Tk 93 lakh for two pipe cutters!

On January 9, 2024, a small shipment weighing 344.5 kilograms arrived at Chattogram port. The shipment worth \$250,863 (Tk 2.75 crore) contained 19 pieces of small tools such as hammer, metal pipe cutter and silicon guns imported for state-owned Coal Power Generation Company Bangladesh Limited (CPGCL), which is constructing Matarbari power plant in Cox's Bazar.

During physical inspection on January 11, customs officials found that the price of two German-made hammers was shown Tk 1.82 lakh. Similarly, the price of two pipe cutters made by the same German company was shown Tk 92.99 lakh.

Puzzled by such abnormal prices, the customs authorities declined to release the items and subsequently sought explanations from the CPGCL and Power Development Board. The Daily Star has seen the letters dated February 4, 2024.

On March 27, this newspaper visited the website of the German company, KS Tools, to check the prices. The website shows the price of a look-alike hammer is 13.90 euros or Tk 1,668 each, which is 55 times or 5,500 percent less than the imported price.

The company website also shows the price of a pipe cutter that

Govt to fix rice prices too New rates may take effect from Pahela Baishakh

State Minister for Commerce Ahsanul Islam Titu said yesterday that the government will fix rice prices based on variety and seasonal production costs to combat price manipulation in domestic markets starting this Baishakh, the first month of the Bangla calendar.

"Already, a framework for fixing prices and production costs of rice, including at the miller, wholesale, and retail levels, has been formulated, and the food, agriculture, and commerce ministries will soon make an announcement in this regard following a meeting," Titu said.

Claiming that the government can keep the

BUET UNREST

BCL, protesters face off over ban on politics

The demonstrators at BuET yesterday vowed to keep their institution free from politics and banned organisations, while Chhatra League demanded that the university authorities immediately lift the curbs on student politics.

BuET students yesterday boycotted classes and exams for the second consecutive day but did not hold their pre-announced sit-in.

At a press conference on the campus, they said they will return to classrooms only if the authorities ensure that the campus is safe and free from politics and "evil forces".

On the other hand, Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL) held a rally at the Central Shaheed Minar where its President Saddam Hussain said their demonstrations would go on until the BuET authorities lift the ban on politics.

"The Chhatra League knows how to have its demand met," he said.

He urged the BuET administration to hold students' union elections and immediately give back Imtiaz Hossain Rahim Rabbi, a BCL leader and BuET student, his residency at the dormitory.

Unrest at the engineering university began after a group of BCL leaders, including Saddam, gathered on the campus after 2:00am on

Thursday. Amid protests, BuET revoked Imtiaz's residency at the dormitory the next day over "the midnight incident".

BuET on Saturday formed a six-member committee to investigate the incident.

Protesting students maintain that multiple rules were broken when student leaders from other universities entered BuET campus late at night even though the gates are supposed to be locked after 10:30pm.

Addressing the BCL rally yesterday, Saddam said he went to BuET to meet a friend.

He then asked whether one would need a passport and visa to set foot on BuET premises.

After the rally at Shaheed Minar, BCL activists marched to BuET campus and placed a wreath at the mural of Bangabandhu there.

Meanwhile, BuET Vice Chancellor Prof Satya Prasad Majumder yesterday told reporters at his office that it was for the teachers and students to decide whether to lift the restrictions on student politics.

In another development, ruling Awami League General Secretary Obaidul Quader said, "In the name of banning student politics, BuET is being turned into a factory of militancy and dirty politics. If this is indeed the case, the government will have to take action."

19 hand tools bought at abnormally high prices

Prices are way more than those shown at manufacturer's website

Customs sought explanations from Matarbari project authorities

Project authorities say prices are high as the items were custom-made

matches with the imported one is 60.27 euros or Tk 7,232 each, 642 times (64,200%) less than the imported value.

Customs sources say that not only these two items, all 19 items of this shipment have been imported at absurdly high prices.

Documents from the NBR show import cost of these products has been shown 5 to 18,545 times higher than the value recorded in NBR's export import database.

This database is basically a storage of foreign trade-related information, including export-import prices of various items, that the customs authorities use as a reference point.

The shipment in question came from Germany and the items, which also included locking pliers, toolboxes, chisels, spanners and car fitter sets, were supplied by KS TOOLS Werkzeuge, on behalf of Japan's Sumitomo Corporation, documents show.

According to the physical examination report by the customs authorities, the price of the pipe-cutting tool is 18,545 times more than the database value, the pipe wrench 1,053 times more, the monkey pliers 912 times more, the screwdriver 833 times more and the hammers 114 times more.

Bureaucrats to blame for cost, time overruns

Says ex-planning minister MA Mannan on development projects

Civil servants' clerical attitude, inertia, and red tape are the key weaknesses in managing the economy, said immediate past planning minister MA Mannan.

The 78-year-old said, "We have the technology for faster progress. But the negative side of bureaucracy is that public servants do not usually respond quickly when it comes to implementation."

The bureaucrat for 29 years retired in 2003 as the chairman of Bangladesh Small and Cottage Industries Corporation. He joined the Awami League in 2005.

Mannan was supposed to join the bureaucracy in 1971 but he did not as the Liberation War broke out. He eventually joined after Bangabandhu

- প্রয়োজনীয় তথ্য প্রদান করে রেজিস্ট্রেশন সম্পন্ন করতে হবে; মোবাইলে প্রাপ্ত ইউজার নেম এবং পাসওয়ার্ড দিয়ে পোর্টালে লগইন করার পর কাঙ্ক্ষিত পদ অনুযায়ী মনোনয়ন ফরম (ফরম-ক/ফরম ক-১/ ফরম ক-২) দেখতে পাবেন;
- পর্যায়ক্রমে মনোনয়ন, ব্যক্তিগত তথ্যাদি ও হলফনামা সংক্রান্ত তথ্যাদি এন্ট্রি করার পর প্রয়োজনীয় কাগজপত্র যেমন: পূরণকৃত হলফনামা, প্রযোজ্য ক্ষেত্রে রাজনৈতিক দল কর্তৃক মনোনয়ন, আয়কর প্রদান সংক্রান্ত কাগজপত্র ইত্যাদি স্ক্যান করে pdf আকারে সংযুক্ত করতে হবে;
