Australia foreign minister arrives today

Australian Foreign Minister Penny Wong arrives Dhaka on a two-day visit



today to deepen the bilateral cooperation, including trade and investment, and to find practical solutions to shared challenges such as climate change, regional maritime security and smuggling.

This would be the first leg of her regional visit before Singapore aimed at advancing Australia's interests in a peaceful, stable and prosperous Indian Ocean region.

The visit by Penny Wong undertakes the first visit to Bangladesh as Australia enhances its engagement with the Indian Ocean region.

In Dhaka, she would meet with Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina, Foreign Minister Hasan Mahmud and other government officials, she said in a statement yesterday.

Australia and Bangladesh have significant peopleto-people links, with over 50,000 people in Australia born in Bangladesh. The two-way trade now stands at around US\$ 4 billion.

Penny Wong will also travel to Cox's Bazar, where she will see how Australia's humanitarian assistance delivering practical support to displaced Rohingya and Bangladeshi host communities.

In an instance of unplanned development work, two electric poles are standing in the middle of an approach road to a bridge on a canal in Char Montaj union of Patuakhali's Rangabali upazila.

Local Government Engineering Department took the initiative to construct the 66-metre bridge on the canal and its 350-metre approach roads at a cost of Tk 6.5 crore to facilitate communication from Char Lakshmi and Char Margaret villages to the union parishad office, said sources at LGED's Rangabali upazila office.

Although the construction work was completed by the contractor around six months back, the poles of Rural Electrification Board were

"During daytime, we can use the road without problem. However, at night, especially when there is no electricity, the poles are not visible in the dark and we have to use the road amid risk of accidents," said Alauddin, a local easy-bike driver.

"Recently, there was an accident due to the electric poles standing in the middle of the road when an easybike collided with it," said Md Nasir Uddin, assistant teacher of Char Montaj Siddiquia Dakhil Madrasa.

Abu Samsuddin, chairman of Char Montaj union parishad, said, "The authorities concerned have been urged to remove the poles from the road."

Contacted, Jamal Hossain, contractor of the project, said the REB office was requested to remove

"Also, there was no allocation for removing the poles in the tender, so we had to complete the work without removing those," he added. Md Habibur Rahman, engineer

of LGED in Rangabali upazila, said, "REB's Bhola office is responsible for electricity supply and maintenance in Char Montaj union. They have been contacted and efforts are on to remove the electricity poles."

Contacted, Md Kawsar Ahmed, assistant manager of South Aicha REB sub-zonal office in Bhola, said he was not aware of the matter.

Awami League, in its election manifesto-2024, also pledged to form the wage board soon, they said, adding that the directive is yet to be implemented."

Mahbub Hossain said in the proposed law, instead of such provisions, specific salaries have been set. They will also receive other related allowances and benefits along with this salary.

BR to buy 200

project approval. Given the 36-month contract period, the project deadline of June 2026 is likely to be extended.

Zaidul Islam blamed the delay in appointing a project director, consultants and getting approval from the European Investment Bank, which will provide Tk 1,331.19 crore as soft loan.

The Dhaka-Jashore rail line via the Padma Bridge is going to open in July, but BR may not be able to reap the full benefit of the expensive project soon, mainly due to shortages of manpower and carriages.

Speaking at the programme, BR Director General Sardar Shahadat Ali said they have decided to operate new trains in the southern destinations with the new carriages.

Railways Minister Zillul Hakim said the 200 carriages will give much respite as BR has been suffering from a carriage crisis.

Currently, BR has a total of 621 BG carriages, of which 37 percent of them has expired economic life, shows BR data.

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
