PANDEMIC TALKS No deal as deadline passes



Countries trying to strike a landmark global agreement on handling future pandemics decided to keep negotiating for another fortnight after their deadline passed on Friday.

Scarred by the devastation caused by Covid-19 -- which killed millions, shredded economies and crippled health systems -- the World Health Organization's 194 member states have spent two years trying to hammer out binding commitments pandemic prevention, on preparedness and response.

The process was aimed at getting an deal finalised by the WHO's annual assembly which opens on May 27.

A final talks session in March got nowhere near consensus, so an additional fortnight of talks was crammed in. However, despite progress on several fronts, the talks



broke up on Friday without sealing a deal.

Despite a showing desire for commitments aimed at preventing another Covid-style disaster, big differences have emerged between country blocs on how to acheive them.

The talks were held behind closed doors at the WHO headquarters in Geneva.

The main disputes revolve around access and equity: access to pathogens detected within countries and to pandemic-fighting products such as vaccines produced from that knowledge; and equitable distribution of counter-pandemic tests, treatments and jabs, along with the means to produce them.

Afghan floods kill over 300

Many remain missing; thousands of houses destroyed

More than 300 people were killed in flash floods that ripped through multiple Afghan provinces, the World Food Programme said yesterday, as authorities declared a state of emergency and rushed to rescue the injured.

Heavy rains on Friday sent roaring rivers of water and mud crashing through villages and across agricultural land in several provinces.

Survivors yesterday picked through muddy, debris-littered streets and damaged buildings, an AFP journalist saw, as authorities and non-governmental groups deployed rescue workers and aid, warning that some areas had been cut off by the flooding.

Northern Baghlan province was one of the hardest hit, with more than 300 people killed there alone, and thousands of houses destroyed or damaged, according to WFP.

death tolls provided by the government and humanitarian agencies.

The UN migration agency, the International Organization for Migration, said there were 218 deaths in Baghlan.

Abdul Mateen Qani, spokesman for the interior ministry, told AFP that 131 people had been killed in Baghlan, but that the government toll could rise.

"Many people are still missing," he said. Another 20 people were reported dead in northern Takhar province and two in neighbouring Badakĥshan, he added.

Government spokesman Zabihullah Mujahid said, "Hundreds of our fellow citizens have succumbed to these calamitous floods", in a statement posted to X earlier yesterday.

"Moreover, the deluge has wrought extensive devastation upon residential properties, resulting in significant financial losses," he added.

Rains on Friday caused heavy damage in Baghlan, Takhar and Badakhshan, as well as western Ghor and Herat provinces, officials said, in a country wracked by poverty and heavily dependent on agriculture.

Emergency personnel were rushing to rescue injured and stranded people, according to the defence ministry.

The air force said it had started evacuation operations as the weather cleared yesterday, adding that more than a hundred injured people had been transferred to hospital, without specifying from which provinces.

Since mid-April, flash flooding and other floods had left about 100 people dead in 10 of Afghanistan's provinces, with no region entirely spared, according to authorities.

ordination Committee of Communist Revolutionaries of East Bengal, a pro-Chinese party, Rano was among those who played a leading role in organising thousands of local freedom fighters to keep Narsingdi's Shibpur and other areas as "free zones" during the Liberation War.

He also played important roles in the 1962 students' movement, the 1969 mass upsurge, 1980s' anti-autocrat movement, and the 1990 mass upsurge.

Born in Kolkata in 1942, Rano was one of the first student leaders to publicly speak against Pakistani autocrat Ayub Khan during the 1962 movement.

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina in a statement yesterday expressed her shock and sorrow at the death of Haider Akbar Khan Rano.

The BNP also grieved the death of the communist leader in their separate statement.

The Communist Party of Bangladesh in a statement yesterday said Rano's body was kept at the Samorita Hospital morgue as his grandchildren were yet to fly in from abroad.

It added that the party flag will be hoisted at half-mast in all CPB offices across the country tomorrow to pay their respects.

Rano's body will be taken to the party office in Paltan at 10:00am and will be kept there for an hour.

Later, it will be taken to the Central Shaheed Minar for all to pay homage.

His namaz-e-janaza will be held at the Dhaka University Mosque after Zohr prayers, after which he will be buried at the Banani graveyard beside his parents.

Awami League General Secretary and Road Transport and Bridges Minister Obaidul Quader; the CPB; Workers Party; Socialist Party of Bangladesh; the Revolutionary Workers Party; left-leaning students and many cultural organisations expressed deep sorrow for Rano's death.

According to his last wish, his corneas were donated to Sandhani Eye Hospital.

Rano held different top positions at the pro-Chinese Workers Party of Bangladesh and the pro-Russian Communist Party of Bangladesh.

He held the general secretary post, among other top posts, at the Workers Party of Bangladesh from 1969 to 2008.

Later, he joined the CPB and was made its presidium member in 2010. He was elected an adviser to the party in 2022.

Rano was also the general secretary of East Pakistan Chhatra Union between 1963 and 1965, after which he joined the labour movement and even lived in the workers' slums in Tongi area.

In 1970, he was elected general secretary of the East Bengal Sramik Federation, the largest labour organisation of the then East Pakistan.

He was put behind bars on four occasions and had to go into hiding seven times due to arrest warrants.

In addition to his political activities, he wrote at least 25 books and numerous articles on Marxism, politics, history, philosophy, economics, literature and physics.

In 2022, he received the Bangla Academy Shahitya Puroshkar. His autobiography "Shatabdi Periye", earned the "Prothom Alo Book of the Year" award in 2005.

Rano has left behind a daughter and two grandchildren.
