



Plan to phase out fossil fuel-burning power plants

CPD urges govt, recommends abolishing the quick enhancement of electricity act

The Centre for Policy Dialogue yesterday recommended abolishing the Quick Enhancement of Electricity and Energy Supply (Special Provision) Act 2010 and making proper plans to phase out fossil fuel based power plants.

CPD Research Director Khondaker Golam Moazzem said since last year, a persistent energy crisis has been hampering power generation and affecting other sectors.

"The uncertainty seems to persist this year as well due to the underlying importance given to the imported fuel in the integrated energy and power

Private university enrolment looking up

Private universities are seeing enrolments for their undergraduate and postgraduate courses picking up after a drop during the pandemic.

In 2022, which is the latest available data from the University Grants Commission, 38.2 percent of the 240,406 seats available in the 110 private universities were vacant, the lowest in five years. Enrolments too were the highest since 2018.

Between 2018 and 2021, 60.8 percent of the seats available in private universities were vacant on average.

The ruling Awami League yesterday unveiled the list of 48 nominees for seats reserved for women in the House. Thirty-three new faces have made the cut.

Among the 14 other nominees, seven were lawmakers in the reserved seats in the last parliament while the rest were MPs in previous parliaments.

AL General Secretary Obaidul Quader announced the names of the nominees at a press briefing at the Gono Bhaban after the party's Parliamentary Nomination Board held a meeting.

He said the AL will submit the list of nominees to the returning officer on February 18.
