Two killed under wheels of trains

Two people — including an army man — were killed as trains ran them over on Joydevpur-Bangabandhu Bridge rail track in Tangail yesterday.

In Kalihati, Fakhrul Islam, 20, from Koralia Tatwapara village was hit by a Dhaka-bound train "Banalata Express" in Dhalatengor area, said police.

The accident occurred when Fakhrul, a soldier at Bogura Cantonment, got down from a bus on Bangabandhu Bridge east link road amid dense fog, said Mosharaf Hossain, sub-inspector of Bangabandhu Bridge East Police Station.

In Sadar upazila, Abul Kalam, 42, from Atia village in Delduar died on the spot as another train hit him in Poila area, said Ali Akbar, in charge of Gharinda Railway Police Outpost.

Hospitals overrun with patients amid cold snap

The recent cold wave has led to a surge in diarrhoea and pneumonia cases across Brahmanbaria district.

As of 3:00pm yesterday, 41 diarrhoea patients were admitted at the Brahmanbaria General Hospital's designated ward for the disease, against its capacity of 20 beds. Of the admitted, 25 were children.

"It's hard to find a place even on the floor for my three-year-old Jamiya and one-and-a-half-year-old Jannat," said Marufa Akter from Naroi village, who admitted the girls at the hospital three days ago.

48 patients, including 21 with pneumonia, had been admitted to the hospital's children's ward until yesterday afternoon.

Meanwhile, patients at the hospital's outdoor unit have tripled since yesterday noon.

The situation is mirrored in other health complexes and private hospitals across Brahmanbaria.

One Md Lukman said he had to purchase



medical items from the market for his eight-and-a-half-month-old son Arman at high prices, as the hospital did not provide any.

Hospital Superintendent Dr Mohammad Wahiduzzaman attributed the spike in diarrhoea cases to Rotavirus.

The virus is mostly active in winter. However, there is nothing to fear as proper treatment ensures full recovery, he said.

He refuted the allegations of insufficient medical supplies.

20 more get hospitalised with dengue

Twenty dengue patients were hospitalised in the last 24 hours till yesterday morning, seven of whom are from Dhaka.

With the new cases, the total number of cases this year rose to 927, according to the Directorate General of Health Services (DGHS).

A total of 132 dengue patients are still undergoing treatment at different hospitals across the country.

Last year, the country witnessed 1705 dengue-related deaths and a total of 321,179 reported cases. September was the deadliest month for the dengue outbreak, with 396 fatalities and 79,598 cases, according to DGHS data.

Subsequently, entomologists asked the authorities concerned to take necessary steps to control Aedes mosquitoes since the beginning of this year.

Farah Kabir, country director at ActionAid Bangladesh, said, "It is now crucial to build a platform that brings different people together, sparks new ideas, and focuses on what the community can do to address climate change."

At the third session, titled "Development, Inclusion, and Resilience," three papers were presented on impacts of salinity on reproductive health, drinking water, and the impacts of mega development projects on socio-economic and environmental factors in the country.

Ashrafi Binte Akram from Hajee Mohammad Danesh Science and Technology University and Marzia Islam from Dhaka University highlighted in their papers that women in coastal areas endure diverse challenges such as gender-based violence, mental and financial issues, and various diseases caused by salinity.

Abul Kalam Azad,

manager of Just Energy Transition at ActionAid Bangladesh, said in his paper that communities in coastal areas face livelihood and land losses due to mega projects.

He emphasised the necessity of sufficient financial support for their recovery.

FROM PAGE 3 Himel's mother Tahura Haque filed a general diary with Uttara West Police Station on the same day after she could not reach him over phone.

In the meantime, the kidnapers called from an Indian number and demanded Tk 2 crore as ransom from the mother. They also sent her videos of them torturing Himel.

Later, the abductors threatened to kill Himel if the mother did not pay Tk 30 lakh. DB's Lalbagh Division then began a shadow investigation and conducted multiple

raids in Haluaghat and Dhubaura of Mymensingh, Durgapur and Kalmakanda of Netrokona, and Tanguar Haor area in Tahirpur.

The DB also engaged Meghalaya Police in India to conduct raids in hilly areas of Khasi Hills district.

An abduction case was then filed with Uttara West police station.

The first breakthrough of the case came when police detained two women from Turag area, who are the wives of two of the kidnapers, leading to the arrests of perpetrators and rescue of the victim.

UK to focus on democracy, human rights

British envoy calls on foreign minister

The UK will continue to engage constructively with Bangladesh government and political parties on democracy and human rights issues, said British High Commissioner Sarah Cooke yesterday.

"The UK came up with a statement on January 8 after the elections, which spoke of democracy and human rights. We will continue to engage constructively with the government and political parties on these issues," she told journalists after her courtesy call on Foreign Minister Hasan Mahmud at the ministry.

Following the elections, the UK Foreign, Commonwealth, and Development Office issued a statement saying that the standards of credible, open, and fair competition were not consistently met during the election period.

"The issue of human rights is an issue in many countries. This was not discussed in detail with Sarah Cooke," said Hasan Mahmud. "We will work together with the UK," he added.

He said they discussed multidimensional aspects of relations with the UK, including deepening relations on climate change and supporting Bangladesh in solving the Rohingya crisis.

He said they also spoke about trade in the areas of ICT, cyber security, and improving financial management.

On extraditing Tarique Rahman, Hasan Mahmud said the government will do everything possible in this regard at an appropriate time. However, whether he will be extradited depends on the UK government, he added.
