Extend Eid holidays by two days

Demands Jatri Kalyan Samity for safer travels

Around 1.60 crore people will leave the capital and adjacent districts ahead of the Eid-ul-Fitr this year, estimated Bangladesh Jatri Kalyan Samity.

The organisation warned that without proper management of public transport, the Eid journey for such a large number of people could become disastrous.

The Samity requested the government to declare April 8 and 9 as holidays to extend the Eid vacation, aiming to facilitate smoother journeys for people returning home.

Samity's Secretary General Mozammel Hoque Chowdhury made the observation at a press conference at the Dhaka Reporters Unity yesterday.

Mozammel, speaking to this correspondent, explained their estimates were based on media reports, toll plaza data, and mobile SIM data from the last Eid-ul-Fitr. They projected approximately 1 crore departures from Dhaka, 40 lakh from Gazipur, 12 lakh from Narayanganj, and 8 lakh from nearby districts before Eid. Their projections indicated that 30 lakh would travel by buses and minibuses, 4 lakh by train, 35 lakh by personal cars, 12 lakh by bikes, 60 lakh by launch, and 1 lakh by air. Roughly 18 lakh would resort to illegal methods such as riding on train rooftops or traveling on trucks and goods-laden vehicles, they estimated.

He also demanded that authorities take steps to stop private buses and launch operators overcharging passengers during the Eid rush and stop operations of unfit and illegal vehicles on highways.

'Dr Yunus wasn't awarded by Unesco'

Claims edu minister STAFF CORRESPONDENT

Education Minister Mohibul Hassan Chowdhoury yesterday

said Unesco did not give Nobel Laureate Muhammad Professor Yunus any award called

"Tree of Peace". He made the remark while speaking to reporters at the Secretariat.

Mohibul Hassan, also the chairperson of Bangladesh National Commission for Unesco (BNCU), said, "Dr Yunus was conferred the 'Tree of Peace' award by an Israeli sculptor, upon invitation from the Ganjavi Foundation in Azerbaijan."

The minister said Yunus has been claiming he received the award from Unesco, which is "untrue."

Meanwhile, BNCU in separate statement yesterday echoed the minister.

PSC seeks more pays and perks for chairman, members

Draft law sent to public administration ministry

The Public Service Commission wants to upgrade the statuses and salaries of its chairperson to that of a Supreme Court's Appellate Division judge and its members to those of High Court judges.

remuneration and privileges are similar to the high court judges, the draft stated. cabinet secretary and its members' are similar to a secretary.

In a draft law titled "Bangladesh Public Service Commission Chairman and Members (Status, Dignity, Remuneration and Privileges) Act 2023", the PSC also made proposals for full time official transport, a furnished residence free of rent, municipal taxes and electricity, water and gas bills.

It sent the draft law to amend the existing "The Members of the Bangladesh Public Service Commission (Terms and Conditions of Service) Act, 1974" to accommodate the

PSC Chairman Sohorab Hossain said the draft law proposal was sent to the public administration ministry. "The ministry concerned will be able to give further information."

Rationalising the changes in the draft, PSC said both the Election Commission and PSC are constitutional bodies and Article 139(2) of the Constitution says, "The chairman and

other members of such commissions shall not be removed from office except in like manner and on the like grounds as a Judge of the [Supreme Court]".

The Chief Election Commissioner enjoys the salary and facilities of a judge of the Appellate Division and other election commissioners Currently, the PSC chairman's also get the remuneration and privileges of

> But if the proposals are considered, it would increase the cost of the government when it has taken various austerity measures. It would also encourage others [to make similar proposals], so it's better not to consider such a proposal at this time.

On the other hand, Sohorab said, officials of the National Human Rights Commission, Anti-Corruption Commission and Information Commission, which are not constitutional bodies, are also getting similar salaries and facilities.

The PSC in the draft said the status and remuneration of its chairman and members should be similar to that of other constitutional statutory commissions.

"Changes are needed in the law to eliminate the disparity of pay and perks between the post holders of constitutional bodies," the draft said.

PSC recruits Bangladesh Civil Service cadre officers as well as non-cadre officials and can have 6 to 15 members. At least half of the members must be persons who have held offices in government service for at least 20 years. Normally, the chairman and members who come from government services are senior officers and those from outside are mostly senior academicians. Currently, there are 15 members.

A judge of the Appellate Division gets Tk 1,05,000 and a judge of the High Court gets Tk 95,000 as monthly basic salary.

The cabinet secretary's monthly basic salary is Tk 82,000 while a secretary draws Tk 78,000 per month.

The PSC proposal sought a special allowance per month at the rate of 50 percent of PSC chairman and members' salaries. It also proposed two festival allowances and Bangla New Year allowances. The PSC chairman and members are currently not entitled to these

PAHELA BAISHAKH Actions against propaganda Says home ministry

Legal actions will be taken against those spreading propaganda about the Bangla New Year on social media, according to a statement issued by the home ministry yesterday.

Besides, all celebrations must end by 6:00pm, and playing the "vuvuzela" flute will be banned.

The decision was taken at the law-and-order meeting at the Secretariat ahead of the Bangla New Year celebrations. Home Minister Asaduzzaman Khan Kamal presided over the meeting. The district administration, district police, and

organisers will ensure security at various events including Pahela Baishakh celebrations, Baishakhi Mela, and sports and cultural events across the country through coordination. Dog squads will be used at important places

including Ramna Batamul, Ramna Park, Suhrawardy Udyan, Dhaka University, Hatirjheel, and Rabindra Sarobar. There will be special surveillance of the necessary forces and intelligence agencies from law enforcement agencies, reads the statement.

Besides, necessary security will be ensured on the premises of Bangla Academy.

During the New Year, special security will be provided to important areas and installations including diplomatic areas. During the New Year celebrations, there will be fire service teams with fire fighting vehicles and ambulances at important points in Dhaka city and across the country.
