All pending hajj visa applications to be expedited Saudi envoy tells PM

Saudi Ambassador Essa Yousef Essa Alduhailan yesterday assured that he will take steps to clear all pending hajj visa applications from Bangladesh.

The ambassador made the assurance during a meeting with Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina at her official residence Gono Bhaban, according to PM's speech writer M Nazrul Islam.

This year more than 83,000 Bangladeshis are scheduled to perform hajj. According to a report, more than 10,000 of them are yet to get visas due to some complications.

The prime minister requested the envoy to extend the visa approval time so all the aspirants can go to Saudi Arabia to

The Saudi envoy conveyed to the PM the interest of his country's investors and companies to make investments in some projects in Bangladesh. He also handed a list of those projects to the prime minister.

Speakers at a press conference yesterday urged the government to ensure the effective allocation, implementation, and evaluation of the gender budget designated for women's empowerment in the 2024-25 national budget.

They also highlighted that despite the increased allocation, doubt persists regarding whether the budget formulation and implementation effectively promote gender equality.

Titled "National Budget 2024 2025: Expectations from Women's Society," the press conference was organised by Bangladesh Nari Pragati Sangha at the Tofazzal Hossain Auditorium of Jatiya Press Club.

Dr Sayema Haque Bidisha, professor of economics at Dhaka University, said, "Gender-sensitive programmes of ministries often receive disproportionately low budgetary allocations and are not frequently aligned with the strategic objectives of women's development policies."

She advised that annual progress reports on gender budget

accountability and effectiveness.

Neelormi. Sharmind professor of economics at Jahangirnagar University, noted that although the government budgets are gender-friendly, there is a lack of significant review or survey on actual progress.
