent plant load factor, it produces more electricity over the year and that impacts the total cost.

The purchase price from the 11 power plants was between Tk 26.08 per kWh to Tk 56.33 per kWh.

"The reason behind the excessive unit cost is that the power plants were sitting idle," said Mohammad Tamim, dean of the chemical and material engineering department at the Bangladesh University of Engineering and Technology.

Every power plant has a fixed cost including capacity charge, staff salaries and bank loans, while their variable cost is the fuel cost, which it gets from the government.

The unit price is calculated by dividing the total cost by the total electricity output.

"If a power plant produces electricity at 50 percent or 60 percent plant load factor (PLF), it produces more electricity over the year and that impacts the total cost," he said.

the commerce ministry alone cannot control inflation, he said, adding that all sectors will have to work together.

At the commerce ministry, State Minister Ahsanul Islam Titu at a briefing said whoever tries to create artificial crises -- be it the producers, importers or hoarders -- will be prosecuted.

#### No arsonists, masterminds will be spared

**Says Hasina**

Prime Minister Sheikh yesterday said arsonists and masterminds would be given exemplary punishment so



that nobody is burnt to death in future.

"We are taking measures against the arsonists and their masters," she said while addressing a post-election greeting and views-exchange meeting with the leaders and activists of Kotalipara Awami League and its associate bodies at Kotalipara Upazila Chattar.

Hasina, also the AL president, said many of those involved in the arson and their masters have already been brought to book and the rest must be detained after scrutinising the CCTV footage.

"None of those who have done such heinous acts will be spared.'

The PM came down heavily on the BNP-Jamaat, saying that their movement means burning people to death and torching vehicles, including buses and trains.

A mother with her child on her lap had been burnt to death in a fire on a train, Hasina said, adding that no one could tolerate such a scene.

"They are doing movement for democracy despite the fact that they even don't know how to spell the democracy."

The premier said that by casting ballots spontaneously, the country's people did not respond to BNP-Jamaat's call to prevent the election.

After forming the government for a  $record fifth \, term \, and \, fourth \, in \, a \, row, Hasina$ went to Gopalganj to visit her Tungipara-Kotalipara constituency to pay homage to
