'JU failed to take measures against sexual violence'

UGC forms 3-member committee

University Grants Commission has formed a probe body to review actions taken by Jahangirnagar University authorities over the rape of a woman inside the campus.

The three-member committee will also look into why such a heinous crime took place, according to a press release issued by UGC yesterday.

UGC Chairman (Additional Charge) Prof Muhammad Alamgir informed about the committee formation during a workshop on grievance redressal mechanism and GRS software, states the release signed by Shamsul Arefin, director of Department of Public Relations and Right to Information of UGC.

The press release did not include the names of the committee members.

The members are scheduled to visit JU campus today. The JU authorities have failed to take visible and effective measures against sexual violence and other misdeeds, he said about the recent incident of rape.

"It is necessary to investigate why such incidents are happening in this university and take immediate action," he added.

It is also necessary to look into how JU is admitting students without ensuring their residential facilities and how non-students are staying inside the campus day after day, the chairman also opined.

Six people, including at least four members of JU Chhatra League of Jahangirnagar University, raped or abetted the rape of a woman on the campus on Saturday night after confining her husband to Mir Mosharraf Hossain Hall. Four of them were arrested on Sunday.

Govt unable to curb road accidents

Admits Quader, says won't allow anymore Rohingyas to enter country

Road Transport and Bridges Minister Obaidul Quader vesterday admitted the government's failure to control the growing number of road crashes and deaths in the country.

"We are unable to control the growing number of road accidents and deaths," Quader said at a press briefing following his meeting with a delegation of World Bank at Setu Bhaban regarding a road safety project jointly funded by WB and the government.

also expressed discontent over the progress of the Tk 4,988 crore project jointly implemented by Roads and Highways Department, Bangladesh Road Transport Authority, Bangladesh Police, and Directorate General of Health Services.

The government took the project in May last year, as road safety issues have become a major concern with thousands of people getting killed or maimed every year. Among several components,

it will pilot comprehensive road safety measures, including improved engineering designs, road signs and markings, pedestrian facilities, speed enforcement, and emergency care from Gazipur to Elenga and Natore-Nawabganj highways.

The project will also undertake road safety pilots in selected urban areas and district roads. It will improve post-crash care, which is critical in saving lives, and will also set up an ambulance service via a toll-free number and upgrade emergency care services in selected district

AL sells 1,332 nominations in two days

The Awami League has sold a total of 1,332 nomination forms for reserved seats for women in the 12th Jatiya Sangsad in two days since

The party has generated a revenue of Tk 6.66 crore from the sale of nomination forms so far.

It sold 810 forms on Tuesday and another 522 forms yesterday, said AL office secretary Barrister Biplab Barua yesterday at the party's Bangabandhu Avenue central office.

AL started selling the nomination papers at its central office from 10:00am on Tuesday, and will continue till tomorrow.

Earlier, the 62 independent MPs have given AL President and Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina the power to elect members of the reserved seats on their behalf. It means AL can place 48 MPs in reserved seats, while Jatiyo Party will have two.

On the second day, a total of 167 nominations were sold in Dhaka division, 78 in Chattogram, 22 in Sylhet, 60 in Rangpur, 36 in Barishal, 68 in Khulna, 44 in Rajshahi, and 47 in Mymensingh.

Over five lakh posts vacant in govt offices

Public admin minister tells JS

Public Administration Minister Farhad Hossain yesterday in parliament said there are around 5.33 lakh vacancies across different departments of the government.

The minister said this while responding to a query from Awami League MP Mamunur Rashid Kiran from According to "Statistics of Civil Officers and

Staff-2020", the total number of posts in various government departments is 19,13,502, meaning more than one-fourth of the total posts are vacant.

In a written reply, the minister said, according to the Public Administration's latest document titled "Statistics of Government Servants 2022," there are 5.33 lakh vacancies in the posts of officers and employees of all ministries, departments and directorates.

Meanwhile, appointments took place for 3.58 lakh posts between 2019 and 2023, the minister also said. He also said the regular process of filling the vacancies is ongoing as per the rules.

In view of the needs of various ministries, along with departments and agencies under them, the vacancies in ninth grade (previously first class) and 10th to 12th grade (previously second class) are filled through the Public Service Commission.

According to the instructions of prime minister, the recruitment process is ongoing in the ministries and departments, he said
