Politically influential gang continues to raze red hillocks in Tangail

Once what were beautiful hillocks of red earth, are now barren lands.

The Sal and Gajari trees which used to adorn the place, have also disappeared.

The red earth hillocks, locally known as "Tila" or "Chala," that once dotted the Madhupur Garh region from Gazipur to Tangail districts have been gradually destroyed over the years.

'He was not offered teaching contract for vandalism' **Says BRAC University** on Asif Mahtab

BRAC University yesterday said the recent act of tearing pages of a textbook published by the government, included in the national curriculum for students enrolled in 7th grade in schools, and asking others to do the same in a public forum, is an act of vandalism, a behaviour not supported by

The University considers any act of vandalism towards national property as unacceptable behavior and does not tolerate or support such activities," it said in a statement.

The university, therefore, cannot offer a parttime teaching contract to Asif Mahtab Utsha for the Spring 2024 semester. However, the university will compensate Asif Mahtab Utsha for his time and efforts towards his preparatory work for Spring 2024.

BRAC University believes, like all great institutions of higher education, its role should be to create space for all views to be discussed and debated constructively, predicated on tolerance and respect. The university believes in the exchange of ideas through dialogue, the statement said.

BRAC University respects and fully complies with the country's constitution and laws on all matters. Accordingly, it does not promote homosexuality as has been alleged by some quarters in various social media content. However, the university believes in equal rights and opportunities for every single human being to realise their potential, it added.



No EPZ on cropland

Says Sultana Kamal at Gaibandha rally

The ongoing land acquisition process for the Rangpur EPZ at the Santal Palli under Gaibandha's Gobindaganj upazila should be stopped immediately, said eminent rights activist Sultana Kamal vesterday.

She was speaking at a rally held in Katarmor area of the upazila.

The rally was organised by Sahebganj-Bagda Farm Bhumi Uddhar Sangram Committee, Jatiya Adivasi Parishad, ALRD, Adivasi-Bengali Parishad and Gaibandha Samagik Sangram Parishad.

"No structures should be built on any cropland. This is our state policy. Even the prime minister has repeatedly said this to protect cropland. We are also demanding the same. There is no ambiguity," she said.

"Three Santal men died to save their land. Their families are yet to get justice. How can we say a pro-liberation party is ruling the country, if they are still being denied of justice?" she asked.

"We want to remind them [the government] that they have been in power for a long time by talking about the Liberation War ethos. It is their responsibility to improve the fate of the backward people," she said.

She said a separate commission for the plainland indigenous community should be formed. "We expect this from the pro-liberation government," Sultana Kamal added.

Philimon Baske, president of Sahebganj-Bagda Farm Bhumi Unddhar Sangram Committee, presided over the rally.

Ctg airport health official held with four gold bars

Customs officials yesterday arrested a health officer of Chattogram airport and recovered four gold bars from his possession.

The arrestee, MZA Sharif, works at the Emergency Medical Services Department of the airport, said Assistant Commissioner of Custom House Alif Rahman Nirvul. To smuggle the gold, the doctor allegedly used

the VIP channel pretending to provide emergency medical care to one of the passengers, Md Alauddin, of a flight arriving from the UAE, he said.

Based on a tip-off, customs officials monitored the doctor's moves for the past few days and arrested him yesterday.

"Legal action is being taken against the passenger and the doctor," he said.

Following the incident, Sharif got suspended and the DGHS formed a two-member probe committee to investigate the incident, said officials.
