## 'Old, but still not out'

Fortune Barishal's Mushfiqur Rahim on Wednesday quipped about his side being labelled as the 'team of elderlies' after the Tamim Iqbal-led side, also including veteran Mahmudullah Riyad, cemented their spot in the final of the 10th edition of the Bangladesh Premier League.

After their six-wicket win over defending champions Comilla Victorians in the final in Mirpur yesterday, Tamim underlined the importance of the old guard in the 20-over format as he pointed out how the experience of the trio that has an average age of 36 came into play in crunch situations.

"(We are) Old, but still not out," Tamim interrupted Mushfiqur when the wicket-keeper batter was asked during the post-match presentation ceremony how it felt to still have the fighting spirit despite all three of them now being considered veterans of the game.

Although unusual, Tamim called up Mushfiqur and Mahmudullah to join him in the captain's post-match interview and heaped praise on them.

"I would love to dedicate this trophy to them [Mushfiqur Rahim and Mahmudullah Riyad]," Tamim said upon arriving at the interview booth. "They haven't won it (before). Mushy did a massive job in the field and looked after the team really well. I mainly concentrated on who will come and who will play. He made the field changes and it is Mushy's trophy. Because I was named the captain, I get the credit but it's really important to say the right thing."

## 'Team environment' key in Barishal's triumph

Tamim Iqbal put the exclamation point on what was a statement season for him in the Bangladesh Premier League (BPL) by leading Fortune Barishal to their maiden title yesterday, but instead of basking in the glory, chose to redirect all praise to the team environment and his teammates.

This year's BPL in many ways was a test for the veteran batter after not taking part in last year's ODI World Cup and the 34-year-old stepped up to the challenge, scoring 492 runs to finish as the tournament's highest run-getter and also being named the player-of-the-tournament.

Under his leadership, Barishal recovered from winning just one of their first four matches to finish third in the league stage and then defeated all three title contenders in the playoff stage to win the coveted trophy.

After the win, Tamim said it was Barishal's excellent team environment that helped them recover from the early stutter, an environment which he himself helped create.

"What I wanted was to create a very good team environment. Our team

environment was unbelievable and everyone's contribution, including the overseas stars, was important. They are great players but they are also good human beings. There was doubt, even amongst us, about whether we would qualify but just because of the team environment, we were able to do it," Tamim said.

The opener also said that at no

brought in and dedicated the trophy to Mushfiqur and Mahmudullah Riyad.

"The two seniors Riyad bhai and Mushfiqur, who have served the country for so, so long but hadn't won this trophy. I felt that if we get this trophy, I will dedicate it to them," said the Barishal captain at the press conference.

He praised Saifuddin, who was a late inclusion in the Barishal squad, for holding his nerve in that final over of the Comilla Victorians innings, where he conceded just seven runs bowling to Andre Russell, four of which came from extras.

Player-of-the-final Kyle Mayers, another mid-season inclusion, was another key figure in Barishal's triumph and so was left-arm spinner Taijul Islam, whose economy rate was 5.65 throughout the tournament.

But for Tamim, the main ingredient behind Barishal's triumph was creating a team environment where everyone was united and played their role.

"I didn't want to come into an environment where everyone is not together. Creating the right environment was the biggest challenge. If you ask me why we won that trophy, it's because we created that environment where everyone played a part and they were happy for each other."

Tamim said that he had left many of the on-field decisions up to Mushfiqur Rahim while he was more focused on off-field issues like which foreign players could be

## Can Abahani stop spirited Mariners?

Star-studded Abahani will look for improved performance to regain the title of Club Cup hockey tournament when they square off against reigning champions Dhaka Mariner Youngs Club in the final at the Maulana Bhasani Hockey Stadium today.

The game kicks off at 5:00pm. Despite being the top team on paper, national player-studded Abahani could not prove their mettle in the last three matches even though they won all of those matches, including a hard-fought 3-2 win over Mohammedan in the semifinals.

The Sky Blues will definitely look to up their game against a spirited Mariners, who stormed into the final with a massive 8-4 win over Usha KC. Mariners showed fantastic performance in all three previous matches and are considered as favourites to win back-to-back titles.

It is also going to be a repeat of the last edition final held three years ago when Mariners won 3-0 to claim their first-ever club cup title.

"The key to our strength is the fitness of the players as well as a good understanding among the local and the foreign players. We are playing with good combination, good passing, attacking and defending throughout the matches," Mariners coach Mamunur Rashid told The Daily Star after the team's final preparation.

"If we can carry our natural performance in the final, we will have a good chance of winning the match. We will definitely focus on team game instead of individual performances and that is what

I've told the players today (Friday)," said the former hockey player, who also praised his opposition for their defensive and attacking prowess.

Abahani coach Hedayetullah Islam Razib admitted that his charges could not perform well in the previous matches but he is optimistic for an improved performance in the final.

"Mariners have been performing well which we are not being able to do. We are lacking cohesion among the foreign and the local players. Besides, we

are also not getting proper service in midfield as the players have just come back from injuries," Razib told The Daily Star.

"We made some mistakes in the match against Mohammedan as there is always nerves during Abahani-Mohammedan matches. Having rectified those mistakes, the boys are expected to perform well against Mariners," said Razib, who however believes if the local players perform well, they will have a good chance to win the final.

The foreign players have been playing key roles in deciding the fate of the matches for both teams. Mariners' Indian recruits have outperformed Abahani's Indians and the final might also turn out to be a battle between the foreigners.
