'794 illegal brick kilns still running in Rangpur'

HC blasts divisional commissioner for failure

The High Court yesterday blasted Rangpur's Divisional Commissioner Md Zakir Hossain for his failure to evict all 812 illegal brick kilns in the division despite its directive.

"Rangpur's divisional commissioner has failed to comply with this court's directive, which is an inefficiency on his part," said the HC bench of Justice JBM Hassan and Justice Razik-Al-Jalil after seeing a compliance report from Zakir while hearing a writ petition.

According to the compliance report, 794 illegal brick kilns are still running in different districts of Rangpur, though the HC on March 4 directed the government to evict those within four weeks.

Earlier in the day, Zakir submitted the report to the HC through Assistant Attorney General Kalipada Mridha, saying there are 812 illegal brick kilns in Rangpur and operations of only 18 of those have been shut down.

The HC ordered him to give an explanation for failing to implement its directive, to take necessary steps to comply with the directive and to submit a compliance report in two weeks. The bench also fixed May 30 for further hearing and passing of order on this matter.

"Rather than selling paddy at markets, we should have sold them from the fields before harvesting. We would at least make Tk 1,000 per maund," said Ebadullah, another farmer. Mia Mofiz from Bhangnati village was taking his paddy elsewhere from the market.

Asked why he did not sell his produce, he said, "I into the matter."

"We had no idea about the prices being fixed by the government," said Mostafa Mia, a trader. Asma Ul Hosna, food

The committee overseeing the "Kamla Bhasin Award for Driving Gender Equality Across South Asia" urged Bangladeshi individuals to apply for the award during an information session held yesterday.

After the death of Kamla Bhasin, the prominent Indian developmental feminist activist, poet, author, and social scientist, on September 25, 2021, Azad Foundation, National Foundation for India, and iPartner-India jointly launched the award.

The information session was organised by the committee at Jaitya Press Club.

"A significant number of applicants from South Asian countries applied in 2022 and 2023. However, there were no applications submitted from Bangladesh in 2023," said Dolon Ganguly, chief functionary of Azad Foundation.

According to the committee, the jury comprises esteemed South Asian women's rights and human rights activists, philanthropists, and journalists.

Annually, the awards will recognise outstanding individuals in two categories: woman (cis or trans) excelling in non-conventional occupations, and man (cis or trans) advocating for gender equality.

The application process commenced on March 8, with a closing date of June 7, 2024. The award ceremony is slated for November 30 at the Habitat Center in New Delhi, India.

To help combat mental health issues in the country, experts and policymakers have called for a multifaceted approach, public-private partnerships, and comprehensive guidelines.

They also asked for an increase in the number of psychiatrists and psychologists to address the large number of mental health patients.

The remarks came at a symposium, titled "Current Status of Mental Health in Bangladesh & Strengthening Public-Private Partnership," held at a city hotel yesterday.

The programme was organised by Non Communicable Disease Control of Directorate General of Health Services with the support of ADD International Bangladesh.

Mental health is a big issue in **Bangladesh right** now and the problem will grow in near future. We need to work with all the stakeholders to combat it.

Prof Md Robed Amin. line director of NCDC. said comprehensive guideline, better treatment, more patient care centres and data preservation are needed to improve mental health services.

DGHS Additional Director General Meerjady Sabrina Flora said, "Mental health is a big issue in Bangladesh right now and the problem will grow in near future. We need to work with all the stakeholders to combat it."

Dr Helal Uddin Ahmed, associate professor of NIMH, said there are around 350-400 psychiatrists and over 500 psychologists in the country. The number of occupational therapists, speech therapists, and social workers is also insignificant.

"There is a big gap in mental health treatment in the country. A survey found the treatment gap to be 92 percent, meaning 92 out of every 100 patients in the country are out of the purview of mental treatment and health services for various reasons," he added.
