Shakib, Mosaddek end ton drought

Shakib Al Hasan raised both hands in the air, but his celebration was a little muted for someone who struck his first ton in five years, during a Dhaka Premier League match for Sheikh Jamal Dhanmondi Club against Gazi Group Cricketers at BKSP Ground 4 on Friday.

Shakib's last ton had come in the 2019 World Cup -- an unbeaten 124 at Taunton against the West Indies. A five-year wait to finally vanquish a century drought, Shakib's stay at the crease did not go on for much longer as he fell for a 79-ball 107, laced with nine fours and seven sixes.

Shakib batted freely to his usual game plan, but there was a hint of nervous nineties working into the innings when he played out a few dot balls after moving to the high nineties. A push to long-off in the 39th over saw him reach the threefigure mark, his 10th List A ton and 18th

Shakib had played 199 innings in all recognised formats since that ton against the West Indies. The closest he had been to a ton in those 199 innings was when he hit an unbeaten 96 against Zimbabwe in Harare in 2021. He produced 33 fifties in the intervening period, twice getting out



in the nervous nineties.

It must have been a relief to finally get a ton but Shakib would have been keener on his preparations for the upcoming international assignments, having used the DPL as a platform for that. The quality, control and ability to hit big shots were all in full display.

Despite the innings, Sheikh Jamal did not manage to win as youngster Mahfuzur Rahman Rabby, who captained Bangladesh side in the recent U-19 World Cup, struck a 118-ball 125 to help Gazi win by two wickets.

Meanwhile Abahani's Mosaddek Hossain played a blinder against Mohammedan Sporting Club in Fatullah, hitting a 101-ball 133 -- his highest List A knock – to end his own five-year ton drought. Earlier, opener Sabbir Hosan struck a 78-ball 91 but barring the two top-scorers, no other batter contributed significantly as Abahani were bowled out in 44.4 overs, reaching 303.

Imrul Kayes and Rubel Mia hit fifties to keep the chase going and then Mohammedan's hero Abu Haider Rony, who turned up on many occasion this DPL with either bat and ball, hit a 27ball 40. Needing 27 runs in the last over, Rubel hit two sixes off Mosaddek but Mohammedan fell short by nine runs.

The day's most-destructive innings, however, came from Prime Bank's Zakir Hasan against Shinepukur Cricket Club at BKSP Ground 3. His 132-ball 158 featured 12 sixes as Prime Bank managed 341 for seven before they restricted Shinepukur to 230, registering a 111-run win.

Saifuddin, Tanzid make their cases in first T20I

Bangladesh were keeping an eye on two players who would have key roles in bolstering the World Cup squad. Mohammad Saifuddin's three wickets and Tanzid Hasan's debut fifty against Zimbabwe during the eight-wicket win in the first T20I in Chattogram yesterday would reassure the team management ahead of the T20 World Cup in June.

Eighteen months since his last outing for the national team, Saifuddin produced a fine performance, bagging three for 15 runs. He conceded just one more run than fellow pacer Taskin Ahmed, who also claimed three Zimbabwe wickets as the pace duo led the charge for the Tigers in bowling out the visitors for 124.

The injury and form concerns kept Saifuddin out of contention for quite a few major tournaments and saw him sit out the initial stage of this year's Bangladesh Premier League (BPL). But his bowling became crucial for Fortune Barishal in the latter part of the tournament.

Yesterday, he scalped Zimbabwe's second wicket and initiated the batting collapse which saw Zimbabwe go from 36 for one to 41 for seven. A trademark yorker to remove Blessing Muzarabani in the death overs would have given him the required boost.

There was a keenness to perform and then there was the nervousness following all the injury troubles and pressure to perform.

"I was nervous today. Although I have

played international matches before, it the World Cup squad, there is nothing was very important to perform today. Fizz [Mustafizur Rahman] will return in one or two days and then what the final eleven will be is up to the management. There are four more matches, and I will try to do better than I did today," Saifuddin said at the post-match press

He upped the ante, playing his shots and with an approach required in the format during a 47-ball 67.

He went on to finish the game alongside Tawhid Hridoy, who struck 33 off 18 deliveries as Tigers won with 4.4 overs to spare.

Skipper Najmul Hossain Shanto credited the batter and said: "The way he batted really helped us. I think Towhid batted really well and showed character. Really happy for Tamim as he finished the match.'

Both Tanzid and Saifuddin are being earmarked for the World Cup and both have performances to back their cases. Saifuddin, too, was impressed by Tanzid's approach and acknowledged that opportunity has to be grabbed.

Arsenal hope for Man City slip-up

Arsenal resume their quest for Premier League glory against Bournemouth this weekend knowing they have no margin for error with Manchester City hot on their heels.

Mikel Arteta's Gunners are a single point above Pep Guardiola's men with three games left but City, who host Wolves, crucially have a game in hand.

Arsenal have hit a rich vein of form since their 2-0 defeat by Aston Villa last month, but are competing against a City side who are now unbeaten in 31 games in all competitions. The Gunners have a chance at least to apply

some pressure by beating Bournemouth in the early kick-off at the Emirates on Saturday. Bournemouth have registered their highest

ever points tally in a Premier League season to climb to 10th spot but have only beaten Arsenal City were not at their best against Nottingham

Forest last weekend but still found a way to win and

are strong favourites to wrap up an unprecedented fourth straight English title. Arsenal will cling to the hope that Wolves can complete a rare double against City after they won

2-1 at home earlier this season. Guardiola, for his part, does not believe his side can afford to drop any points in the run-in.

"With four games left, it's like climbing a mountain," he said. "They are very tough games... If we draw a game, we are not going to win the Premier League. It is what it is."

Meanwhile, Arteta, who saw his side get the better of local rivals Tottenham Hotspur in a hardfought 3-2 win in the London derby, asked his side to not get carried away after the win last Sunday.

"Don't get carried away with yourself. There's a margin for improvement and we go again against Bournemouth," said Arteta.

'Everyone wants to beat Leverkusen'

With his Bayer Leverkusen side three games from a record-breaking unbeaten season, manager Xabi Alonso said Friday he knows the team has a target on their heads.

"Everyone wants to beat us, of course. But we want to stay unbeaten. Every week it's a bit more difficult but the goal is bigger," Alonso said before Sunday's trip to Eintracht Frankfurt.

Leverkusen, who ended Bayern Munich's 11-year stranglehold on the Bundesliga title to secure their first trophy since 1993, travel to sixth-placed Eintracht Frankfurt on Sunday.

Already crowned league champions for the first time, Leverkusen are three games from becoming the first team to go unbeaten in a Bundesliga season -a feat not even Bayern Munich have achieved.

On Thursday, Leverkusen won 2-0 at AS Roma in their Europa League semifinal first leg to have



one foot in the final, extending their season-long unbeaten run in all competitions to 47 games.

Leverkusen won their first meeting with Roma in almost 20 years, since they beat Italy's capital side 3-1 at home in October 2004 in the Champions League group stage. They were winless in five games against Roma since.

Already in the German Cup final where they will face second-division Kaiserslautern, Leverkusen could win a remarkable treble in Alonso's first full season at the club.

The German champions will however have to beat Frankfurt without Alonso on the sideline, with the coach to watch from the stands due to a yellow card suspension.
