Police seized the truck but its driver fled the scene, the OC said.

installation, testing, and commissioning of pot bearings and shock transmission devices on the bridge, it shows.

Ferdous said they will sign a contract with the firm once they get the written approval of CCGP.

The replacement work is supposed to be completed within one and a half years, he said, adding, "But it may take a little more time given the complex nature of the work."

Asked when the work may start, he said it may take up to six months as the contractor, after signing deals, has to collect the bearings and start replacement.

He said the bridge had gone through some repair work. "But replacement of all the pot bearings of the bridge will be the biggest maintenance work on the bridge since its opening," he told The Daily Star yesterday.

AFTERMATH OF CYCLONE REMAL

Living under open sky for six days

At least 12 families have been living under the open sky for the past six days in Kutuba union under Bhola's Borhanuddin upazila after becoming homeless as Cyclone Remal left a trail of destruction in the district.

Visiting Chhota Manika village in the union on Friday, this correspondent saw Kawsar Gazi, 70, and his wife Nurjahan Begum cooking rice and lentils in front of the remnant of their house.

"Before the cyclone lashed here on May 27 midnight, we had taken shelter at a house near the embankment. We could not take anything from the house with us. When we returned, we found our tin shed house completely destroyed and all our belongings washed away," said their granddaughter Amena Begum, 15.

"Since then, we have been living under the open sky for past six days. We only got 30 kilogrammes rice as relief," said Nurjahan Begum.

Kawsar Gazi pleaded the authorities to provide them with assistance to rebuild their house.

At least 181 houses were partially and 37 completely damaged in the cyclone in Borhanuddin upazila, said Md Raihan-Uzzaman, upazila nirbahi officer.

"We have already distributed relief among the victims in the upazila. We are now preparing a list of those whose houses were destroyed to provide them with assistance to rebuild the houses. Kawsar Gazi's name is on the list," the UNO added.

Cattle farmers in dire need of support

Speakers tell event

Cyclone Remal, left over 9,000 acres of grazing land flooded and damaged across 19 cyclone-hit areas.

This led to an acute crisis of fodder for cattle in those areas, affecting at least 2.5 million livestock.

As such, cattle farmers are in dire need of support to provide fodder and medical treatment for their livestock, speakers told a programme yesterday.

They demanded compensation for the farmers and suggested waiving their loans taken from NGOs and cooperatives for cattle rearing.

A group of cattle farmers and their leaders made the plea at a press conference organised by Bangladesh Dairy Farmers' Association at the capital's CIRDAP auditorium.

"Of my 20 cattle, 15 died after falling sick. A veterinarian from Khamarbari demanded Tk 10,000 to come for providing treatment and later settled for Tk 8,000, but they arrived a day

late," said Rashida Begum, a dairy farmer from Dhaka's Adabar area.

"During treatment, two more cows died. They took samples for testing but the reports are still not provided. I am feeling helpless," she added.

Jamal Hossain, another dairy farmer from Mohammadpur, echoed her.

Addressing the event, Imran Hossain, president of the association, said their cattle are getting sick due to lack of clean water, and crisis of fodder since the cyclone hit Bangladesh.

"Despite reaching out to the livestock officers at upazila and district levels, farmers are not receiving any medical assistance for their cattle," he said, adding that the officials cited transportation issues as an excuse.

"Earlier, government officials from livestock department used motorcycles to visit the farms for treatment of livestock, taking Tk 500-1,000 per visit. Now, they are using cars to make the visits and demanding Tk 3,000-10,000," Imran also said.

separate meetings at the UN Headquarters in New York on Friday, a foreign ministry's press release said yesterday.

During the meeting with United Nations General Assembly President Dennis Francis, the minister said when about one million people fled to Bangladesh to escape violence in Myanmar, the people of Cox's Bazar and Chattogram received them with compassion.

"But gradually the Rohingyas are getting employment in different places out of the camps, and the camps have become a haven for various crimes, including human trafficking, drug smuggling, and terrorism. As a result, the locals are having a very difficult

time," he added. During his meeting with the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees Filippo Grandi, Hasan said since last February, about 750 members of the Myanmar Border Guard Police and Army have fled to Bangladesh at various times.

"Not only that, the shells of the conflicting groups in Myanmar have also caused casualties in Bangladesh. It is absolutely necessary to prevent the recurrence of these," Hasan said.

In a meeting with Julie Bishop, UN secretary general's special envoy for Myanmar, Hasan Mahmud said the ongoing conflict situation in Myanmar is not a new phenomenon and should not be allowed to be used as an excuse against Rohingya repatriation.
