One more dies of dengue

Another dengue patient died while 32 others were hospitalised in the last 24 hours till yesterday morning.

With this, the total number of deaths and cases this year rose to 14 and 853 respectively, according to the Directorate General of Health Services (DGHS).

A total of 148 dengue patients are still undergoing treatment at different hospitals across the country.

Among the total cases, 691 dengue patients have already been released.

Last year, the country witnessed 1,705 dengue-related deaths and a total of 3,21,179 reported cases.

'We're not desperate for recognition'

Says Quader

Awami League General Secretary Obaidul Quader yesterday said the government is not waiting to be recognised by other countries.

"There's no reason to think that the elected government is in such a desperate situation that they are waiting like a Chatok bird for someone's recognition," said Quader when asked how significant it is to be recognised by other countries.

He was briefing journalists at the AL president's political office in the capital's Dhanmondi.

"Recognising or congratulating [new government] has become a diplomatic custom. When a new prime minister or president is elected, other countries, especially amicable ones, congratulate," said Quader.

He also criticised BNP for its activities.

10 MARKETS PURCHASED 40 YEARS AGO

City corporations owe Rajuk Tk 302cr

Forty years ago, Dhaka City Corporation bought the Gulshan Shopping Complex Market from Rajuk for Tk 6.45 crore. The market now falls under the jurisdiction of Dhaka North City Corporation.

Despite numerous benefits enjoyed by the market shops over the years, the city corporation has never paid Rajuk for it. This is not an isolated case, as Rajuk sold a total of nine markets to Dhaka City Corporation for Tk 27.37 crore in 1983.

Rajuk says it now owes more than Tk 302 crore (including interests) from Dhaka North and South city corporations.

This information comes from an audit report of Comptroller and Auditor General of Bangladesh (CAG) on Rajuk for the financial year 2018-19.

This newspaper has recently obtained a copy of the report.

Despite numerous letters from Rajuk urging the city corporations to settle the outstanding amount, there has been no resolution to date.

Rajuk sources reveal that the markets

DSCC EVICTION DRIVE

Two cops hurt in clash with traders

Two police personnel including an inspector were injured in a clash with traders during an eviction drive in Dhaka's Khilgaon area yesterday.

The incident took place around 2:00pm when the police personnel were assisting Dhaka South City Corporation to carry out the drive at Khilgaon Kitchen Market.

Of the injured, Mehedi Hasan, 24, a constable of Public Order Management (East Division), was admitted to Dhaka Medical College Hospital with pellet injuries while inspector (operations) of Shahjahanpur Police Station Mahidul Islam was admitted to Central Police Hospital, Dhaka with head injuries, police said.

Sujit Kumar Saha, officer-in-charge of Shahjahanpur Police Station, said police went there to provide security during the drive.

As the members of law enforcers reached there, some people became agitated and started throwing brickbats at them. Many threw brick chips from the rooftops of the nearby buildings.

The law enforcers then fired shotgun shells and charged tear gas canisters to disperse them.

Mahidul was injured being hit by a brick chunk, he said.

The OC said they suspected that the shotgun pellets hit the constable's leg when police fired shots to disperse the crowd.

A DSCC official said they carried out the drive to evict the illegal kitchen market.

Apart from the traders, some outsiders took part in the attack, he alleged.

Bangladesh now has over 12.17cr voters

EC says in latest draft

The Election Commission yesterday said the total number of voters in the country now stands at 12,17,75,450, as per the latest draft update.

EC's Assistant Director Arshadul Huq said there are 6,20,90,137 male, 5,96,84,389 female and 924 hijra voters in the updated voter list.

Of them, there are 20,86,161 new voters -- 13,20,396 male, 7,65,690 female and 75 hijras.

According to the voter list act, the draft voter list is published on January 2 every year. However, the commission could not do so this year due to the 12th parliamentary election held on January 7.

This list will be in every upazila and thana election office of the country while objections regarding inclusion of foreigners, deceased individuals, and fake names in the draft list can be lodged there.

After disposal of objections, the EC will publish the final updated list on March 2 while the next upazila election will be held according to this list.



'Taqseem earned his position as Wasa MD'

Says LGRD minister

157 foreigners in country's jails even after serving time

Md Sajjad Hossain, a 45-year-old resident of Tripura, India, finds himself in a Bangladeshi prison for nearly two decades, despite completing his initial jail sentence.

On November 6, 2003, the First-Class Magistrate of Cognizance Court in Khagrachhari sentenced Sajjad to six months imprisonment and fined him Tk 500 in a case filed under the Bangladesh Control of Entry Act, 1952.

His jail sentence was effective from March 14, 2003 and ended on September 28, 2003. But he is still languishing behind bars in a Feni jail for reasons unknown.

This is the story of one man, but it echoes the plight of 156 others -- serving time in Bangladeshi prisons long after their sentences ended.

These findings were disclosed in a report prepared by the office of inspector general (IG), Prisons, in accordance with a High Court order.

Of the detained foreign nationals, 150 are from India, five from Myanmar, and one each from Pakistan and Nepal, it said.

The office of IG Prisons sent the report to the attorney general's office on January 18 for submission before the HC.

Deputy Attorney General Amit Das Gupta, who received the compliance report, told this newspaper yesterday that the office of IG Prisons has not mentioned details in the report as to why foreign nationals could not be repatriated after serving sentences.
