300 Myanmar soldiers flee to India after rebel gains

AFP, GUWAHATI

300 Myanmar soldiers crossed the border into India to flee an advance by armed insurgents fighting the country's junta, an Indian paramilitary officer told AFP yesterday.

Clashes have rocked parts of Myanmar near the Indian border since the Arakan Army (AA) attacked security forces in November, ending a ceasefire that had largely held since a

2021 military coup.

This week, the group said it had taken over the major town of Paletwa and six military bases along the border of India's Mizoram state, where the soldiers had crossed on Wednesday.

A total of 276 troops carrying their arms and ammunition arrived at Bondukbangsora village, an officer from the Assam Rifles paramilitary force, who declined to give a name,

"We have given them shelter at our camp," he said, adding that the arriving soldiers were "given all the support they require".

The officer said that his unit was collecting biometric data from the soldiers and had sought approval from the defence ministry in New Delhi to return them to Myanmar.

Two Myanmar military aircraft arrived in Aizawl, the Mizoram state capital, to collect and repatriate soldiers who retreated from the conflict.

In October, an alliance of the AA and two other ethnic minority armed groups launched a joint offensive across Myanmar's northern Shan state, capturing towns and seizing vital trade hubs on the China border.

Last week, the alliance announced a China-mediated ceasefire in Shan state after months of conflict that posed the biggest threat to the junta since it seized power.

The agreement does not apply to areas near the Indian border where insurgents has raged on.

US ship hit in Gulf of Aden attack

Say Houthis as US launches fresh strikes on rebel targets in Yemen

Yemen's Houthi rebels claimed another attack on a US ship early yesterday, after the United States launched fresh strikes on rebel targets over their aggression towards vessels in and around the Red Sea.

rebels the Iran-backed maintained they had struck the commercial vessel in the Gulf of Aden, the US military later said the group's missiles had missed their mark.

The Houthis said in a statement posted to social media that their "naval forces... carried out a targeting operation against an American ship" -- identified as the Chem Ranger -- "with several appropriate naval missiles, resulting in direct hits".

It did not give a time nor other details for the latest attack in international shipping

The US military's Central Command, which is responsible for the Middle East, said the Houthis "launched two anti-ship ballistic missiles at M/V Chem Ranger, a Marshall Island-flagged, US-Owned, Greekoperated tanker" on Thursday night.

"The crew observed the missiles impact the water near the ship. There were no British bomb, the less willing the Houthis reported injuries or damage to the ship the command said on social media told reporters in Moscow.

Meanwhile, a senior Houthi official has promised safe passage for Russian and Chinese vessels through the Red Sea.

In an interview published by Russian outlet Izvestia yesterday, senior Houthi official Mohammed al-Bukhaiti insisted the waters around Yemen, which some shipping firms are avoiding due to the ongoing aggression, were safe so long as vessels were not linked to certain countries, particularly Israel.

And Beijing yesterday emphasised the area was an "important international trade route for goods and energy".

"We call for an end to the harassment of civilian vessels, in order to maintain the smooth flow of global production and supply chains and the international trade order," foreign ministry spokesperson Mao

Russia said on Thursday the United States should halt its strikes against the Houthis to aid a diplomatic resolution to the attacks on merchant vessels.

"The most important thing now is to stop the aggression against Yemen, because the more the Americans and the are to talk," Foreign Minister Sergei Lavrov

N Korea tests underwater nuclear drone

Slams US-led joint drills

North Korea has conducted a test of its underwater nuclear weapons system in a protest against this week's joint military drills by South Korea, the United States and Japan, state media KCNA said yesterday.

The test of the "Haeil-5-23" system, a name North Korea has given to its nuclear-capable underwater attack drones, was carried out by the defence ministry's think tank in the waters off its east coast, the report said, without specifying a date.

The ministry's unnamed spokesman accused the United States, South Korea and Japan of "getting frantic" with military exercises, warning of "catastrophic consequences."

"Our army's underwater nukebased countering posture is being further rounded off and its various maritime and underwater responsive actions will continue to deter the hostile military manoeuvres of the navies of the US and its allies," the North Korean ministry spokesman said in a statement according to

Three-year-old boy drowns in pond

A three-year-old boy drowned in a pond in Chaubaria village under Kaliganj upazila of Satkhira vesterday.

Ibrahim Hossain was the son of Oman expatriate Shariful Islam, who returned home a week back to the village under Bharashimla union.

The victim's family said the boy was playing in their yard after having breakfast in the morning. The child fell into the water body in the absence

of family members. At one stage of a frantic search that followed the discovery that he was missing, the body was spotted floating in the pond. He was taken to Upazila Health Complex, where physicians declared him dead on arrival.

Confirming the matter, Kaliganj Police Station Officer-in-Charge (OC) Md Shaheen said an unnatural death case was lodged in this connection.

Man beaten to death in B'baria

A man was beaten to death allegedly by some neighbours on suspicion of stealing a tube well in Sarail upazila of Brahmanbaria on Thursday night.

Zahidul Islam Porosh, 21, of Noagaon village in the upazila died while he was undergoing treatment at Brahmanbaria General Hospital, said Mohammad Emranul Islam, officer-in-charge of Sarail Police Station.

The victim's family alleged that a tube well was stolen from their neighbour Alamgir Mia's house two days ago. Suspecting that Zahidul was involved in the theft, some neighbours beat him up.

The body has been sent for autopsy. The OC said they are investigating the incident.

Anti-polio worker shot dead in northwest **Pakistan**

An anti-polio worker was shot dead in northwestern Pakistan yesterday, police said, accusing Islamist militants who frequently target vaccination teams of being behind the attack.

Pakistan and Afghanistan are the only countries where polio, a debilitating virus which can cause lifelong disability, remains endemic.

Pockets of Pakistan's mountainous border regions remain resistant to inoculation, with some firebrand clerics declaring it un-Islamic and militants such as the Pakistani Taliban staging attacks on vaccine teams.

Police said an anti-polio worker on routine duty in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province's Bajaur district abutting the Afghan border -- was shot in the head by "unidentified persons".

"The attackers successfully fled on a motorcycle," senior police officer Kashif Zulfiqar told AFP, adding the coordinator was evacuated by helicopter to the provincial capital Peshawar but died in hospital. He called the attack "an act of militancy" and

said police are "conducting further investigations".

Port city reels from abrupt gas outage

Ali Abbas, a resident of Alkaran area, said when the gas supply stopped on Thursday morning, they thought it was the usual problem that they had been facing since October.

"But when the supply halted at 9:00pm after a brief resumption, we thought something was wrong." Regretting that the authorities

hardly look into their plight, he said, "We pay fixed monthly bills for gas, but we don't have the supply."
