
### **PREVENTING GAZA GENOCIDE** Dhaka welcomes **ICJ** order DIPLOMATIC CORRESPONDENT

Bangladesh has welcomed the International Court of Justice order to take action to prevent the acts of genocide committed by Israel against the Palestinians as the country wages an offensive in the Gaza Strip.

It also promised support to South Africa, which filed an appeal with the top UN Court, alleging that Israel was committing genocide against the Palestinians.

"We welcome the ICJ order in the context of South Africa's appeal. We already supported the South African case," said Foreign Minister Hasan Mahmud yesterday after a meeting with a delegation of five British parliamentarians.

"We believe the ICJ order will help prevent genocide or crimes against humanity, if committed, against the Palestinians,' he said.

### **DEATH IN BSF FIRING BNP** demands **UN probe**

BNP yesterday demanded a UN-supervised investigation into the killing of a Border Guard Bangladesh soldier by Indian Border Security Force along Benapole border area of Jashore.

In a statement, BNP condemned the killing and raised questions about the "sovereignty and independence of Bangladesh".

After the incident, BSF issued a statement, wing the victim, BGB sepov Mohammad

chief of banned outfit Ansarullah Bangla Team, started planning for sabotage activities in full swing.

The Counter Terrorism and Transnational Crime (CTTC) unit revealed this based on findings

after interrogating ABT member Niamul Islam Towfiq, 26, who was arrested in Uttara on January 22 evening in a case filed with Uttara Pashchim Police Station.

ABT is an Al-Qaeda-inspired militant outfit now known as Ansar al Islam, which was banned on March 1, 2017 for attacks on war crimes trial campaigners, secularists, and LGBT rights activists.

Interrogated, Towfiq admitted that he was inspired to become a militant and join Ansar Al Islam after listening to speeches of Rahmani and watching online content.

### Bangabazar a shell of its old self this winter Traders struggle to bounce back from last April's fire

Winter is here, but Bangabazar wears an unusual look.

The once lively centre of apparel trading in Dhaka's south, which was synonymous to shopping for winter clothing for many, is now a shell of what it used to be. Traders in the market, once the biggest shopping place for cheap apparels, have witnessed a steep decline in their sales after a catastrophic fire burned almost 6,000 shops to ashes in April, 2023.

The market used to be abuzz with activity during this time every year, as many retail shoppers as well as buyers from around Dhaka and other districts came to purchase winter clothes. With the market burnt down, the traders are now selling their items in a makeshift market.

The hustle and bustle of the Bangabazar of old, however, is not being replicated at this makeshift market. Things remain eerily calm. In the quietness, SEE PAGE 4 COL 4
