# 11-film Battle Royale Who won?

Eid marks a prime season for the film industry. Cinemas capitalise on the holiday spirit by premiering a host of new releases designed to cater to families and film enthusiasts, looking to enjoy their leisure time

This Eid-ul-Fitr, an astounding number of films -totalling 11 were released, offering a wide



selection for movie-goers. Amongst them, the Shakib Khan starrer Rajkumar is predictably leading in earnings in its first week. Directed by Himel Ashraf, the film premiered in a recordbreaking 127 cinemas and has been selling out in all multiplexes since its opening day. It is also performing strongly in singlescreen theatres.

Already on its second day of release at Star Cineplex, the number of shows had increased from 13 to 17. The production company, Versatile Media, hopes to add even more shows next

Meanwhile, Sariful Razz stars in three films that have hit theatres. Amongst them are Gias Uddin Selim's *Kajol Rekha*, Mishuk Moni's Deyaler Desh,

In addition, the audience at the multiplex has been fairly receptive to the Jaaz Multimedia-produced film *Mona: Jinn-2*. Featuring Suprobhat in the leading role, the film includes Tariq Anam Khan, Ahmed Rubel, Deepa Khandoker, and Mahmudul Hasan Mithu amongst others.

One of the other released films Lipstick, directed by Kamruzzaman Roman, starring Puja Chery and Ador Azad, has been praised by audiences who have watched it.

Bubly's other film *Maya: The* Love was also released during the Eid festivities. Unfortunately, the film has not gained much attention since its release. One reason for this might be the limited number of theatres screening it. Directed by Jasim Uddin Jakir, the film also features Saimon Sadiq, Anisur Rahman Milon, and Roshan.

The list includes- *Green* Card, directed by Kazi Hayat and starring Kazi Maruf, and the government-funded Ahare Jibon directed by Chotku Ahmed. Ahare Jibon featuring Ferdous, Purnima, Suchorita, Misha Sawdagar, Kazi Hayat, Joy Chowdhury, and Moumita Mou, depicts life during Covid times. However, both movies are still being screened at Lion Cinemas.

The third movie to be removed from Star Cineplex is Fuad Chowdhury's directorial Meghna Konnya. The film stars Qazi Nawshaba Ahmed, Fazlur Rahman Babu, Shatabdi Wadud, Samonty Das Shoumi, and Sajjad Hossain, amongst others.

Many involved in the film industry have expressed their opinions about the release of movies during Eid. Some argued that releasing 11 movies during Eid was not a good decision at all. It was a poor business decision to release more than four films during Eid. Some also criticised the release of three movies starring Sariful Razz during Eid, stating that it would have been better for the audience if only one

Abu Tauhid Heron, the director of Adam (2023), passed away at the age of 38. The young filmmaker succumbed to a brain stroke at his residence in New Eskaton, Dhaka around 4 am yesterday.

Apurbo Rana, deputy secretary general of the Directors' Association, confirmed the news to The Daily Star.

It is reported that Heron had contacted the caretaker of his house, informing him of the physical discomfort he was experiencing.

However, due to the room being locked from inside, he was unable to reach promptly. Upon subsequent assistance from neighbours who forced the door open, Heron was found in an unconscious state inside his room.

Heron, originally from Khalishpur, Khulna, directed the film Adam, starring Yash Rohan, Jannatul Ferdous Oishee, Raisul Islam Asad, and Shahiduzzaman Selim in leading roles. Under his direction, the shooting of another film, titled Wrong Road, had recently been completed.

## 'Last Defenders of Monogamy' misses the mark

Once musician Xefer Rehman took a turn and decided to debut as an actor while also adopting a new look with straightened hair, that too for Mostofa Sarwar Farooki's projectit left netizens mesmerised. Moreover, the awestruck people were also eagerly awaiting around rearing children her on-screen pairing with seasoned actor Chanchal Chowdhury.

Last Defenders of Monogamy set out to be one of the central attractions from the streaming platform Chorki this Eid-ul-Fitr, until its release. The plot centers around an extramarital affair between the leading characters Lamia, portrayed by Xefer, and Shafqat, played by Chanchal Chowdhury, hints even though Shafqat was established to have already been in a happy marriage.

The movie, however, strikingly shies away from nuanced portrayals of attraction and the changing relationships. It showcased neither how the structures mutual attraction began, nor what the primary characters were seeking. The backstories of the characters were neglected, with audiences given mere cursory details about their marital statuses. Even if this was a deliberate attempt to create an impression of ubiquity, there was several questions an undeniable dearth of motivation behind the characters' decisions.

The dualities of Chanchal's character were bereft of any depth, and one is left wondering about his psychology. While it was refreshing seeing men being open to expressing emotions, maybe it was stretched a bit too to open relationships. Or much, with the portrayals of unrealistic reactions in public spaces.

Xefer was rather good with her acting delivery, but her character lacked any pivotal backstory whatsoever. It should have been pertinent to highlight the motivation and reasoning behind the woman consenting to be a part of an affair, given women become extremely vulnerable in such situations, with risks of immense repercussions once such information gets out. But there is no insight into Lamia's life or even thoughts.

Even though Lamia and Shafqat supposedly bond over workspaces, the social and formal entanglements or ripple effects- that the characters could have caused or experienced

through their colleagues- are completely discarded. In a way, children ultimately serve as the

true defenders of monogamy. The concept or foundation of a monogamous marriage can be said to be centered as it is, they who become the sake for which a marriage persists. The film makes it a point to portray this concept significantly.

The movie generational highlights within relationship.

leaves the audience wondering surrounding the barrage of social changes impacting relationships. It makes one wonder if the new generation is more prone is simply cheating more prevalent while people at large cling to the traditional practice of monogamy?

The ubiquity of extramarital relations is a hushed topic across Bangladesh's circles. The movie makes a brave attempt to portray that sensitively but too little has been done too hastily.
