3 Myanmar soldiers take refuge in Bandarban

Three members of Myanmar military took refuge in Bangladesh last morning, fleeing the ongoing conflict in Rakhine State between junta forces and rebel Arakan Army.

On information, Border Guard Bangladesh members disarmed them and sheltered them in a safe place in Naikhongchhari upazila of Bandarban, according to the local administration.

The Myanmar army personnel fled through Tumbru Konapara border under Ghumdhum union of Naikhongchhari upazila in Bandarban early yesterday.

Confirming the matter, Naikhongchhari Upazila Nirbahi Officer Mohammad Zakaria said the Myanmar army personnel are now under the custody of BGB.

Shafiqul Islam, member of Ward 1 of Ghumdhum Union Parishad, said, fighting between the Myanmar junta and Arakan Army continued across the SEE PAGE 7 COL 1

Test train reaches Jashore from Bhanga in an hour Commercial operation within four months

Laying of the main railway line from Bhanga to Jashore has already been completed and the authorities are carrying out different tests on this section with an aim to open the entire Dhaka-Jashore line for commercial operation within four months.

Once the 169km Dhaka-Jashore route is fully operational, it will halve the travel time from the capital to Jashore. It now takes more than eight hours to travel the distance on rail.

As part of tests, the authorities of the Padma Bridge Rail Link Project yesterday operated passenger and freight trains on the 87km section Bhanga to Rupdia of Jashore.



the Padma Bridge was opened in October last year. Several intercity trains now use the route.

"We are hopeful that the Bhanga-Jashore section would be ready for train operation by June," Project Director Afzal Hossain told The Daily Star yesterday.

The government is implementing a Tk 39,246.80 crore project, the iggest infrastructure

with Jashore via the Padma Bridge. The rail line will reduce the Dhaka-Jashore travel distance by more than 185km, and Dhaka-Khulna by 212km, shows a project document.

Besides, opening of the line will reduce the pressure on Joydebpur-Ishwardi section via the Bangabandhu Bridge. There are speed and load restrictions on Bangabandhu Bridge.

Currently, trains from Dhaka to different western districts use the Joydebpur-Ishwardi section, a single line route, going beyond its capacity. This causes longer travel times

Besides, BR cannot operate freight trains from its western zone to Dhaka due to load restrictions on

BSF shoots one Bangladeshi dead, injures another

A Bangladeshi national was shot dead by the Indian Border Security Force (BSF) near the Burirhat border in Lalmonirhat's Kaliganj upazila early yesterday.

Kaliganj police recovered the bullet-hit body of Murali Chandra Barman, 41, of Uttar Balapara village under the upazila's Chandrapur union, said Kaliganj Police Station Officer-in-Charge Imtiaz Kabir.

Another Bangladeshi national was also injured in the shooting incident that took place near border pillar number 913 and was undergoing treatment at a clinic in Rangpur city, the OC said.

His identity could not be ascertained immediately.

The bullet-hit body has been sent to Lalmonirhat Sadar Hospital morgue for autopsy

Indira pledges support for Bangladesh

On March 31, 1971, Indian Prime Minister Indira Gandhi moved a resolution in parliament strongly criticising the military action in Bangladesh.

She demanded an immediate end to the violence "which amounts to genocide". She also promised "whole-hearted sympathy and support" for the people of "East Bengal".

Earlier, Indian Foreign Minister Swaran Singh's tepid tone as to India's response to the events in Bangladesh was criticised in parliament. There was growing pressure, both inside and outside the parliament, on the government to do something. The demand for recognising Bangladesh as an independent state was also quite strong. But Indira's government took a cautious approach. Indira insisted on following "proper international

Dozens of casualties in new Gaza aid chaos

Gunfire, stampede at aid distribution site kill 5, injure dozens; 82 more killed in heavy bombardment across the enclave

Heavy clashes and explosions shook Gaza, witnesses said yesterday, as the Red Crescent reported several people killed during the latest chaotic aid distribution in the territory's north, where famine looms.

Israel's Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu approved a new round of talks on a Gaza truce between Israel and Hamas militants, after a binding UN Security Council resolution last Monday demanded an "immediate ceasefire".

Meanwhile, ships carrying 332 tons of food for Gaza left Cyprus's Larnaca port yesterday in a convoy which will reach the besieged enclave early next

week, authorities said.

It is the second shipment this month after Israel eased a 17-year naval blockade on the Gaza Strip to allow aid in from Cyprus, sourced by US charity World Central Kitchen (WCK) for starving Palestinians.

The aid will be taken to Gaza on a cargo ship and a barge towed by a salvage vessel, along with a tugboat carrying a support team in a journey which will take about 60 hours, a Cypriot official told Reuters.

The Palestine Red Crescent said five people were killed and dozens injured by gunfire and a stampede during an aid delivery in Gaza's north.
