



Two books on architectural approach launched

Architect Kashef Chowdhury has published two books showcasing his philosophy with architectural designs for urban spaces and for sustainability amid rising sea levels due to climate change.

The book, "The Consciousness of Place", is a collection of Kashef's lectures on architecture illustrated with 52 photographs, with focus on significance of architecture to connect us to nature and liberate us from hectic urban life.

The second book, "Rising Oceans and The Spaces That Care", is a collection of 146 images and illustrations and 26 plans, as well as articles by Kashef Chowdhury, Niklaus Graber, Tanja C Vollmer, and Gemma Koppen. The photos are taken by Hélène Binet, said a press release.

The book highlights the Friendship Hospital in southern Bangladesh, designed by Kashef Chowdhury and awarded the 2022 RIBA International Prize, as a pioneering feat of architectural design seeking new sustainable approaches to climatic and social challenges of the design and construction process in one of the world's most climate-affected regions, it added.

Kashef's work also previously won the 2016 Aga Khan Award for Architecture.

RU admission tests to be held at 4 regional centres

The first-year undergraduate admission test for 2024-25 session at Rajshahi University will be held at four regional centres in Rajshahi, Dhaka, Khulna and Chattogram.

The decision was made at RU's Academic Council meeting last evening, said RU Registrar Prof Tariqul Hasan. "From next academic year, the first-year undergraduate admission tests will be held at four centres - Rajshahi University, Dhaka University, Khulna University, and Chittagong University. If necessary, the number of centres at public universities within Dhaka may be increased," he said.

Additionally, if there is any seat available in the Master's programme at RU, students from its affiliated government colleges, and public universities across the country will be able to get admission through an entry exam, he added.

Contacted, RU Pro Vice-Chancellor Prof Sultanul-Islam said the decisions have been made to reduce hassle of admission seekers and to increase opportunities for other students.

Though the ruling party did not field candidates this year, grassroots AL leaders ran for chairman posts as independents.

Party sources said at least 70 AL leaders have been elected upazila chairman and at least two expelled BNP leaders have won chairman polls.

BNP boycotted the elections, saying polls cannot be held in a free and fair manner under the incumbent Election Commission. The party has expelled many grassroots leaders for running in the elections. The sixth upazila parishad elections are being held in four phases this year, and polls will take place in 56 upazilas in the fourth phase on June 5.

Besides, 20 upazilas where elections were postponed due to Cyclone Remal will be held on June 9.

he turned back and sought refuge at a friend's place for the night rather than proceeding towards his home.

He was shocked the next morning after realising those youths were not entirely wrong.

Four people died in Dhaka on Monday due to electrocution while wading through waterlogged streets. Among them was Md Rakib, a 25-year-old auto-rickshaw puller who was electrocuted while charging his vehicle at the very same garage where we talked to Yunus and Sayeed.

Another victim, Moriom Begum, a 45-year-old garment worker living in Ice Cream Lane of Shipahibagh, met a similar fate.

The Daily Star has a video that shows the woman floating in the water after being electrocuted by wires on an electric pole.

Both of them were rushed to Dhaka Medical College and Hospital, where

they were declared dead, as confirmed by Bacchu Mia, in charge of DMCH police outpost.

From Riazbag, we reached Ice Cream Lane, which falls under ward 3 of Dhaka South City Corporation.

Although water has mostly receded from the streets, the residents claimed the area was submerged for a whole day, even after the rain stopped.

Then we heard a woman approaching us. "Come with me; I will take you to my building. The ground floor is still under water."

It was a two-storied building. There were four units on the ground floor. The entire floor was still submerged on Wednesday afternoon, almost 38 hours after the rain. The residents had locked their homes and shifted elsewhere.

"Beds and other furniture in our homes have been ruined. Our landlady let us stay at her place, so we have taken shelter there," said Yasmin,

who stays there.

"The drainage system doesn't work, as the drains are filled with trash. The city corporation doesn't take any initiative to fix these. This situation occurs every monsoon," she added.

When we were talking to her, a few others approached us and took us to another two-storey building.

The situation was exactly the same there.

Seeking anonymity, another person said, "The councillor of Ward 3 is always absent. Our demands for a better life have fallen on his deaf ears."

We went to the DSCC Ward 3 office to meet Md Maksud Hossain, the councillor. He was absent.

Then after calling him over phone several times, he picked up. After we introduced ourselves, he said he could not talk until next week and disconnected the call. We couldn't reach him ever since.

However, we could talk to Shakhawat Hossain Showkat, councillor of

DNCC ward 23, where Riazbag is situated.

"I acknowledge that certain areas in the ward, like Riazbag, face severe waterlogging whenever it rains. The drainage system in these areas has faults, for which, even if we do some temporary work to reduce the water, it doesn't bear much fruit," he said.

When asked why no city corporation cleaners were seen despite the locality being submerged for over a day, he replied, "Even if we work, water does not go away. It's like swimming with our hands tied."

"However, we are going to call for a special tender to work on the drainage system in these areas in June. Hopefully, by December, the work will be done. Till then, I'd ask the residents to be a bit patient," he added.

Both the executive engineers of DNCC zone-3 and DSCC zone-2 declined to comment, saying only the public relation officers can comment in this regard. However, DSCC PRO

is being encouraged to report accident numbers that are two to three times higher than the actual figures.

At the beginning of the briefing, the minister said several major road accidents took place after Eid-ul-Fitr and he had to face severe criticism for

this.

"The issue was even discussed in parliament. The matter embarrassed me," he said, asking authorities concerned to continue the monitoring even after Eid to prevent road crashes, as drivers tend to drive recklessly during the Eid return journey.
