FARDIN'S DEATH

Family unhappy over CID's progress

After around a year of being tasked with the investigation into the death of Fardin Noor Parash, a third year Buet student, the Criminal Criminal Investigation Department (CID) of police has yet to make any headway.

Even in February this year, the CID was still looking for the most basic information regarding the investigation, such as Fardin's full name, alongside details about his university department and hall.

Talking to The Daily Star recently, Fardin's father and plaintiff in the case, Kazi Nooruddin, said, "On February 6 this year, CID Inspector Belayet Hossain messaged me on WhatsApp seeking information

about Fardin's full name, department, batch, roll number, hall name, and ID card details of the university."

Baffled by the investigation's progress, Nooruddin said, "If the

Amid the situation, Fardin's family members have expressed

their dismay, fearing that this case may join the list of unresolved cases, such as the Sagar-Runi, Taqi, and Tonu murders.

Meanwhile, Belayet said, "There was no significant progress in the investigation of the case. If there was any progress, we would have definitely informed journalists."

On November 7, 2022, the decomposed body of Fardin, a student of Civil Engineering department at the Bangladesh University of Engineering and Technology, was recovered from Shitalakkhya river in Siddhirganj of Narayanganj, three days after he went missing on November 4.

In February 2023, the Detective Branch (DB) of police submitted a probe report, saying Fardin died by suicide and was not killed by anybody.

She had been admitted to the hospital around midnight on Saturday due to a deterioration in her physical condition.

The 78 year-old former prime minister has been suffering from various ailments, including liver cirrhosis, arthritis, diabetes, and issues related to her kidneys, lungs,

VIOLATION OF LABOUR LAWS

Arrest warrants against Hashem Foods MD, DGM

A Narayanganj court yesterday issued arrest warrants against two top officials of Hashem Foods in a case filed over violating labour laws.

The accused are: Abul Hashem, its managing director, and Mamunur Rashid, deputy general manager.

Kiron Sangkar Haldar, chairman of the Labour Court in Narayanganj, passed the order, said Md Asaduzzaman, inspector and in-charge of Narayanganj Court Police Outpost.

On June 30, 2021, Nesar Uddin Ahamed, an inspector of the Department of Inspection for Factories and Establishments, filed the case against the duo over lack of adequate safety measures, inconsistency with the factory's machine layout plan as per the design, employment of child workers, and other irregularities.

The case was filed just a week before a massive fire incident in the factory on July 8 took 54 lives.

The DIFE earlier issued notices asking the factory authorities to rectify the irregularities, but they did not comply, said the plaintiff.

"We filed the case with a Labour Court in Dhaka, and the accused were in anticipatory bail. Recently, the case has been transferred to the Labour Court in Narayanganj. According to the law, if court changes for trial, bail must be taken again. Since the accused didn't do so, the court issued warrants against them," Nesar added.

They stole 20,000 phones in 5yrs

Rab arrests 20 of a gang in Dhaka

After stealing a cell phone, it only takes three to seven seconds for the gang to change the stolen phone's IMEI number.

Using special software, the syndicate changes the IMEI (International Mobile Equipment Identity) of the phones they steal and gives them a new look. Then they change the phone's cover and display screen before sending it back to the market for sale again.

Rapid Action Battalion (Rab-3) yesterday disclosed the findings following the arrest of 20 members of four such cell phone theft syndicates.

Rab arrested the members of those syndicates by conducting drives in

the capital's Gulistan, Sanir Akhra, Mohammadpur, and Khilgaon, alongside Narayanganj, on Monday.

The arrestees are - Hafizur Rahman, 35; Roni Ahmed Imon, 29; Jashim Uddin, 35; Jamal Uddin, 50; Abul Matubbor, 42; Ahammad Ali, 35; Kamal, 40; Bappi, 29; Abid Hossain Sonu, 38; Robin Bhuyan, 21; Ariful Hossain, 22; Ibrahim Mia, 40; Sujon, 29; Delowar, 33; Abdur Rahman, 19; Raju, 27; Jihad Hossain, 24; Munaem, 38; Raju, 45; and Rafiq, 38.

Rab recovered 542 smartphones, 341 button phones, a large number of fake IMEI stickers, a heat gun, electronic sensor devices, various tools used to change IMEI, six knives, a laptop, an LCD monitor, and Tk

GRAFT CASE

Court accepts charges against Prof Yunus

A Dhaka court yesterday accepted the charges pressed against Nobel laureate Prof Muhammad Yunus and 13 others in a case filed over misappropriation of about Tk 25.22 crore of Grameen Telecom Workers' Profit Participation Fund.

Judge Mohammed Ash-shams Joglul Hossain of the Metropolitan Senior Special Judge's Court of Dhaka passed the order, said an official of the Anti-Corruption Commission (ACC).

Meanwhile, Professor Muhammad Yunus said people are not getting the benefit of the "rule of law". He was speaking to reporters in front of the Dhaka Metropolitan Senior Special Judge's Court.

Speaking about social business, he said "...If we follow the path, we'll get that freedom [from misfortune]. We are moving forward in that way. But we're being obstructed at every step." When asked why they were being obstructed, Prof Yunus replied, "You can judge that. What can we explain?"

MOHAMMADPUR GANG-RAPE

MJF expresses concern

Manusher Jonno Foundation (MJF) strongly condemned and expressed deep concern over the rape of a young woman who was confined and shackled for 25 days in Mohammadpur.

In a press statement, MJF demanded a thorough investigation to ensure that the perpetrators are brought to justice.

Shaheen Anam, executive director of MJF, said, "Women continue to endure various forms of torture, including rape, both inside and outside their homes. The recent rape incident in Mohammadpur has deeply shocked and saddened us."

"Such heinous crimes against women will persist unless justice is ensured for the victims, she added. She highlighted a report by Ain o Salish Kendra which mentioned at least 114 women were raped in the first three months of 2024.
