### US trying to destabilise India during polls: Russia

The US aims to destabilise India during the 2024 general election, the Russian foreign ministry has said after a US federal commission's report criticised New Delhi for alleged violations of religious freedom.

RT news has reported that foreign ministry spokesperson Maria Zakharova has said Washington lacks understanding of India's national mentality and history and continues to make "unfounded accusations" about religious freedoms in India.

Zakharova called it disrespectful to India as a country and a state. "The reason [behind the US accusations] is to unbalance the internal political situation in India and complicate the general elections," RT news quoted her as saying.

### Israeli air strike kills 4 Hezbollah fighters

An Israeli air strike on a car in southern Lebanon killed four people yesterday, according to Lebanon's civil defence, with security sources saying those killed were members of armed group Hezbollah.

The conflict between Hezbollah and Israel has rumbled on since October in parallel to the Gaza offensive, with an escalation this week as both sides intensified their bombardment, fuelling concern of a bigger war between the heavily-armed adversaries.

Israel has used artillery, drones and warplanes against targets in southern Lebanon, including to strike fighters from Hezbollah and other armed groups. Fighters in Lebanon have launched rockets and their own drones into northern Israel.

Israel did not immediately reply to a request for comment on strikes. Lebanon's civil defence rescue force said it had pulled four bodies out of a car that had been scorched by an Israeli strike. Two security sources told Reuters the four killed were members of Hezbollah.

# 'Our lives have completely stopped'

Say displaced Palestinians as 'fear' roils in Gaza's southern city of Rafah since Israeli incursion

Displaced Palestinian Marwan al-Masri, sheltering in Rafah, said "Our lives have completely stopped" since Israeli tanks and troops entered the city's east, sending desperate people fleeing north to the besieged territory.

Over 1.4 million people had crammed into Rafah, a city on the Gaza Strip's southern border with Egypt, as Israeli forces pushed their way southward from coastal territory's north during months of offensive.

Many in Rafah have been displaced multiple times during the seven-month offensive, and are now

heading back north after Israeli forces called for the evacuation of the city's eastern part, which hosts tens of thousands of people.

"Life has completely ceased in the downtown area of Rafah", said 35-year-old Masri, who has been displaced from northern Gaza. "The streets are empty of people, and markets are in a state of paralysis", he told AFP on Wednesday.

"We all feel fear of any advancement in the invasion, as happened in the eastern areas, which are now completely empty of residents".

Masri said he and his relatives "are all tense and frightened" by the incessant shelling that they feel is getting closer to them.

Ibtihal al-Arouqi, who was displaced from Al-Bureij refugee camp in central Gaza, said she has



found herself once again homeless.

"We emerged from under the rubble of our house in Al-Bureij, and now due to intense shelling in Rafah, my children and I are in the street", she said.

The 39-year-old said that only two weeks ago she gave birth by Caesarean section. "We don't know where to go. There is no safe place", Arouqi added.

She spoke from west Rafah, where many Palestinians remain.

While it is relatively calmer than the city's heavily bombed east, the west has also been hit by shelling, an AFP journalist reported.

Both Arouqi and Masri said incessant shelling has filled the air with dust and smoke that make it hard to breathe. "The situation in Rafah is chaotic," said Mohammed Abu Mughaseeb, a medical coordinator for Doctors Without Borders (MSF) charity in Rafah.

Himself displaced from Gaza City, he described "people carrying their things, mattresses, blankets, kitchen items on trucks" to flee east Rafah.

But "there's no space anymore in the west of Rafah," Abu Mughaseeb told AFP.

The city's Al-Najjar hospital was "closed, evacuated by the medical team to avoid what happened in Al-Shifa or Nasser", he added.

## 23 Chinese warplanes, ships detected around Taiwan

Taipei's defence ministry said yesterday it had detected 23 Chinese warplanes and five navy warships around the island, a day after a US warship sailed through the sensitive Taiwan Strait.

The military presence around Taiwan comes less than two weeks before its inauguration of incoming president Lai Ching-te, who Beijing regards as a "dangerous separatist".

China, which claims self-ruled Taiwan as part of its territory, frequently sends warplanes and naval ships around the island.

The 180-kilometre Taiwan Strait separates Taiwan from China and is an important transport artery for cargo ships.

Taipei's defence ministry said 23 Chinese warplanes and five navy vessels were detected around Taiwan in the 24 hours leading up to 6:00 am yesterday.

"8 of the aircraft crossed the median line," the ministry said, referring to a line bisecting Taiwan Strait.

The Chinese military presence coincided with a US warship -- the USS Halsey -- sailing through the narrow body of water on Wednesday.

provision was kept here so that none can stop power plants by filing cases.

"None was given indemnity in the special law," the PM said, adding that she rather realised \$10,000 as fine every day from Summit Group for its delay in completion of its first power plant in Khulna under a private venture. "We don't give indemnity. It will have to be kept in mind. Even there is no indemnity provision in the law. But provision is there so that none can file cases, stop power plants and my work," she said.

"Is there any country in the world where an agreement for power plant construction is signed without a clause for capacity charge?" she said.

Noting that the people, particularly those with

limited incomes, are suffering from high inflation to some extent, she called upon all to boost food production not leave any piece of land uncultivated.

About loan defaults, Hasina said the culture of bank loan default started during the regime of military dictator Ziaur Rahman.

"The continuation of this bad culture was seen during the regimes of HM Ershad and Khaleda Zia. There is still no complete relief from it. It is reality. Even then, we continue our efforts here," she added.

The second session of the 12th parliament that started on May 2 was prorogued after six working days.

Speaker Shirin Sharmin Chaudhury read out the prorogation of the president at 9:00pm.

In 13 upazilas, the competition was close as the differences in the numbers of votes between contesting candidates were less than 1,000, sources said.

Joypurhat's Khetal upazila had the highest turnout at 73 percent, while Kalai upazila, of the same district, had 70.

Gopalganj's Tungipara saw 68 percent, Panchagarh's Tentulia 66, and Kurigram's Rajibpur Char 64 percent.

Though the ruling party did not give its own nominations, grassroots AL leaders participated in the polls independently.

Meanwhile, many relatives of AL MPs contested the polls defying party high-ups' directives and almost all of them won.

At least eight expelled BNP leaders were elected chairman, though the party officially boycotted the polls and expelled its grassroots leaders for participating.

The eight upazilas where they were elected chairman are Chapainawabganj's Gomostapur and Bholahat upazilas; Tangail's Pakundia; Mymensingh's Haluaghat; Sherpur's Jhinaigati; Sylhet's Bishwanath; Cumilla's Ramgati; and Bandarban Sadar upazila.

Another eight candidates who won in the polls do not belong to any political party.

Two leaders from Parbatya Chattogram Jana Sanghati Samity were elected chairman in Rangamati Sadar and Barkal upazilas.

The main opposition Jatiya Party also got two wins -- in Kurigram's Chilmari and Narayanganj Bandar upazila.

Independent candidates won in Chattogram's Maheshkhali; Cox's Bazar's Kutubdia; Khagrachari's Matiranga; Lakshimpur's Ramgati; Madaripur's Rajoir; Barishal Sadar, Panchagarh's Tentulia, and Natore's Noldanga.

Donald Trump will refuse to accept the results if he loses the US election this year, Joe Biden said Wednesday.

The two men, who fought for the White House in 2020, are set for a rematch in November that polls show the American public is unenthusiastic about.

In an interview with CNN, Biden raised the prospect of Trump not accepting the outcome of the ballot. "I promise you he won't, which is dangerous."

Trump still insists -- without foundation -- that he won the 2020 election, despite losing repeated legal challenges.
