Lichi growers eyeing a bumper harvest

Lichi growers in Pabna are eyeing a bumper yield of the juicy summer fruit this year.

With the trees already blooming with the buds in abundance, the growers are waiting for the weather to become favourable for the fruit's production.

"I have a four-bigha Lichi orchard with 200 trees. All the trees are in bloom. A tree usually produces at least 5,000 to 7,000 Lichis of local variety," said Md Mirajul Islam, a farmer and trader of Shahpur village.

Untimely rain in early Chaitra (Bangla last month) can cause damage to the buds and lower Lichi production, he also said.

If the weather becomes favourable, a high yield of the fruit

may be harvested this year, Mirajul added.

"I have never seen so much Lichi buds in my orchard. Even if 30 to 40 percent buds get destroyed, I am expecting a minimum yield of 15,000 fruits from each of my 100 trees of hybrid variety in my



orchard," said Md Rakib Uddin of Shahpur village.

He, however, claimed a little rain in early Chaitra helps irrigate Lichi trees, which is beneficial for the fruit production.

"We have ample Lichi buds in trees. The sudden hail storm on Monday night did not cause any harm. However, if hail storms continue then it will damage the buds and lower the yield," said Sheikh Mehedi Hasan, another grower and trader.

According to The Department of Agricultural Extension, Lichi is being cultivated on a total 4,721 hectares of land in Pabna, with a target to produce 48,801 tonnes of Lichi this year.

At least 3.150 hectares of land is brought under Lichi cultivation in Ishwardi upazila alone.

"Lichi cultivation has been increasing in Pabna every year as the land is suitable for it," said Md Shah Alam, a DAE official in Pabna.

A favourable weather in next one month will be vital for a bumper harvest, he added.

Sand lifting continues 5 BCL committees

FROM PAGE 5 Shamim Hossain, officer-in-charge of Ukhiya Police Station, said they are trying to arrest the other criminals.

Meanwhile, at least 1500 unregistered dump trucks are engaged in transporting the earth and sand extracted illegally from different areas in Cox's Bazar. There are only 150 registered dump trucks in the district, most employed at the Rohingya camps.

Md Mamunur Rashed, an inspector at the vehicle office, cited a shortage of manpower hindering their ability to take action against the illegal dump trucks.

While fines are imposed on these trucks at times, those cannot be seized due to lack of dumping ground, he added.

"These unregistered dump trucks are solely engaged in transporting stolen earth and sand. Taking actions against these could significantly curb illegal hill cutting and sand lifting," said Sarwar Alam, divisional forest officer of Cox's Bazar South Forest Division.

Naimul Islam Chowdhury, president of Cox's Bazar District Truck

Owner Association, stated that illegal dump trucks pay bribes ranging from Tk 3,000-5,000 to highway and traffic police, BRTA, and the forest department.

"Each vehicle, carrying approximately 200cft of earth or sand, typically makes around 10 trips per day. The price of earth ranges from Tk 1,000-1,200 per truckload, while sand fetches at least Tk 5,000 per truckload," he also said.

Despite raising the issue multiple times during district law and order meetings, Naimul expressed frustration that no action has yet been taken.

According to the district administration, there are a total of 36 approved sand pits (Balu Mahal) in Cox's Bazar. However, perpetrators are illegally plundering sand from rivers and crop fields at hundreds of locations, and earth from hills.

Since the illegally extracted sand and earth are transported late at night, it is difficult for law enforcers to take action since their duties typically end at around 11:00pm, said Jasim Uddin, additional superintendent of police of Cox's Bazar traffic division.

FROM PAGE 3 said, "With the increasing number of students at private universities, BCL, as the largest student organisation, cannot overlook their engagement in politics."

"That's why we are gradually moving forward, forming committees in private universities where students express interest."

Responding to inquiries about the ban on student politics at private university campuses, he said, "If politics is done in a constructive manner for the benefit of students, there shouldn't be any issues."

Contacted, NSU Vice Chancellor Prof Atiqul Islam told this newspaper that the university has yet to take a definitive stance on the matter of student politics on campus.

