6 academic buildings in dire need of repair

The academic buildings of the lone educational institution for girls in Barguna's Amtali upazila are in a dilapidated state, leaving its 420 students compelled to attend classes amid risks.

Established in 1965 by local educationist Mofiz Uddin on Bangabandhu Road in the upazila, Amtali MU Girls Pilot Secondary School has six academic buildings constructed between 1966 and 2002.

Over the years, lack of repairs and maintenance eventually led to their present sorry state.

Visiting the school recently, this correspondent observed cracks on the buildings' walls and ceilings, while

The academic buildings of Amtali MU Girls Pilot Secondary School, the lone educational institution for girls in Barguna's Amtali upazila, lies in a dilapidated state due to lack of repairs and maintenance. All 420 of its

students have no choice but to attend classes amid risks.

According to locals, the school transforms into a drug den after sunset, as there is nothing barring unscrupulous people from entering.

"We are attending classes amid fear of the buildings collapsing at any time," said Naushin Akhtar, a 10th-grader at the school. "During monsoon, rainwater leaks

through the roof, making it uncomfortable for everyone to attend classes," mentioned

Tashlima Alam, an 8th-grader. Shah Alam Kabir, head teacher of the

school, said, "All six buildings of the school have become unsuitable for academic activities. We requested higher authorities several times for steps in this regard, but to no avail."

Muhammad Ashraful Alam, UNO of Amtali upazila, said, "Considering the safety of students, initiatives are being taken to renovate the academic buildings of the school."

Contacted, Jasim Uddin, secondary education officer in Barguna district, said, "Recommendations for the construction of new school buildings have been sent to the higher authorities.

Fire breaks out at Wari restaurant

A fire that broke out at a restaurant's kitchen in Dhaka's Wari area yesterday night was brought under control within half an hour, said fire service officials.

Being informed of a fire at 10:15pm, five fire engines went to the spot shortly after 10:30pm and brought the blaze under control, Anwarul warehouse inspector of Fire Service and Civil Defence.

Due to traffic on the road, the fire engines took a little longer to reach the destination. The flame was doused using fire extinguishers, he added. He also said that no casualties were reported.

The cause behind the fire could not be known immediately, said the fire service official.

A girl has stopped going to school for the last three days after a group of stalkers assaulted her in Chauhali, Sirajganj recently.

Meanwhile, one of the alleged stalkers was accorded floral reception by the ruling Awami League men after he was released on bail in a case filed over the stalking.

The family of the ninth-grader said some local youths used to stalk her on the way to and from school. "The stalkers assaulted my daughter on February 27 while she was returning from school," said her father.

"On information, I rushed to the spot for rescue. But the stalkers also assaulted me," he added.

Afterwards, the father filed a case accusing seven people.

The girl's father said, "My daughter stopped going to school since the incident. Rashed is the leader of the group. We have been threatened after Rashed was arrested. Now, we are more worried as Rashed has been released... We are passing days amid insecurity."

Contacted, Rashed denied the allegation of his involvement in any such incident of harassment.

"I have become a victim of conspiracy. I placed all necessary proofs before the court defending myself... As the court was convinced, I got bail,' Rashed told The Daily Star.

Contacted, Enayetpur Police Station Officer-in-Charge Md Abdur Razzak said police have nothing to do if a court grants bail to any accused. However, police will ensure security of the girl

and her family, the OC said.

Crab fishing season begins

After a two-month hiatus during the breeding season of crabs, fishermen set sail once more in various rivers and canals of the Sundarbans to resume their crab catching

They set forth after receiving permission from the Forest Department.

The ban, which lasted from January 1 to the end of February, aimed to protect the crab population and ensure sustainable harvesting practices.

Nirmal Kumar Mondal, officer of Kashiabad Forest Station in West Sundarbans, said that crab fishing is prohibited throughout the year in 30 designated canals, declared as sanctuaries, and less than 25 feet wide canals in the Sundarbans. However, in other rivers and canals, approximately

15,000 fishermen -- armed with valid pass-permits -- earn a living by catching crabs. Since the implementation of the crab export policy in

1998, crab fishing pass-permits have been suspended for two months every year. With the ban lifted yesterday, fishermen are now

allowed to resume their activities.

Nirapada Munda, of Koyra-6, has been catching crabs for over 30 years. During the ban, he was forced to sit idly by. Like him, over 70 families of Munda communities of Koyra struggled to make ends meet during this ban.

Police yesterday recovered the body of a man from Dhaleshwari river in the Malirpathar area of Panchsar union of Munshiganj Sadar upazila. The deceased was

identified as Mohammad Kamal Hossain, 43, of West Kamargram area of Boalmari Municipality in Faridpur.

Locals called 999 after spotting the body floating on the river around 12:30pm.

On information, a team from the Muktarpur Naval Police outpost went to the spot and recovered the body. The body was sent to Munshiganj General Hospital morgue for an autopsy.

Sajjad Karim Khan, in charge of Muktarpur Naval Police Station, said, "There is no sign of injury on the body of the victim. The man appears to have died a couple of days ago."
