Remarkable Records at **SANS**

>> The stadium hosted its first T20I, between Bangladesh and Zimbabwe, on 28 Nov 2006, with the match being the first T20I for the Bangladesh team and also the first T20I to take place in Bangladesh. The hosts won the match by 43 runs.

>> Bangladesh won three T20Is and lost two T2Bangladesh have a 100 percent win record in ODIs at this venue, winning all four of the matches quite comfortably. The last ODI, in 2012, resulted in a 160-run win for the Tigers against the West Indies -- a record for Bangladesh at the time.

>> Bangladesh played three Tests at this venue, winning one, losing one and drawing the other.

>> In the first Test at this venue in 2012, Abul Hasan became only the second cricketer to score a century on debut as a number 10 batter. He scored 100 off 113 balls.

>> During the 2nd Test at this venue in 2014, Shakib Al Hasan became only the third cricketer in the world to take 10 wickets or more and score a century in a same Test, after Ian Botham and Imran Khan. He achieved this feat against Zimbabwe, scoring 137 runs and taking 10 wickets.

>>> Bangladesh drew their last Test at this venue in 2015 against Pakistan, with Tamim Igbal scoring his first double century (206), the highest individual score by a Bangladeshi batter in Tests at that time. Bangladesh posted 556/6 in the second innings - their highest at that time and the opening partnership of 312 runs between Tamim (206) and Imrul Kayes (150) was a record too.

■ WHAT BCB HAS TO SAY ■



The BCB can't work on infrastructural issues of stadiums, that jurisdiction lies with the NSC. The BCB is only allowed to use the stadiums. The Sheikh Abu Naser Stadium is in a dilapidated state. We used to have international cricket there and also have sweet memories at the venue. The Shahid Kamruzzaman Stadium in Rajshahi is also in a similar state. We have carried out digital surveys in both stadiums. These focused on indoor and outdoor facilities, centring indoor turfs and wickets. It has been said from different quarters that if we don't have practice facilities all over the country, we will not be able to improve our standard of cricket.

We have had the A team, under-19 teams, both men's and women's teams play at those venues, and other domestic matches have taken place there; then why can't we have international cricket there?

We are in desperate need of stadiums. There are plenty of stadiums but the real problem is with maintenance being done in those venues, we can't really put them to use. It is, however, not easy to maintain over 60 stadiums across the country. I don't think the other facilities in terms of hotels and airports are the biggest issues at this moment.