He said decisions regarding student politics would involve discussions with various stakeholders - Board of trustees, teachers, and students, after the Eid holidays. They would decide student politics on campus, he added.

Belal Ahmed, Director of the Association of Private Universities of Bangladesh, said, "In such cases, we rely on decisions of the respective university authorities. If they deem student politics on campus okay, then it is."

Back in September 2022, the BCL central committee

formed committees for at least 16 private universities, including NSU. Following that, the Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal also formed units on nine private university campuses.

At that time, officials of several private universities, including American International University Bangladesh, BRAC University, University of Liberal Arts Bangladesh, and Stamford University Bangladesh, had stances against student politics on campus.

Mentionable, the Private University Act of 2010 does not provide clear provisions regarding student politics.

FROM PAGE 5 They grabbed the state power by contaminating the electoral process, Rizvi alleged further adding that Awami terrorism has exceeded all of its limit.

"By burying the principles of democracy, AL has made the country as a totalitarian state. In this situation, the feeling of joy for Eid has disappeared from people's mind," Rizvi said.

Especially, this time Eid seems pale for the middle and lower-income group people, he said.

"Torture, robbery is everywhere in the country. By using state power, AL in continuing oppression, forced disappearance, killing, filing ghost and false cases against oppositions," he added.

The BNP leader said the AL government has filed 1.5 lakhs false cases in the last 16 years against 50 lakh BNP leaders and activists including its chairperson Khaleda Zia and acting chairman Tarique Rahaman.

Lack of language skill leaves

FROM PAGE 3 He, however, affirmed that with better proficiency in the languages of the host countries, Bangladeshi migrant workers could do better.

BMET's housekeeping training manual incorporates Arabic language in the "language and communication skill" unit, one of seven units.

In 10 sub-units, it incorporates Arabic words used in everyday life, for domestic jobs, names of Arabic days, months, and numbers, and short and simple sentences required at airports, households, and for primary healthcare.

On the other hand, the PDO manual incorporates only a handful of words and simple sentences used in everyday life.

Returnee migrant worker Abdur Rahim, 42, said he worked in Kuwait for several years between 2001 and 2017 but went there without knowing Arabic.

He said it put him in a lot of trouble initially, especially when he needed to converse with his Kuwaiti employer.

"In such situations, I had to depend on other Bangladeshis who knew Arabic," he said, adding he later learned the language with the help of some Arabs.

He also said Bangladeshi workers with better Arabic proficiency can get better jobs in Kuwait.

If a worker knows the language and seeks a job at a shopping mall, he can get a salesman's job and even earn Tk 50,000 a month. If he doesn't know the language, then he will most likely get

a cleaner's job and earn Tk 20,000 a month, he added.

An official at Bangladesh-Korea Technical Training Centre, one of the training centres under BMET in the capital, said they started an Arabic language course five to six years ago but did not continue due to a lack of students.

Contacted, Md Ruhul Amin, secretary of the expatriates' welfare ministry, recently told this newspaper that they will start an Arabic language course next year.

A total of 1.25 crore workers have migrated from Bangladesh since 2004, of which over 73 percent were recruited by six Gulf Cooperation Council (GCC) countries - Saudi Arabia, Oman, Kuwait, United Arab Emirates, Qatar, and Bahrain.

According to a list of BMET, currently 38 TTCs and five IMTs offer Japanese language courses, 30 TTCs and two IMTs offer Korean language courses, three TTCs offer Cantonese and one TTC offers Mandarin language courses.

Besides, 15 TTCs and one IMT offer English language courses.

Shakirul of Okup said while learning the languages of host countries is essential, there should be an initiative so that more aspirant migrants can at least have training on basic English as it is an international language.

NO LANGUAGE COURSE ON MALAY Like Gulf countries, Malaysia is another regular and large destination for

Bangladeshi workers, but BMET-run training centres do not offer courses on Malay, the national language of Malaysia.

An official at BMET said they have no plan to offer the course anytime soon.

Malaysia hired 9.59 percent of the migrant workers, who migrated from Bangladesh since 2004, according to BMET.
