

Newspaper employees seek 10th wage board

The Bangladesh Federal Union of Newspaper Press Workers, and Bangladesh Newspaper Workers Federation yesterday strongly demanded formation of the 10th wage board for journalists, employees and workers in the newspaper industry.

The demand was made from a joint meeting of the two federations at the Bangladesh Sangbad Sangstha (BSS) Employees Union's office in the capital to cope with the increased prices of essentials, said a press release.

Bangladesh Newspaper Workers Federation President Motiur Rahman Talukdar presided over the meeting while Bangladesh Federal Union of Newspaper Press Works President Md Alamgir Hossain Khan, Bangladesh Newspaper Workers Federation Secretary General Md Khairul Islam, Press Workers Federation Secretary General Mushtaq Ahmad, Senior Vice President Maksudul Ahsan, and Vice President Md Farooq Ahmed Bhuiyan, among others, were present.

Atia Afreen passes away

Atia Afreen, a communication professional and former programme manager of Transparency International Bangladesh, passed away yesterday after battling lung cancer for the last three years. She was 46.

She breathed her last at 9:35am at her residence in the capital's Bashundhara residential area, said her husband Abdullah Al Mamun, former senior reporter of The Daily Star, and general manager of Association of Mobile Telecom Operators of Bangladesh. She is survived by her husband, a son, and a daughter.

A champion (singer) of BTV's defunct Notun Kuri show, Afreen completed bachelor's and master's degrees from Jahangirnagar University. She was buried at Borkotpur graveyard in Badda after the Zohr prayers.

More than just a restaurant

A single mother's story of resilience

Passing by the River View High School in Thakurgaon town, a lot of eateries will come into sight. However, one that is often seen abuzz with customers is "Amena Hotel".

Visiting the place recently, this correspondent came across an elderly woman, probably in her sixties, tending to her customers with a smile on her face.

"My husband abandoned me and my child, and remarried. My son was only seven days old at that time," said Amena from Awliarhat village in Lalmonirhat's Pathgram upazila, who started the business about a decade ago, aiming to provide quality food to day labourers for low prices.

After she was left on a road by her in-laws, Amena first took up work at a construction site. Unable to continue, she set up a small makeshift tea-stall, investing just Tk 50 in 1998.

With time, this stall became Amena

Hotel, a place where the needy come after daylong work.

"I started business to provide for my child. A neighbour offered to babysit my boy for Tk 5 per day," said Amena.



Her restaurant, open from morning till afternoon, now sees a daily sale of around Tk 30,000.

Through her income, she has also been able to buy a small land in the district

town's Tikiapara area, building a tinshed house to shelter herself and her family -- her son, daughter-in-law and two grandchildren.

"Since joining the River View Business Management College in 1996, I saw Amena working hard to support her family. She is a strong woman," said Mazedur Rahman, assistant teacher of the school.

Various types of bhortas and many other items, including duck, mutton, chicken and fish, are available there for a reasonable price, said Ariful Islam, a regular customer at the restaurant.

"The food is good and the price is reasonable. So me and my colleagues often come here for lunch, especially during weekdays," he added.

Nazira Akhter Shopna, councillor in the municipality, said, "Amena is a successful woman who managed to become independent through hard work and diligence. She is an inspiration for other women in the area."

Fishermen allege irregularities in rice distribution

Allegations of irregularities have emerged against Kuakata Municipality of Patuakhali regarding distribution of rice among fishermen who refrained from catching hilsa fries (jatka).

Many fishermen alleged that while they were supposed to be given 80 kilogrammes of rice for the two months of ban against catching hilsa, they received 40-50 kg instead.

Some complained that they did not even get any rice despite being enlisted as fishermen under the municipality, while people from other professions got rice in their place due to nepotism.

The rice distribution took place on Monday, March 11, on Kuakata Municipality office premises in presence of its mayor Anwar Howladar.

"We make a living by fishing in the sea round the year. During ban on fishing we find it very difficult to remain afloat. I am an enlisted fisherman, and I went to the municipality for rice allocated for us. But I did not get any, instead people from other professions, including van drivers and grocers, got rice as they are relatives of the councilors. We have been wronged," said Abdullah, a fisherman from Ward-1.

"I heard that the government allocated 80kg of rice for each of us. But I have been given 50kg. How will my family survive on 50 kg rice for two months?" said fisherman Abdus Salam of Ward-4.

Fisherman Tofazzal of Ward-3 echoed him.

Contacted, Kuakata municipality mayor Anwar Howladar said, "There are 1,300 registered fishermen in my area, but the allocation of rice came for 800 fishermen. That's why some of them didn't get it."

"The matter is being investigated. Legal action will be taken if the allegations of irregularities in distribution of rice are found to be true," said Kalapara UNO Jahangit Hossain.

"Additionally, the implementation of the mid-day meal programme, which is already in the planning, should be expedited to provide essential nutrition to students," she added.

Didarul Alam Khan Mahub, chairman of Arjuna Union Parishad, said, "As the embankment is at risk due to illegal sand lifting, the areas are at risk of erosion during the monsoon. I have raised the matter in the upazila

parishad's monthly meeting, but no steps have yet been taken."

Sajjad Hossain, executive engineer of BWDB in Tangail, said, "If complaint regarding illegal sand extraction from Jamuna is received, the district and upazila administrations as well as the police administration will take action."

Jahidur Rahman, UNO of Bhuapur, said, "Mobile courts are conducted regularly to stop illegal sand extraction. However, nothing was found during the drives, as the culprits operate at night."

Exploited and trapped

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Hosne Ara, Shofiql's wife, said, "The company who took him to Malaysia told us that he could earn Tk 80,000-90,000 per month. That is why we took a loan of Tk 5 lakh with high interest to send him to Malaysia. However, they did not provide him with any job for the last five months."

She mentioned that they had to send approximately Tk 20,000 to Malaysia for him every month for food expenses since the company didn't even provide him with meals.

"My husband never

mentioned any health issues while in Bangladesh. His passing must have been a result of the stress from being unemployed for the last five months there. He couldn't bear the possibility of coming back home empty-handed," she said.

"My father-in-law is bedridden due to old-age complications. My brother-in-law is a day-labourer. Now there is no hope left for us. How will I run my family, and raise my two children?" Hosne Ara asked.

Shofiql's sister Bristy Khatun, who is also a former expatriate worker

in Saudi Arabia, said, "After waiting for four long months, he was supposed to be provided with a job on February 12. However, he was not employed even as the date passed by. He got increasingly restless as each day passed by."
