Abul Mansur Ahmad's death anniv today

Today is the 45th death anniversary of Abul Mansur Ahmad, a renowned litterateur, and politician of the subcontinent. He died in 1979.

One of the greatest Bangla satirists of literature, he was also a pioneer of modern and progressive journalism. He worked for prominent newspapers such Krishak, Nabajug, Sultan, and Mohammadi, and was editor of the Kolkatabased Daily Ittehad from 1946 to 1948.

He wrote about the language issue from early 1940s and contributed to the Language Movement as

"The pirates often follow international media like BBC and CNN and come to know what the hijacked ship's authority is saying to the media, and their responses to those comments might reflect on how they treat the ship's crew," said former Master Captain Farid.

Farid was captain of MV Jahan Moni, a Bangladeshi ship that was hijacked by Somali pirates in the Arabian Sea on December 5, 2010.

With his 25 crew members, along with the wife of the ship's chief officer, who was on board the ship, Captain Farid endured 100 haunting days of being held hostage by the pirates.

Pirates yet to make contact

Six days have passed since the hijacking of the Bangladeshflagged cargo ship MV Abdullah, yet no contact has been made by the suspected Somali pirates till yesterday.

The ship, with 23 Bangladeshi members on board, was located around four nautical miles off the Godobjiraan coast of Somalia.

It remained anchored at the same location for two days, according to the ship's owning firm, KSRM Group.

There was communication with the crewmen in the last two days, said KSRM

PSTU teacher remains suspended after protesting corruption in teachers' recruitment

A teacher at Patuakhali Science and recruitment and the student's death. Technology University (PSTU) has remained suspended for around 10 Mehedi on May 28 last year on months for the "crime" of speaking disciplinary ground, although there against university authorities regarding irregularities in teachers'

Mehedi Hasan, a professor at the language and communication department, was suspended in May last year for "circulating posters tarnishing the image of university authorities".

Kumar Bose, alleging their involvement in corruption regarding teacher

The university authorities suspended was no proof till now that it was indeed Mehedi who put up such posters.

Meanwhile, in a complaint letter to Mehedi on June 14, it was stated that he was distributing posters and spreading provocative and offensive remarks about the administration.

The suspension was also attributed to his failure to publish articles in peerreviewed journals and to pursue further degrees within his initial two years as a professor.

Prof Mehedi said, "I have been protesting against irregularities of the university authority for many years. I was vocal about the student's death and corruption in teacher's recruitment. So they framed and suspended me." "I
